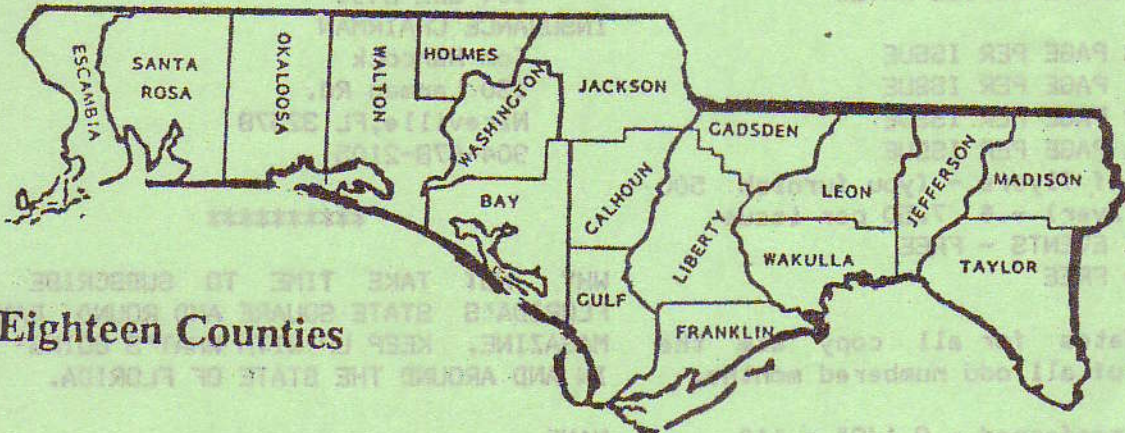

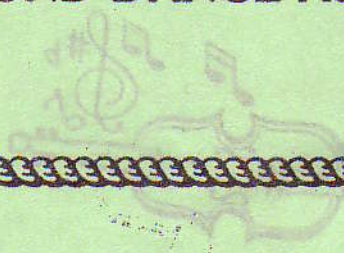

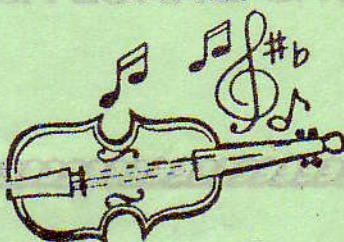

-There will be a full program of activities at the Bob Carr Theater on Saturday including exhibition groups, award ceremonies and a fabulous Fashion Show.

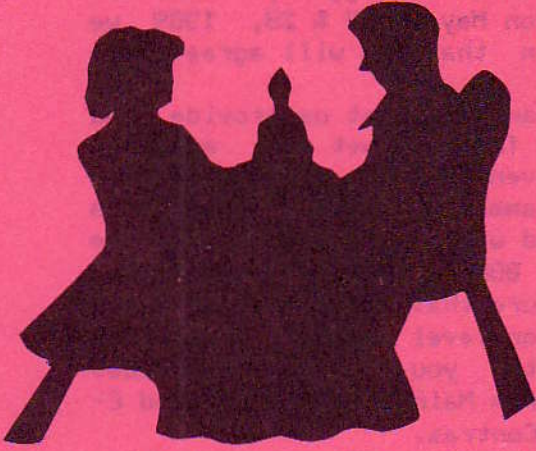

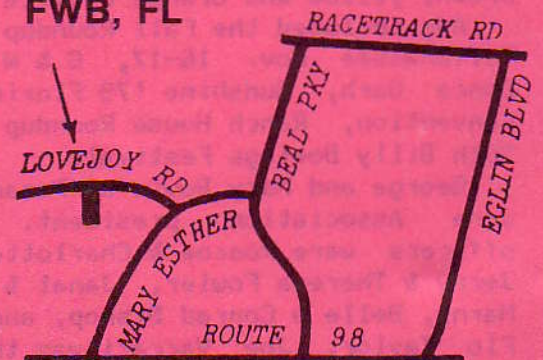

The United Square Dancers of America [USDA] recently announced a nationwide Credit Card Program for Dancers. Any dancer in the square dance activity [Square, Round, Clogging, Contra, Line, or Heritage] can apply for the card—the only credit card that identifies you as a square dancer everywhere you go.

The Square Dancers MasterCard grew from an idea first put forth at the USDA annual meeting at the 1987 National Convention in Houston. The Board of Directors of USDA, which is comprised of delegates from the State and Association Affiliates, approved the concept; and the program was developed and introduced nationwide in January, 1989.

You may ask, why does square dancing need a credit card? The answer is simple. . . . This is the best possible method of bringing our square dance activities to the attention of every person that handles one of our special credit cards. This will keep "Square Dancing" in front of the public and assist in publicizing and promoting square dance activities throughout the nation. Also, USDA, your national association, will receive some operating funds from the Signet Bank for each credit card issued and will share these funds with the member State and Association Affiliates.

USDA, as the National Dancers' Association, entered into the program to promote square dance activities nationwide and to obtain operating funds to support its many on-going [and future] projects that benefit square dancing, both at local and national levels. USDA is bound by its charter and IRS Regulations to use these funds only to serve the square dance movement.

One-third of all surplus funds from this program will be returned to the Affiliates for their use to locally promote square dancing. USDA believes this program will provide a means to further the growth and development of the dance activity everywhere. Every dancer can help their local associations and national association by signing up for the Square Dancer MasterCard.

The Square Dance MasterCard is issued by Signet Bank, Richmond, Virginia, and carries many exclusive benefits. For details of the program, an application form and further information on the USDA Silver MasterCard, you may call Signet Bank at [800] 368-4868, toll-free.

Publications are already beginning to come in to the Showcase Committee for use in displays. Once again, a real opportunity to pick up on ideas for your own publication.

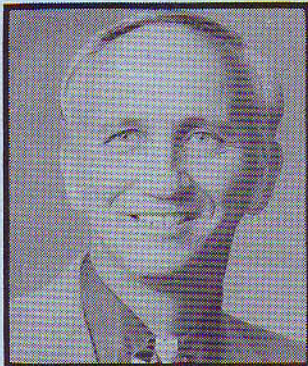
Invitations have been mailed out to more than 500 Square Dance affiliated organizations and publications around the world, and over 60 have already reserved a spot.

ENDING FORMATION: Static Square.

TIMING: 64 beats.

TEACHING HINTS: The action for the Sides begins like Grand Square. Callers will say, "Sides face, GRAND SWEEP." In the Heads part, when the dancers do the Pass Thru, they should move forward far enough so that the Partner Trade takes place in the Sides position.

SINGING CALL: Sides face, GRAND SWEEP! [ Callers may wish to sing or direct the action!]
