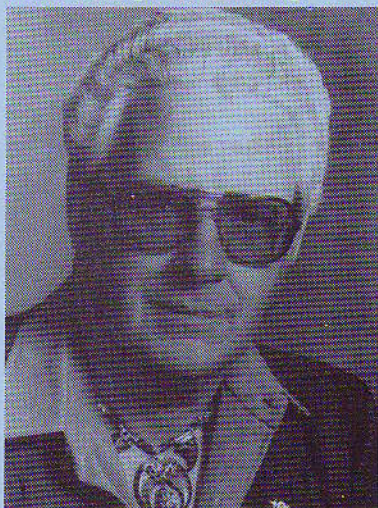

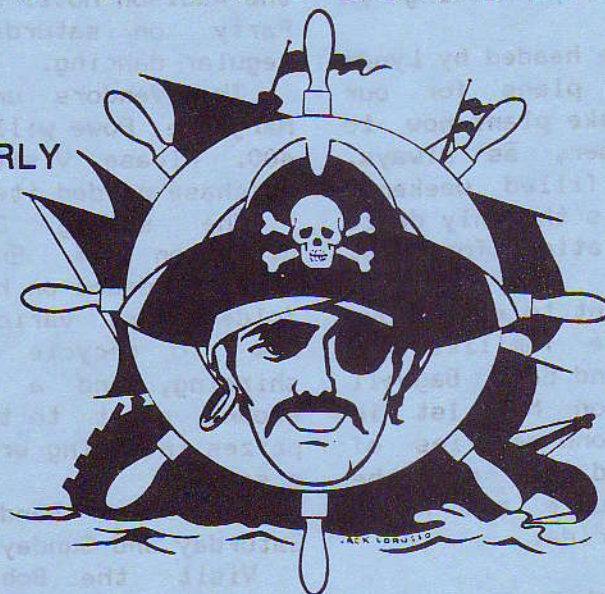

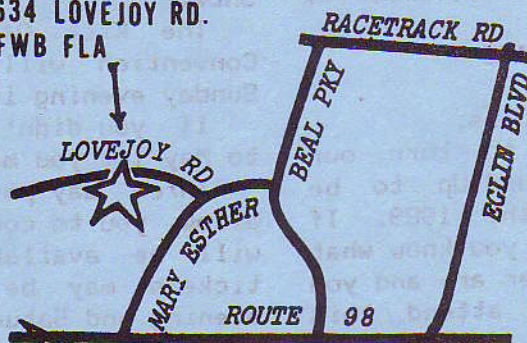

IN MEMORIAM

On Monday, May 1st, 1989, Round Dance Leader and Cuer, Earl Bagwell passed away in Tallahassee, Florida while undergoing treatment for recently diagnosed leukemia.

Earl was well known locally and nationally among round dancers and leaders. Earl had received honors from the Toronto District Square and Round Dance Association of Canada, Southern California Teachers Association and the New Jersey Round Dance Teachers Council for choreographing the Round Dance "That Certain Party" to name just a few.

Earl (and Wife Marge) who were originally from Georgia started round dancing in Tallahassee, Florida in 1968. In 1975 after a transfer to Lexington, KY they found five square dance clubs but no round dance clubs. In May of 1975 they formed The Rhythm Rounds and in the next six years graduated an additional eight classes.

Upon moving to Tallahassee, Earl and Marge formed the Merry Mates, taught a multitude of classes, participated in Northwest activities and Roundups, and called for many dances in the area.

Earl will be sorely missed by all of the dancers in the Northwest area and our heartfelt sympathy is extended to his family and friends.

**38TH NATIONAL CAMPGROUNDS PLENTIFUL**

**PENSACOLA SPECIAL STEPPERS**

Rumors seem to be circulating that the official campgrounds of the 38th National Square Dance Convention are already full. Not True !!! The newly paved Oklahoma State Fairgrounds will provide unlimited space for RV's and campers.

Electrical hookups abound - over 1,500 of them. Talk about space... they've got it in Oklahoma City !

Free tram service will be available to take campers around the fairgrounds to all the activities, of which there will be many - from the kick-off barbecue, to over a dozen trail end dances, to the rodeo, and to the many daily activities. Shuttle busses will also be running at 15 minute intervals to the Myriad Convention Center, main location of the 38th National.

A cafeteria will be open on the grounds daily, and the shower and bath facilities are top-notch - guarded 24 hours a day. Although there's plenty of asphalt paving for the RV's, a grassy wooded area is being set aside for tent campers, within easy reach of facilities.

Handicapped campers will also have a special area, close to facilities and all fairgrounds activities. (Handicapped stickers on vehicles are required).

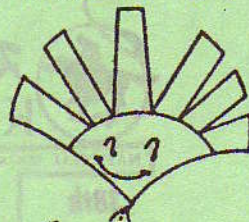

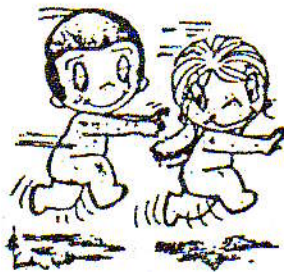

## WHAT IS ROUNDALAB

ROUNDALAB is an International Organization of Round Dance Teachers with membership open to all who are actively teaching round dancing at any Phase anywhere in the world. Leaders who have been teaching for under three years join as Associate members. Those who have been teaching three or more years are known as active members.

One of ROUNDALAB's primary goals is to encourage teachers to broaden their own education and improve their personal knowledge and ability as well as their teaching techniques. An additional benefit to United States members is a liability insurance program.

From the beginning the ROUNDALAB membership realized that a common understanding of the language of round dancing was the foundation upon which progress must be built. For the past thirteen years much of the work of ROUNDALAB membership has been devoted to standardizing this language. The work that has been accomplished has helped the beginner as well as the more experienced dancer and teacher.

As work has progressed on Standardization, Cueing Guidelines have been developed. A suggested Teaching Progression for figures in different rhythms will be discussed at ROUNDALAB's Annual Meeting this June. For the beginning teacher, or the teacher who cannot attend clinics and workshops, ROUNDALAB is redoing its Video Instructional Tapes and they will be available in the late Fall.

For the members who can attend the annual ROUNDALAB Convention and/or the NSDC, educational seminars and clinics are provided on a variety of topics suggested by previous attendees. Several years ago a scholarship fund was established to provide financial assistance to members wishing to attend a recognized round dance teachers leaders school.

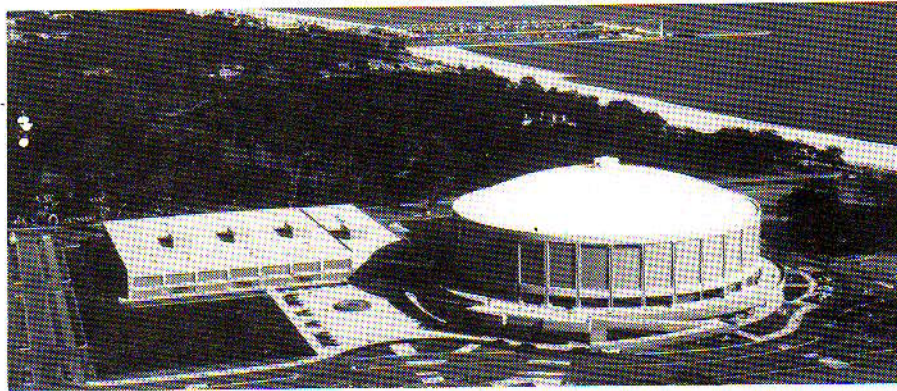

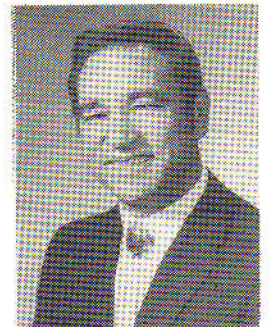

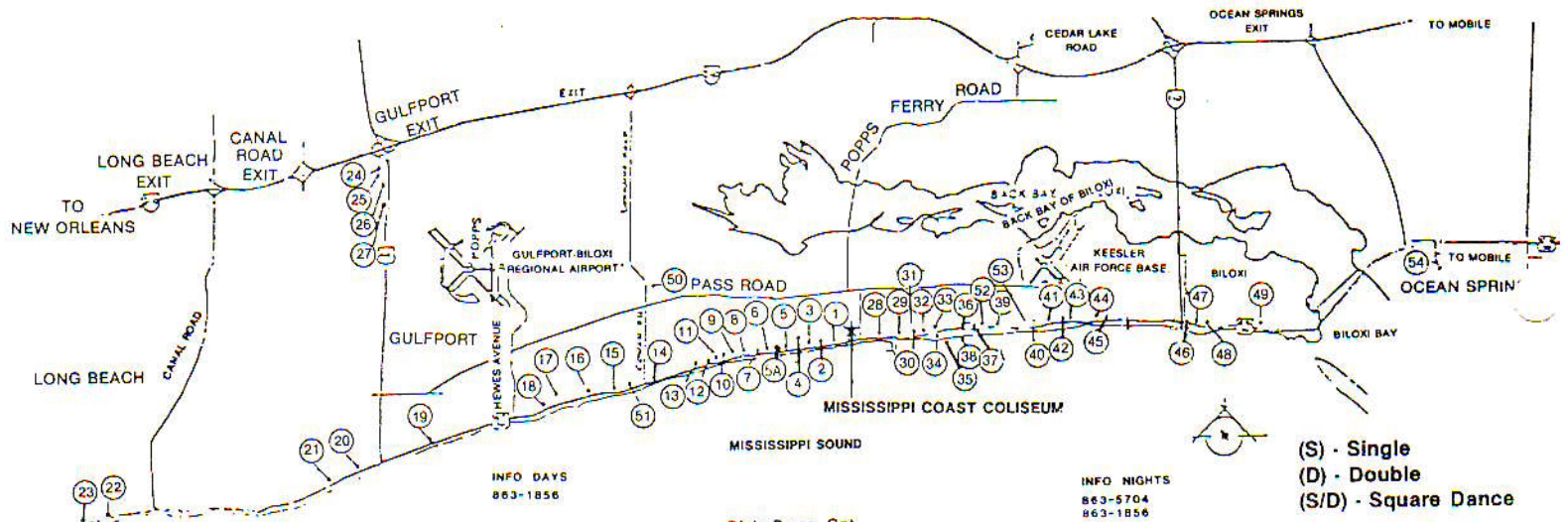
