SQUARE DANCING  
NATIONAL FOLK DANCE ???

We are happy to report that we are getting very close to having the Square Dance proclaimed the National Folk Dance of the United States of America.

Just as our country is the "melting pot" of the world, with so many nationalities and races blended together, so square dancing is the "melting pot" of folk dances of many nations. Many square dance calls are direct descendants of maneuvers you still see in folk dances of other countries.

For years, efforts have been made to have Square Dancing proclaimed our National Folk Dance. A National Folk Dance Committee has been operating to further these efforts, with Mac & Mary McClure of Los Altos, California the present co-chairmen of this committee.

It was hoped that this legislation would be passed during the lame duck session of the last Congress, but it did not get through at that time, possibly because of a heavy agenda.

Just before the lame duck session last year, Ronnie Lake, of Orlando, Florida, was carrying petitions around to all the clubs in the Central Florida areas and obtained many hundreds of signatures to present to Congressman Bill Nelson of Florida's 9th District. This led to Congressman Nelson's name now being added to the Resolution's list of sponsors.

Congressman Nelson has now provided Ronnie Lake with copies of the resolutions introduced by both the House and the Senate which deal with designating Square Dancing as our National Folk Dance. (Copies of both these resolutions on page 10 of the Sept. issue of BOW & SWING).

As of September 9th, 1981, Congress will again be in session, and although there is no way of knowing exactly when these resolutions will come up for a vote, we urge you to write your own Congressmen and Representatives

IMMEDIATELY regarding them so they will know just how much interest there is in getting this passed.

A further note regarding HJR #151 from Mac and Mary McClure

The rules of Congress are strict and complicated (218 Co-Sponsors are needed to move a commemorative resolution out of Committee) and there is no way to move this resolution through Congress without a combined effort of all concerned.

We are hoping you might feel somewhat encouraged when you consider that when the resolution was introduced in the 95th Congress there were no Co-Sponsors but finished with 16 Co-Sponsors. When the resolution was introduced in the 96th Congress, there were nine Co-Sponsors and finished with 151. (60 of these Co-Sponsors were added from June 1980 to October 1980 as a result of the petition campaigns.)
