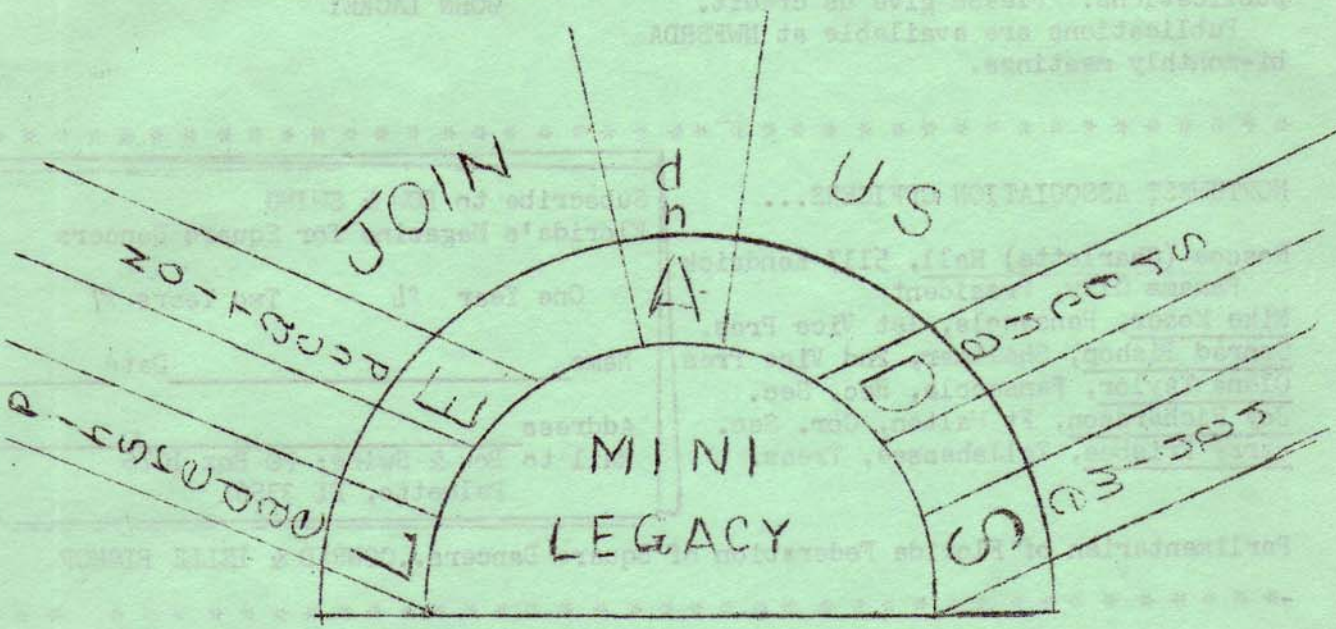

LET'S SEE NOW...

Like most editors, I'm influenced by what I read in other publications, letters and what I hear callers or dancers discussing.

Sometimes I agree with them, and sometimes I don't. But, I'm always interested, especially when possible solutions to problems are offered.

Oh yes, even though our motto is "Friendship Set to Music", square dancing has it's problems. Some from outside the activity and some created from within. And as much as we'd like to stick our heads in the sand in the hopes they'll disappear, they won't.

It will take facing them squarely and fairly. Communication, plus a little give and take are essentials. That ole stubborn pride and refusal to budge an inch must go.

\*Bob Osgood (Square Dancing, Feb. 80) recommends that callers talk to dancers. Find out how they feel about All Position Dancing, Levels, etc. Callers should regularly attend dances at the level they call. In this way they can find out which choreography works, what makes for comfortable dancing, good timing, and a better understanding of their dancers.

"...An active caller...must have the dancers point-of view in order to do an effective job. We offer one suggestion. Dancers, in their efforts to please the caller, sometimes adjust their dancing, cutting a corner, making an awkward movement look smooth so the caller will look his best, with the result that the caller feels he is doing a good job when actually the results are not satisfactory. At the outset the caller should tell the dancers the purpose of the workshop and if the dance or the calling is not quite right, to go ahead and let the awkward parts show. Only in this way can he improve.

...Callerlab deserves praise for its efforts, however the job is only half done unless and until the callers (1) please the dancers, (2) determine ways for all who would like to come into the activity, and (3) stay in the activity long after they have learned to dance.

...Let your thoughts be known.

May we, with God's help, be part of the answer, not part of the problem.

...Callers are in an excellent position to establish workable programs. Programs that will include a logical percentage of potential future square dancers. In order for their efforts to be effective callers MUST have a pipeline to the feelings of their dancing public."

#Cathy and Stan Burdick's (American Squaredance, Feb. 80) Co-Editorial starts out, "Don't just stand there; do something."

The current economic and energy (gasoline, especially) crisis plus the new figure syndrome added to the 20-year old problems of the high vs. the low level clubs, the loss of "fun" and social aspects, lost traditions & dancers, etc. are just a few to be faced.

One of their readers suggested that dancers were causing their own problems. So, now dancers must seek cures for their ailments by experimenting until solutions are found.

"...We think Callerlab programs are 'tools' to be carefully plied to build better dance clubs... The 'tools' are available; what is needed is the JUDGMENT to use them correctly.

Let the watchwords of 1980 be Leadership, JUDGMENT, and Team EFFORT. Square dancing is one of the world's great 're-creations'; let's keep it alive and well into the next century."

LINEAR CYCLE has been selected by Callerlab for use this quarter. Although it can be used in other variations, the right hand version is encouraged for most mainstream clubs.

**LINEAR CYCLE:** In any right handed ocean wave - ends and adjacent centers Single Hinge, dancers facing out Fold, ALL Double Pass Thru and Peel Right. Result facing lines standing at right angles to starting wave. (If done from left hand waves, the pass is left shoulder and the peel is to the left.)

Additional information about the Callers' Seminar at the National Convention at Memphis is announced. The sessions are open to all registered attendees (callers and dancers) at no charge. Two sessions are offered daily. (Mornings 9 till 11 and afternoons 2 till 4) Hand-outs will be provided at each session. However, to receive the handout, you must sign in for that session.

The staff includes Kip Garvey, Bill Davis & Bill Peters of Calif; Harold Bausch, Neb; Lee Kopman, NY, C. O. Guest, Tex; Herb Egender, Col; Stan Burdick, Oh; Cal Golden, Ark; & John Keltenthaler, Pa.

This outstanding staff of talented callers and teachers is a great opportunity to learn more about the calling profession. Make it a point to attend as many of these sessions as you can, you'll be glad you did.
