

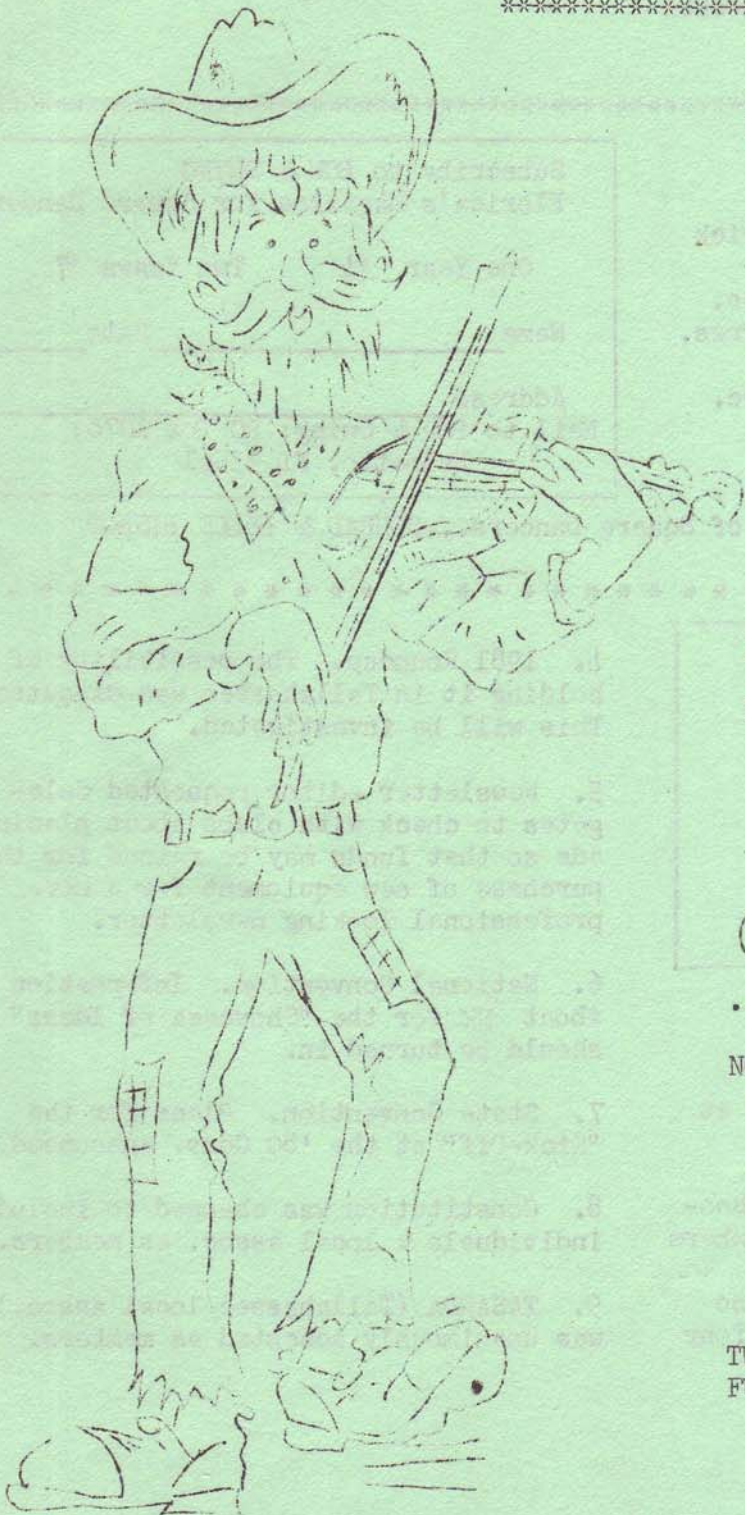

## INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP IN THE NORTHWEST FLORIDA ASSOCIATION...

The Northwest Association recently changed its makeup from club membership to individual and/or club and local association membership.

Individual membership will be effective January 1, 1981. Watch for details on how to join in future issues of the newsletter.

There is no change for those clubs that are presently members of the association. Dues and voting delegate privileges remain the same. The number of free newsletters will be reduced.

Why did the Northwest Florida Association decide to go to individual membership? There were numerous reasons including:

1. To give a sense-of-belonging to individual dancers and make them more aware of the NWFSRDA as their association;
2. To stimulate participation in NWFSRDA functions;
3. To increase membership in order to be more representative and therefore, more effective;
4. To make membership available to those dancers whose clubs are not affiliated with the association.

What benefits will I receive if I join as an individual? Membership as an individual will entitle you to:

1. Accident insurance traveling to, from and at any square dance function.
2. A NWFSRDA badge.
3. A copy of the PANHANDLE PRESS at each printing (6 or 7 issues per year).
4. Membership in a non-profit association to represent you at State and National levels.
5. Participation in all association functions.
6. Attend business meetings and serve on committees and work toward NWFSRDA objectives.
7. Take part in hosting the 1981 State Convention.

You get all of this for annual dues of only \$7.50 initially and \$5 each subsequent year. Details on how to join will be forthcoming.

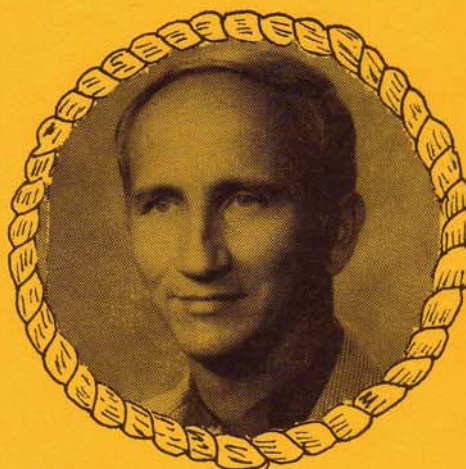
