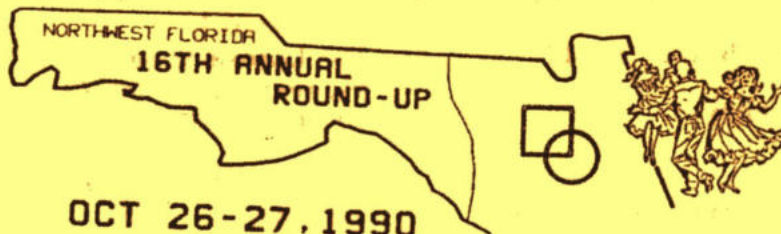

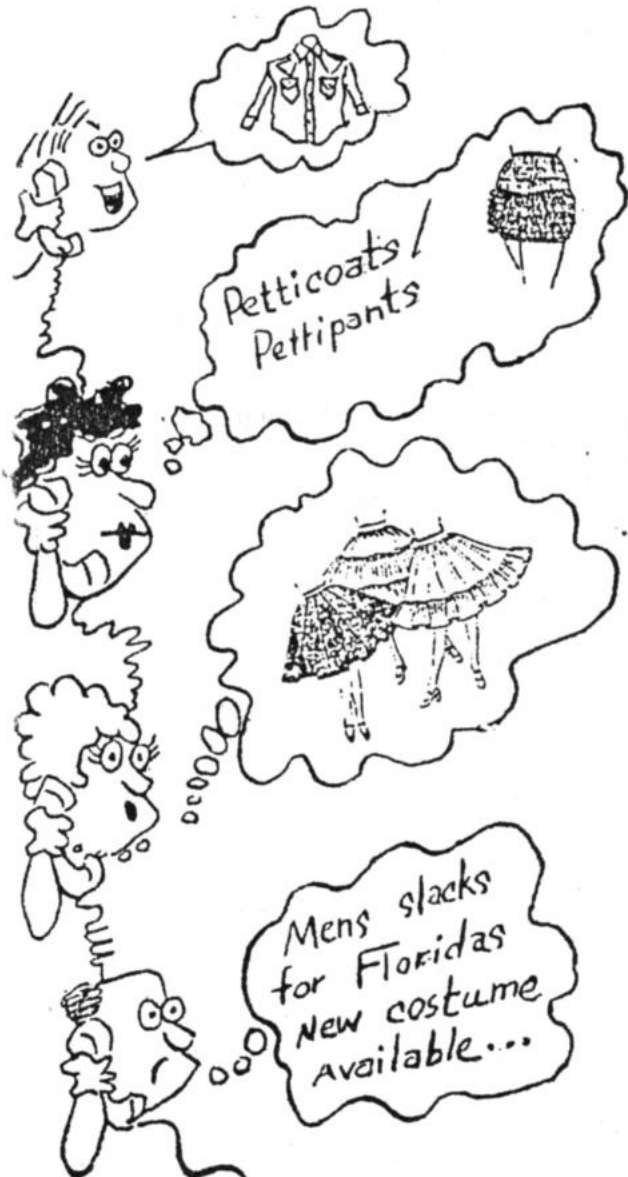

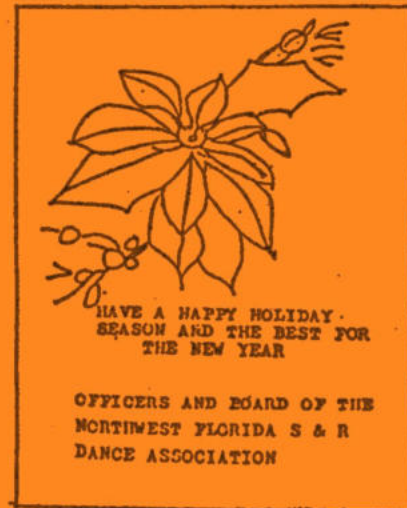

## STRAIGHT TALK

The most important person in your square dance club is the newcomer. It isn't your caller, even though he may be there teaching and calling -- but that is just a job for him and one for which he is reimbursed. It isn't the president of the club, because he may or may not be able to hold the club together, and he changes periodically. It's not the editor of your club paper. Also club members are important to the club, but they drop out, move, or change from club to club at intervals. That only leaves the NEWCOMER. He is the most important. The challenge dancers have to recruit dancers for this level from somewhere. The round dance recruits dancers, also, from the NEWCOMER. So often regular dancers square up in their own little group of dancers, ignoring the NEWCOMERS. How often does the regular dancer ask the NEWCOMER to attend a dance somewhere with them. New dancers soon say, "Honey, let's just stay home this weekend. They don't like to dance with beginners like us and we can't do what the caller calls." We're beginning to lose a potential avid dancer. It's time to admit that NEWCOMERS don't need us, we need them! Outlaw lessons for five years and see what happens to clubs. We don't need a caller or a newsletter. Don't forget, "actions speak louder than words", and how you act is "how you could lose that important person....the NEWCOMER."

Dear Joy & 'Joe,

I wrote the following article because it points out a current problem to many of our dancers. Perhaps you can use it in the Panhandle Press - hope so.

#### DANCE LEVEL OF R/D PROGRAMS

It's a shame the way most weekend dances turn out to be almost entirely advanced, especially if they are not advertised as such. Recently we attended a "Phase IV-V-VI" weekend where 95% of the dances were phase V & VI. One couple came 150 miles, paid \$50.00 and danced only 4 dances Friday night. They were so discouraged by Saturday night that they just sat and watched.

When a dance is advertised "Phase IV-V-VI" I believe at least one third of the program should be phase IV. It wouldn't hurt the advanced dancers to relax with an occasional intermediate dance. They still have the advantage of dancing every dance if they wish, whereas the intermediate dancer cannot cope.

Unfortunately the REQUEST ROUNDS lists contain a majority of advanced dances. The advanced dancers know the names of their dancers and are often more aggressive; whereas intermediate dancers are less likely to know what they want (by name) and are often more uncomfortable in putting them on the list.

But it is the R/D leaders that establish the dance program! I don't blame the dancers for writing in their favorites, I blame the leaders for cueing the imbalance. At the dance mentioned above I made a point of putting several phase IV dancers on the list, but the cuers ignored them, cueing largely (I suspect) to their followers.

Our area has a preponderance of Easy/Intermediate dancers. Therefore our weekend dances are directed at this level. We advertise "all-level dances with emphasis on Easy/Intermediate". So, in our sets of five dances we try to have two easy, two intermediate, and one advanced dance. We never have more than one advanced dance in a set. We feel it is our responsibility to keep the level in accordance with our advertisement. We also want as many dancers as possible to keep dancing and have a good time.

The survival of our activity depends on maintaining and increasing the numbers of dancers. Since all dancers start at the bottom and work up, we should do all we can to encourage them to keep dancing and to perfect their skills so that they can go on to higher levels of dancing, if they so wish (and many do not). We certainly have a responsibility to provide dances as advertised.

## FACILITY TIDBITS

### SYMPHONY HALL

Salt Lake City's Symphony Hall will host the Bid Session, Fashion Show and Exhibitions of the 40th NSDC. It has a seating capacity of 2,801. The proscenium opening (72' x 36') holds the flexible multi-level stage. The perfect acoustics are due in part to the concert hall's building within-a-building layout. The hall is isolated within a concrete inner building to eliminate outside noise. A highly articulated ceiling, irregularly tiled surfaces and hardwood flooring on both the stage and audience floor work together to control reverberation time. A complete sound system with intercom, open stage lighting, control booth and convenient loading areas make this facility one of the finest of its kind. Symphony Hall's elegant lobby is also ideal for receptions and parties (the Fashion Show "Carousel of Fashion" will hold their Tea for all models here). Best of all, it is all part of the Salt Palace Convention Complex and is only a few steps away from the dance halls. This is a wonderful place to sit awhile and rest while enjoying the programs scheduled here.

### LITTLE THEATRE

Little Theatre is located directly across the concourse from the Convention Hall and provides comfortable, padded seating for 734 people. The Showcase of Rounds will be presented here on each of the three mornings of the 40th NSDC. After the Showcase, Little Theatre will be an Educational room for Callerlab. On Thursday evening it will host the Organizational Round Table which will feature several international Square Dance leaders.

### SALT PALACE ARENA

The Salt Palace Arena is known as the Acord Arena and has been the center for sports and entertainment at the Salt Palace Complex. The arena is known for its excellent "Usability" having been host to pro basketball, hockey, circuses, rodeos, motor sports events and performances by music artists. Although it has a capacity of 13,420 seats, the 40th NSDC will use all of the 37,376 sq. ft. of floor space for dancing and will limit seating to the 9,015 permanent seats. The ceiling is suspended 95 ft above the floor and there are no posts or columns to block anyone's view. Two large refreshment areas serve the Arena from the 3rd floor. Tired dancers can pick up a snack and rest while watching the dancing or entertainment down on the floor.

## ANNUAL MEETING OF THE UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

The annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA (USDA) was held on Wednesday, June 27, 1990 prior to the 39th National Square Dance Convention in Memphis, Tennessee. USDA membership continues to grow. Kansas Square Dance Association and the North Carolina Clogging Council became USDA 1990 Affiliates, joining 29 other dance organizations and pushing the individual dancer membership above 260,000.

Representatives of CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, attended the meeting and expressed appreciation for the cooperation, communication and coordination of the activities of the various national and international square dance organizations.

The Four USDA Regional Vice Presidents reported of their contacts with various state/dancer organizations soliciting their membership and support of the combined LEGACY/USDA campaign to have the "Square Dance" designated as their State Folk Dance. Twelve (12) states now have this honor! Many more are currently working with their governing officials in pursuit of this honor.

The "USDA NEWS", the quarterly USDA publication has commenced publication and has been received with very well by the square dance community. A circulation of over 550 has been developed with copies going to national leaders, affiliates, directors, and all dance organizations and publications. The USDA NEWS is provided "FREE" to the circulation.

The Handicapable Committee is continuing to work with the formation of handicapable clubs, club operations and points of contact of existing handicapable clubs. The 2nd National Handicapable Square Dance Convention is scheduled to be conducted in July 1990 in Mobile, AL.

The Insurance Committee and Credit Card Committee reported continued success in their services provided for the dancers. Another fund raising activity involving a long-distant phone carrier was approved for implementation and should also raise funds for the USDA Affiliates. Every dollar received from these committees are put back into the square dance activity for the dancers. Evidence of this is seen by the credit card royalty paid to each Affiliate in 1990 and the reams of USDA educational and training materials provided for the dancers and leaders at the Show Case of Ideas at the National Conventions. 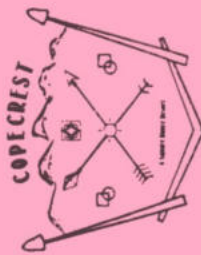

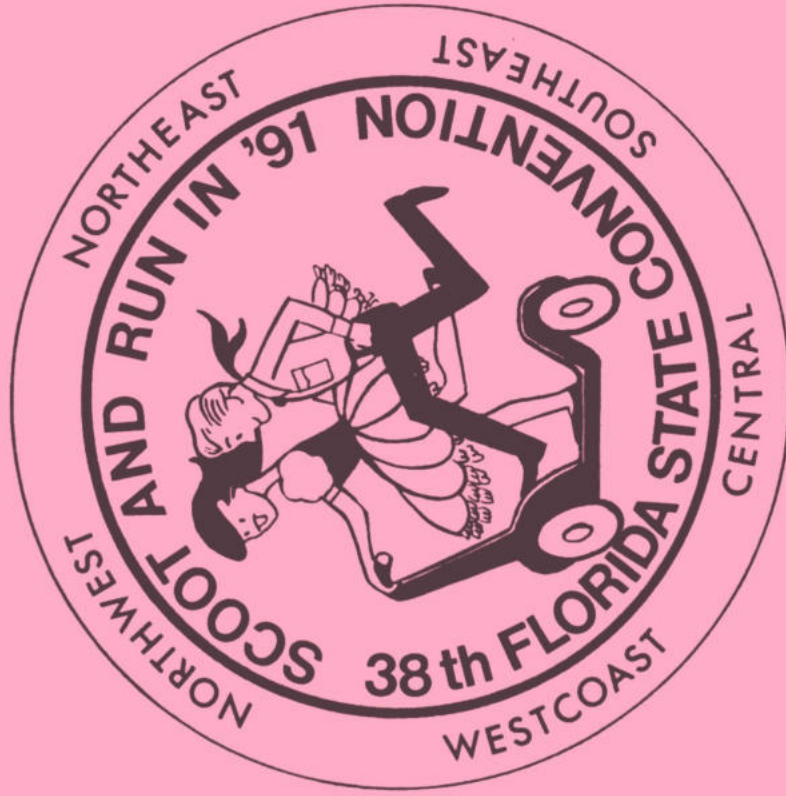
