WHEELING AND DEALING:

On February 10th, 1987, a workshop was held for the Florida Health Care Activity Coordinators Association at the Bayview Senior Center to teach them the techniques of Wheelchair Dancing for the residents of their Nursing and Retirement Homes.

Registrations are coming in at a fast pace, and yours are expected momentarily. Please don't disappoint us.

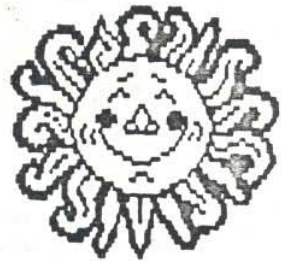
