

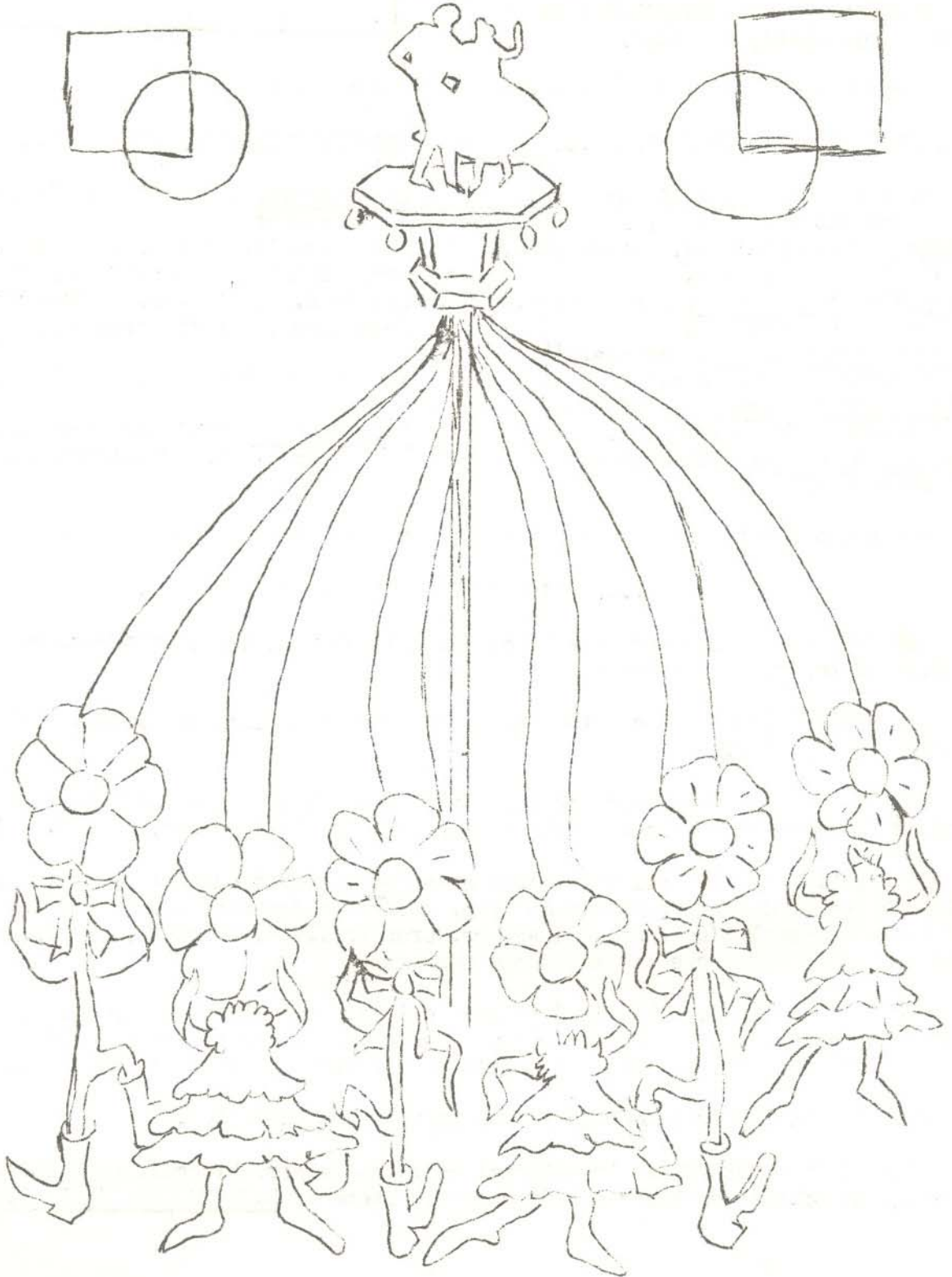

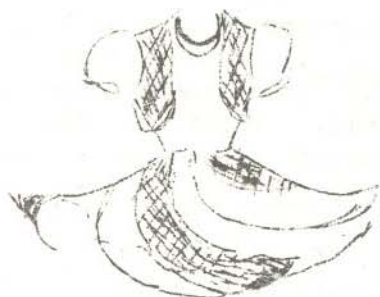

PROMOTIONAL ADS ON BACK OF LADY'S AND MAN'S VESTS

LADIES: Dress is a 9-gore swirl skirt in alternating ORANGE, YELLOW & BROWN colors, (Old Buttrick #3555); YELLOW fitted bodice, jewel neckline enclosed in ORANGE bias binding, (Authentic #275) with puff sleeves with elastic; open BROWN vest (Buttrick #6263), lined in ORANGE. BROWN shoes, petticoat and pettipants.

If you are unable to locate these patterns, Elaine's will trace from originals for a nominal fee.

MEN: BROWN slacks; YELLOW shirt; BROWN vest (Simplicity #5048), lined in ORANGE; ORANGE scarf or bow tie; ORANGE towel. Western hat optional. BROWN boots or shoes.

Elaines will make 1 dress and 2 vests for \$55.50 (size 18 or over, add \$5) plus 4% tax. She cautions all seamstresses who plan to make outfits and purchase material from a source other than Elaine's to make sure all material is of equal weight. Fabric is 65% polyester and 35% cotton. To make 2 vests and a dress size 5-10 it takes 2 1/2 yards of each color; size 12-14 takes 3 yards of each color; and size 16-20 takes 3 1/2 yards of each color.

If you plan to order thru Elaine's, she asks you not to delay as suppliers need time to fill orders. Her price for fabric is \$2.25 per yard. Man's yellow shirt \$19.50 to \$21.50. Add 4% sales tax and 75¢ postage for patterns. Price to trace patterns is: \$1 for bodice; \$1.50 for skirt.

The Panama City Festival in 1980 will be the first event for the 1981 Convention Outfits to be worn.

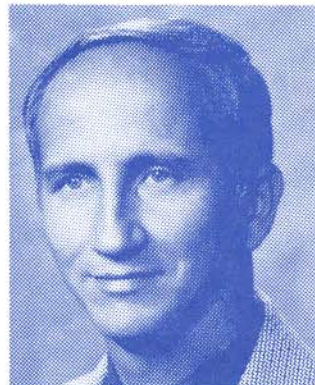
