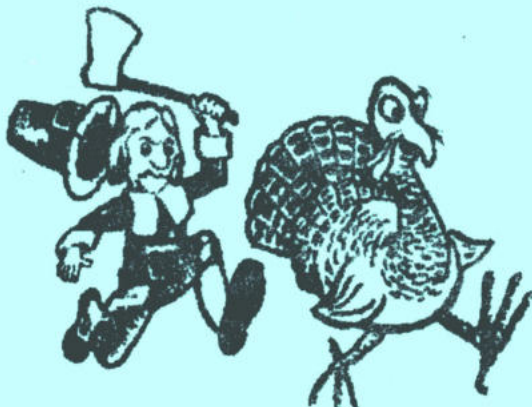

CALLERLAB

The following New Dancers Bill of Rights was developed by the CALLERLAB Education Committee and adopted by the general membership at the 1988 CALLERLAB Convention in Reno.

NEW DNACERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

A new square dancer has the right:

1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
2. To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.
3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes, prior to graduation.
4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring clothing for square dancing.
5. To instruction and practice using the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call (Basic, Mainstream, Etc.)
6. To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.

As stated above, this "Bill of Rights" was approved by our entire membership. We encourage ALL callers and square dancers alike to help put the FUN and FRIENDLI-NESS back into Square Dancing!

Happy Dancing! Keep 'em smiling! Remember, Friendship is Square Dancing's Greatest Reward.

The time to recruit dancers is right now! Put up posters, plan your demos, besiege your local media, put your plan into action. Order your Promo-Pak now if you need help on these steps.

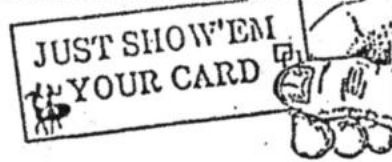

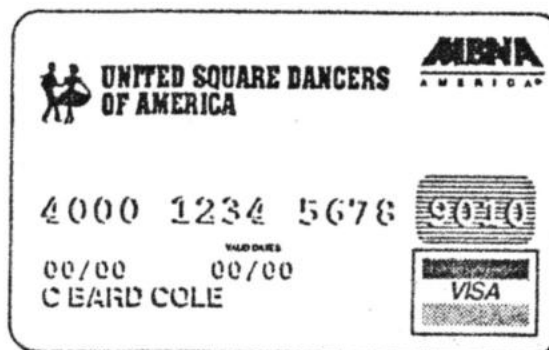
As a dancer you should use the USDA Credit Card because it identifies you as a square dancer and shows that you care about promoting the activity. Also, all proceeds from the Program are returned to affiliated organizations for use in local promotion of the square dance activity.

The USDA Card is a Visa Card issued by MBNA America. The card is free of an annual fee for the first year and provides many extra personal benefits. To apply, call MBNA America, toll free, at 1-800-847-7378, Ext. 400. It is very important that you cite Priority Code TXJV when calling.

The USDA Mastercard (Signet Bank) that many dancers hold is no longer available. Dancers holding USDA Mastercards will be offered Signet Bank's generic card on their card's expiration date, or they may cancel. We suggest dancers apply for the Visa Card with MBNA America.

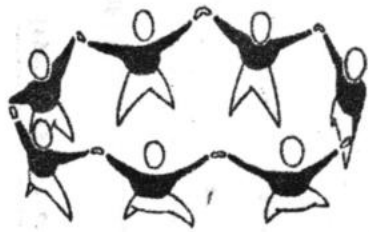

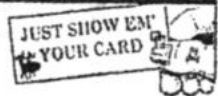

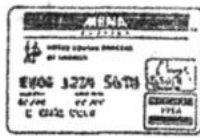

Drivers Need Proof of Insurance

If you are planning to drive to the 1994 National Square Dance Convention in Portland, you will need to be aware of the state and local requirements for vehicle insurance. Oregon requires that all vehicles be insured. In addition, the city of Portland, and other Oregon cities require that a certificate of current insurance be carried. This is an assurance to other motorists that the vehicle insurance has not been canceled or lapsed since the last certification with the Motor Vehicle Division. Police officers may ask for proof of insurance and have the discretionary power to have a vehicle towed from that spot if the driver is in violation of the city ordinance. 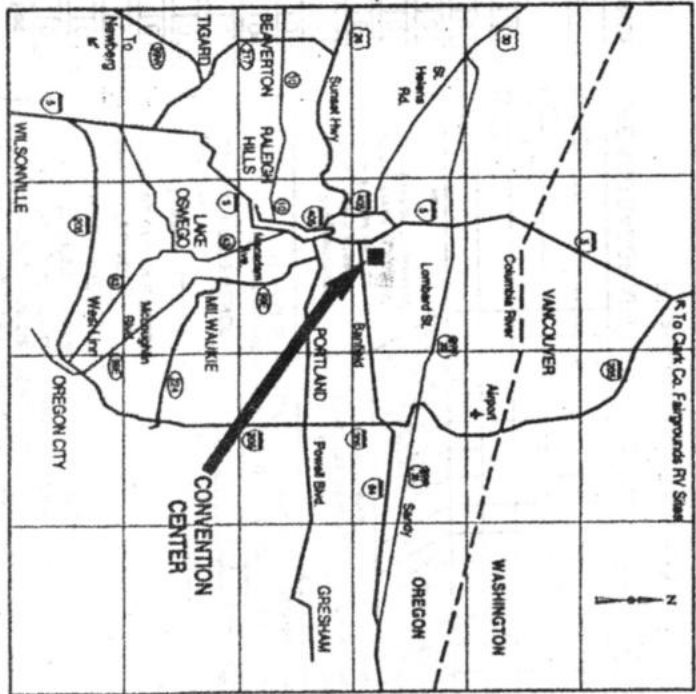

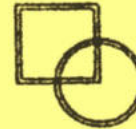

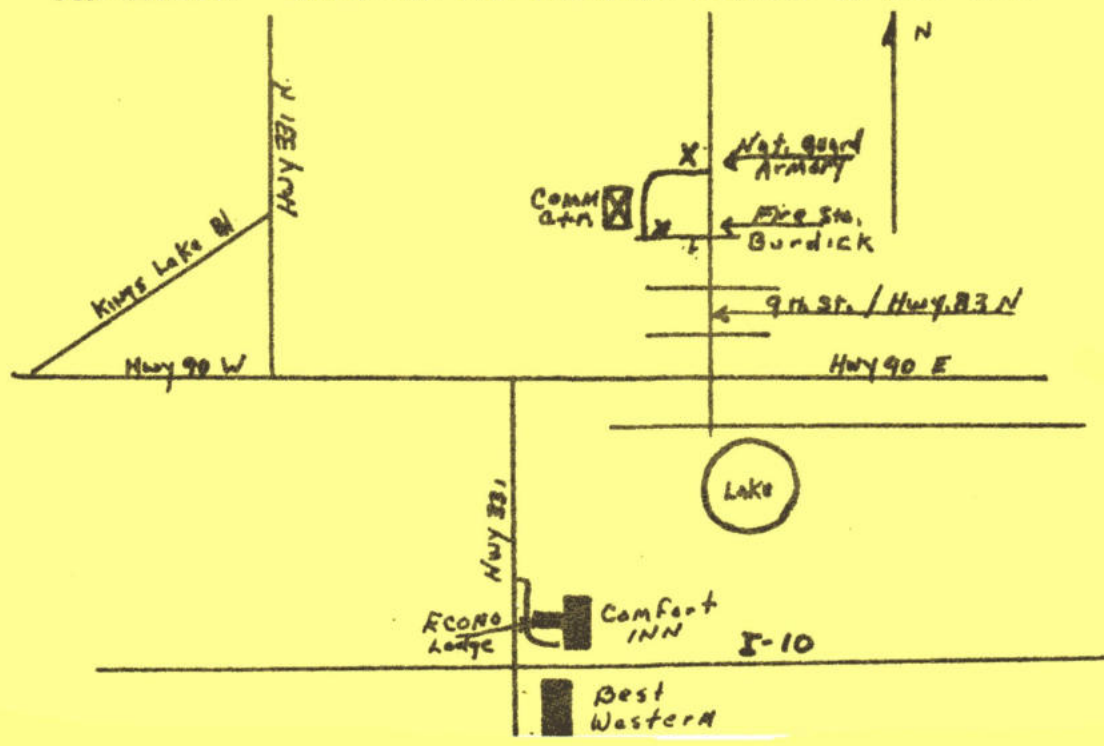
