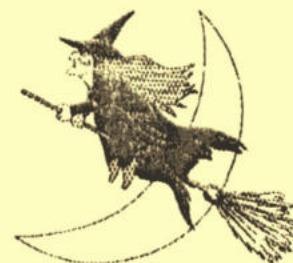
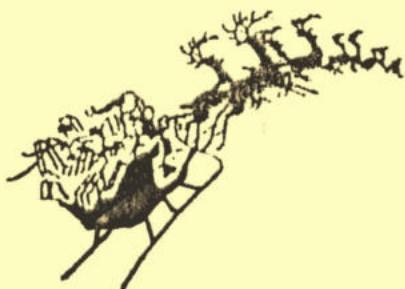

The club choose not to select a "dancer of the year" for 1994 or for 1995 but will choose a "dancer" next year.

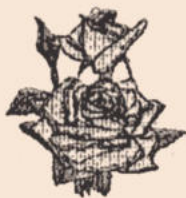
The club members will dance with the Whirlaways at their picnic scheduled to be held at Levy's pavilion on Lake Bradford, Sunday, October 15.

WHEREAS, the outgoing social exercise of this wholesome physical and old-time cultural activity offers a valuable antidote for the tensions and pressures created by the conflicts of modern American life; and

WHEREAS, the various square dance associations throughout the United States and Canada, including the Florida Federation of Square Dancers and the Florida Callers Association, will celebrate the month of September as National Square Dance Month;

# NORTHWEST FLORIDA SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE ASSOCIATION

## HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

This is the eighth in a series of articles covering the history of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dance Association. The purpose of these articles is to record the events which resulted in the Association that we have today.

Dateline 1981

The Association reached maturity in 1981 with a full range of services being offered to its members. We had a newsletter, an accident/medical insurance program, an educational library, membership in the State Federation, an annual roundup and more. Most importantly, the clubs and dancers were no longer autonomous but now worked and enjoyed the activity as a family. Some of the major events of 1981 were:

1. The Association hosted its first State Convention in Lakeland--"Dancing for fun in '81." General chairman was Marvin & Olena Taylor; caller chairman, Elmer Sheffield, Jr.; round dance chairman, Howard & Norma Smoyer. It was a great convention. Over \$2,000 was realized as our share of the convention's proceeds.
2. The first directory to include individual members along with member clubs was published in the Panhandle Press. The directory reflected membership of 100 individuals and 27 clubs.
3. The Panhandle Press editor, Marty Lackey, resigned due to family responsibilities, and Joy Richardson (later Joy Vaccari) assumed editorship on a temporary basis. This temporary job lasted over ten years! Joe Vaccari was on the staff (see what can happen!).
4. The president, Roscoe & Charlotte Hall, resigned due to relocation. Frank & Betty McCallister assumed the duties of president.
5. The Seventh annual Roundup was held in Chipley with Harry Lackey and the Blackfords. John Lackey was chairman. The National Convention was held in Seattle. Several couples from the Association attended and set up and managed the Florida Showcase of Ideas.
6. The treasurer's balance at year's end was \$3,677.28.
7. Some of the major dances advertised by flyers in the Panhandle Press: Pasarda's Sweetheart Charity Ball, Panhandle Promenaders Spring Fling, 28th Florida State Convention, 22nd Annual Billy Bowlegs Festival, 9th Annual Bob Poyner Jamboree, 22nd Annual Peanut Festival, The Northwest Fun Fest, Firehouse Gang Chiefs New Year's Eve Party, 29th Annual Florida State Convention.

### HAT FULL OF TRICKS IN '96

The "HFOT in '96" Chairperson's Committee held a meeting in Chattahoochee on 19 August 1995. The chairpersons in attendance gave a brief report of the happenings in their committee's area. ## SQUARE DANCING Ties People Together

"Square Dancing Ties People Together" is the 1995 theme for LEGACY's Promo-Pak. A lively drawing by Stan Burdick depicts a "roundup" of folks of various ages, sizes, skin tones and dress preferences, pulled together by the "tie" that is square dancing.

Square dancing has always appealed to a wide variety of people, young and old, doctors and diecutters, managers and mothers, handicapable and hale. Families can square up together. Youngsters release their pent-up energy in prancing and swinging. Grandparents may move more sedately through the figures but their hearts are lightened by the music. It's great for everyone!

In the early eighties, when testimony was presented in Washington before the committee decision to make square dancing the American Folk Dance for eighteen months, the universal appeal of square dancing was one of the points stressed.

Today, in the mid-nineties, we need to emphasize our welcome of younger dancers while retaining those older dancers who have been the backbone of the activity for so long. It's their contributions that have kept the square dance picture going strong. In order to attract youth and younger dancers, we many have to change our marketing strategies and seek out new options.

Some of these new approaches will be found in this year's Promo-Pak, available from Stan and Cathie Burdick, PO Box 2678, Silver Bay NY 12874. Make checks for \$5 to the Burdick's. Proceeds over the cost of the packet are used for LEGACY projects.

## LEGACY Passes Seven Resolutions

When LEGACY XII met in Fayetteville, Arkansas, in May 1995, with a hundred leaders from many phases of the square dance activity in attendance, seven resolutions were voted upon and an eighth referred to the board for rewording. LEGACY members do not dictate policy or practice, but do make recommendations based on their experience and observations. Since members come from all over the U.S. and Canada, their

discussions cover what is happening throughout a wide area, rather than a local or state viewpoint.

The 1995 resolutions included one dealing with the future of square dancing through financing for educational material for school and youth organization use; one establishing an Internet address for LEGACY and encouraging all square dance organizations to use the Internet to reach dancers and non-dancers; one encouraging the establishment of smoke-free areas for square dancing; a fourth resolution that is a plea for more understanding and caring for younger dancers, for those dancing with various degrees of frequency, and all others with whom we dance; a fifth endorsing the use of the CALLERLAB programs and the advertising of such use; a sixth encouraging all callers and leaders to attend a training school or college; and a final one reaffirming the efforts to make Square Dance (all inclusive term) the American Folk Dance.

Because of the length of each resolution and the rationales for the decisions, each will be treated separately in news articles to be released shortly. LEGACY is a communication organization composed of leaders from various facets of the square dance activity. Its members work for the promotion, preservation and perpetuation of the square dance activity world-wide.
