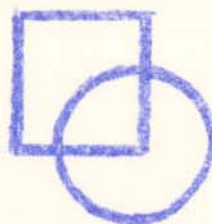

TO THE NEWCOMERS IN SQUARE DANCING who about this time are wondering what is CALLERLAB?? - the following is a brief description.

CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, was formed by a group of square dance callers for the purpose of coordination and cooperation.

Although CALLERLAB is a relatively new organization, it has completed many worthwhile projects. Thru CALLERLAB, callers are working together and accomplishing goals that they could not have hoped to accomplish by working alone. To name a few of the most noteworthy accomplishments.

The Quarterly Movements Clearinghouse: With several hundred new movements being introduced each year, the need existed for a universal system of evaluating and recommending a limited number for use in Mainstream dancing. This Committee, made up of callerlab members, carefully screens these many new movements and recommends one, two (or perhaps none) for each quarter. Sometimes old basics are re-introduced.

Accreditation: A System in being devised whereby callers may be accredited according to their abilities and desires. Once worked out it will be possible for every caller to be measured by this system.

Also, is the development of a system for identifying various levels of calling and dancing.

One Committee has taken on the task of collecting information to assist those interested in constructing square dance halls.
