LEGACY CONDUCTS PORTLAND SEMINARS

It was a full house of concerned dancers at the daily two one-hour seminars LEGACY, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity, presented, in conjunction with the National Executive Committee, at the June National Square Dance Convention in Portland, Oregon. A number of LEGACY trustees served as moderators and panelists. Handouts were available at every session.

"Attracting, Keeping and Assimilating Dancers" attracted an overflow group who examined different methods of recruiting new dancers and the value of the various kinds of publicity available to use. Several successful dropout programs were discussed. All agreed that there is also a need to educate the new dancer about the history and mores of the square dance activity. It was stressed several times in attempting to assimilate new dancers into a club that one must be careful not to overwhelm the new dancer.

Leaders were asked "who are you training to take your place and how." Leaders should be planning *now* for their replacements. One must start planting the seeds early and give them time to sprout while showing that you actually enjoy your "job."

The topic, "Recruiting the Young--Maintaining the Young at Heart," spilled over into several seminars. Various methods and examples of getting square dancing into the school systems, the music to use and how to show the youth we *really* want them were reviewed. The Diamond Square Dance Program for schools and CALLERLAB's Community Dance Program were also explained.

How to solve the need for more Family Square Dance Clubs led to a lively discussion that branched out to include the problems of being a single in the square dance activity and the needs of the handicapped person. The USDA is undertaking the task of maintaining a current roster of clubs for handicapped persons.

After reviewing the Emergency Call for Medical Aid (ECMA), introduced at the 1984 NSDC in Baltimore, and going over some guidelines for emergency situations, those at the session entitled "Dancing for the Health of It" concentrated on the health benefits of square dancing and fitness tips.

LEGACY, as a communications resource center, has already begun planning for the daily NEC/LEGACY seminars at the 1995 National Square Dance Convention in Birmingham, Alabama. IIISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

This is the fourth in a series of articles covering the history of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dance Association. The purpose of these articles is to record the events which resulted in the Association that we have today.

Dateline 1977

The work to build a strong Association continued with the new board in 1977 under the leadership of its President, Marvin and Olena Taylor. Meetings were held in various places throughout NW Florida, resulting in further growth.

1. Federal income tax exemption applied for and received under IRS Code Section 501(c)7 (Social).
2. The first State Federation meeting hosted by NW was held in Tallahassee Jan. 15-16, 1977. The motto for the 1977 State Convention was "Do si do under the rainbow." Marvin and Olena Taylor were announced chairmen for the 1981 State Convention, the first to be hosted by the NW Ass'n.
3. The Newsletter under its new name, "The Panhandle Press," continued to improve. A reproduction machine was purchased with funds partially donated by dancers. Educational articles began to appear covering diverse subjects--styling tips, attire, etiquette, club leadership, national organizations, etc. With the death of its first editor, Doris Vaccari, Marty Lackey and Sherwood Fowler assumed co-editorship. Area editors were Elaine Engram, Marvin Taylor, Belle Bishop and Mary Bowie. The special Christmas issue presented a cover with Santa hand colored by officers and staff.
4. The 3rd Annual Roundup was held on September 9-10, 1977, at the Bayfront Auditorium, Pensacola. Caller was Jack Lasry, Rounds by Kent Bartlett. The NW Florida Callers Ass'n members called the Trail In dance. Chairman was Marvin and Olena Taylor. Door fee was \$4.50 per person.
5. A NW scrapbook with photos was initiated by Charlotte Hall. To be displayed at the Roundup each year.
6. The NW Ass'n "Showcase of Ideas" was displayed for the first time at the National Convention in Atlantic City. Hand carried by Red and Ruth Hess.
