Defeating A.I.D.S. and Drugs on Their Own Turf

Two insidious evils engulf the world and are slowly strangling the youth of our country. One is A.I.D.S., a seemingly unstoppable killer of all who fall under its shadow. The other is Drugs, relentless in the pursuit of our children.

Both of these problems are social in their nature and must be attacked in the same manner. To this end we have formed an organization to defeat these vicious murderers or at least hold them at bay until a cure can be found for A.I.D.S. and common sense methods can be employed for Drugs.

"Dancers Against Drugs and A.I.D.S." will be forming classes for youngsters to show them the fun, exercise, social skills, and healthy relationships that are gained through dancing! Introducing our young people to supervised dance cotillions, Country, Ballroom or Round Dance is where we start. Using weekly Dance Socials as springboards we present positive and healthy behavior patterns.

Instructors are trained to deliver messages of prevention and abstinence, without raising the banner of doom and dread, yet striking a chord of reason that can be easily understood.

The program will target preteens. At this stage of development feelings of invincibility and uniqueness often prompt them to underestimate risks with regard to sexual relationships

and drug use. The development of the younger person's own sense of self is critical at this time.

Children busily learn to be competent and productive or feel inferior and unable to do anything well. Adolescents try to figure out, "Who am I?" They establish sexual, ethnic, and career identities or become confused about what future roles to play. Unconscious impulses arise and affect behavior during development. Children are shaped by the interaction of physical characteristics, personal history, and social forces.

We can help them to become more independent, to "try out" new behaviors and explore different facets of their personality, and to interact with members of the opposite sex.

Dancing is a wonderful way to build self esteem. Dancers are popular, confident, and self assured. By learning social dance at an early age the confidence and self assurance will stay with them for the rest of their lives.

At this stage children's awareness of the actions and attitudes of others make them more susceptible to reinforcement and modeling techniques. They are greatly influenced by the social support provided by home and school.

Children will learn: That there are alternatives to sex. To "Get High on Dancing," not Drugs.

Our generation must resolve to show them the way to build new safer lifestyles. We are their last hope! We cannot take the chance, to quote the old cliché "Let George Do It." It's our turn

to "Take the Bull by the Horns."

Dancers Against Drugs and A.I.D.S. (DADA) will employ the most modern instructional methods available, for example, Whittle Communications, the educational network that reaches millions of young people in their classrooms as well as with hands on instruction.

We will need hundreds of dedicated dance teachers and helpers all across the country who are willing "Missionaries" to help in this most needed program.

Rather than asking people for a handout, we want to earn it by presenting the first ever "MARDI GRAS GOES COUNTRY" Dance Competition in New Orleans, Louisiana during the Mardi Gras in February of 1993 with up to \$12,000 in cash and prizes.

A daytime Competition with SQUARE, ROUND, and COUNTRY dancing taking over at night, plus the largest "Free Party" on earth, Mardi Gras.

We do not claim that *social dance classes are the cure-all or magic bullet, but if they save even one child it's worth it. To quote Psalm 30:16 "You have turned my mourning into dancing. You have stripped off my sack cloth and clothed me with joy.

LEGACY MEETS

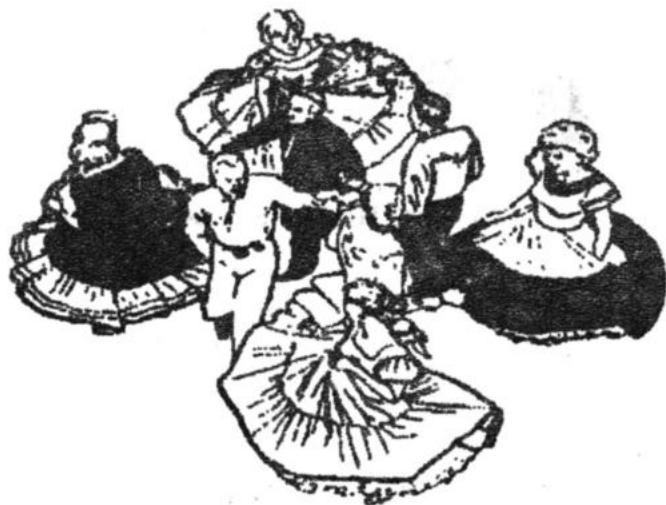
IN TORONTO IN 1993

Family Squares - A Success Story - United Square Dancers of America

We know there is a move on to get youth interested in square dancing. The move seems to be directed at setting up straight youth clubs. We support the idea of getting youth involved, but on the same token, it's very important to get the parents involved. This will promote "Family Unity".

We started a family oriented type club. If the kids come in, Mom and Dad will be with them. Our first night looked bleak, but by the fourth meeting we had eleven squares on the floor. How did we get there? We have a seven-year-old who graduated from a plus club. A lot of clubs will not allow kids to be members, and some dancers will not dance with the youth. The only thing to do was to start our own "family" club.

We obtained an association to sponsor us so we could obtain the USDA insurance. The Back Country Square Dance Association in this area greeted us with open arms. We located a caller, a school teacher, that was willing to help. How old should the kids be? We felt that an age of seven years and up would be ideal. I think we may have some younger than that, but that is all right, as long as they can keep up, why not? We worked with the school system for a dance location. We used the USDA Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics with our program outlined to sell our idea to the school officials.

Public Service Announcements started our advertisements. Flyers were developed and the school agreed to send one home with each child. We hit all of the Western Wear and Square Dance Stores, other Square Dance Clubs and then crossed our fingers. Like I said, the first night was bleak, but since that time, it's been positive with a lot of support and participation.

Some people may ask "What did it cost to get this off the ground." About \$400.00 were expended for school rental, coffee pot, water cooler, cups, condiments, insurance, and advertising. Will we get our money out of it? I doubt it and we really don't care. The class is paying it's own way now!

We are not formal on what is required for dress. That will come later. We asked for volunteers for officer positions and were overrun by people. We have a lot of work to do, but plan to do it slowly. We believe a slow approach is better than overwhelming people with the duties of an office and job responsibilities.

Our class is made up of people who are dancers, and have kids; grandparents who are dancers and bring grandchildren; and other family members who can participate in an activity which is not geared around one gender. The whole family can learn to dance. This is the first "Family Club" in the San Diego area. We have informed the club members of this and the "Gung Ho" is very high.

This is the nucleus for the future of square dancing. We love square and round dancing and do not want to see it die. If you would like more information on starting a family club, please contact us at the following address:

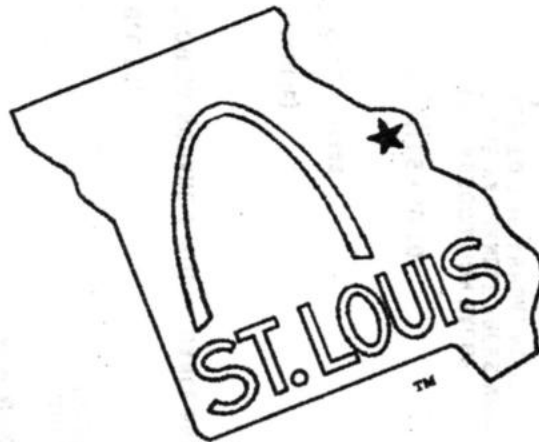

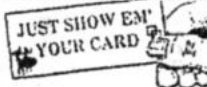

YOUTH HAVE SWINGING GOOD TIME AT REGIONAL SQUARE DANCE

Approximately 50 youth, ages 18 and under, were dancing their hearts out (and shoes off) at the first Regional Youth Dance sponsored early this year by the California Square Dance Council and in conjunction with the United Square Dancers Of America's Youth Program.

This Regional Youth Dance is only the first of many planned for California - and, thanks to United Square Dancers of America, the rest of the country as well. Committees have been formed, enthusiasm is high, and youth are being diligently sought for square dance classes across the Nation.

Square Dancing is the American Folk Dance and includes round dancing, clogging, contra, line and heritage dancing. The youth in Baldwin Park got a taste of almost all facets of square dancing, as callers and cuers donated their time to make this great opportunity possible.

During the afternoon, the Youth stopped dancing long enough to have a meeting where they were encouraged to submit ideas, questions, etc., about youth square dance activities. There were many participants who were not afraid to speak out, and suggestions were made which are already under consideration for implementation at future youth dances.

As mentioned, this was the first of many such dances, as California and other states work together under USDA'S "SAY YES TO SQUARE DANCING" movement. Youth are encouraged to say NO to gangs, alcohol, and drugs, and now they are being presented an opportunity to participate in a fun, wholesome, family activity that helps use up some of that amazing and seemingly endless supply of energy the youth have.
