NORTHWEST FLORIDA SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE ASSOCIATION

HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

This is the twelfth in a series of articles covering the history of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dance Association. The purpose of these articles is to record the events which resulted in the Association we have today.

Dateline 1985

The Association continued its practice, in 1995, of holding meetings throughout the NW area—Panama City, Bonifay, Ft. Walton Beach, and Chipley. Three new counties were added—Dixie, Hamilton, Lafayette—resulting in coverage of all counties west of the Suwannee River. Membership was 22 clubs and 317 individual members. Total assets stood at \$ 3,934.01. Some details of activity follows.

1. The 11th annual roundup was held in Chipley with Darryl McMillan, Paul Marcum and Earl & Marge Bagwell. Grady & Jeanette Rae were chairmen.
2. The State Convention, "Dance with the Big Five in '85," was held in Lakeland. The NW held its kickoff for the 1986 State Convention, "Swing & Mix in '86." Frank & Betty McCallister were chairmen. The National Convention was held in Birmingham.
3. The Association donated funds to the Pensacola Special Steppers to help defray their expenses to Washington DC on behalf of all handicapables at the invitation of the President of the United States.
4. Northwest Dancers performed at the grand opening of the new Pensacola Civic Center.
5. Callerlab announced the plus quarterly selection—ping to a diamond.
6. The Panhandle Press continued to grow in size and quality. Flyers were inserted announcing the many special events throughout the area, including Ranch House Roundup, Valentine dances, Billy Bowlegs Festival, Honey Bee Jay Boree, Bob Poyner special, ESP Records special, Panama City and Tallahassee festivals, among others. The Xmas issue cover depicted a special Nativity scene by Jack Larusso, a noted local artist and square dancer.

EARLY BIRD CONVERSION

A total of 4,145 dancers purchased a "MAGIC PASS" in support of the 46th National Square Dance Convention. Approximately one-half of these have been converted to registrations. If you have not converted your Magic Pass, now is the time to do so.

You should have received a registration form in the mail with complete instructions on how to fill it out. The form you received in the mail should be stamped "early bird" in the space for your individual registration fees. (You do not have to pay again!! Your name is already in our computer). If you do not have a form stamped with "early bird", merely write the words early bird in the space where you would normally fill in the amount for registration. Then fill out the rest of the form. Be sure to check off the appropriate boxes for additional items you may wish to purchase (Program Book, Bus Pass, Cookbook, subscription to NATIONAL SQUARES, etc.). Do not forget to enclose a check for these additional items. Mail your complete form and check to: **46th National Square Dance Convention, Advance Registration, P.O. Box 350490, Jacksonville, FL 32235-0490.**

You do not need to return your Magic Pass Certificate. If you purchased an Early Bird your name is already in our computer. **Remember**, your Early Bird is **NOT** a registration. You will need to convert it to receive your "I Am Registered" ribbon. **You are not registered until the completed Registration Form is returned to us.**

BOB POYNER

Bob is presently the caller for the Flying Squares of Ft Walton Beach, Canoe Squares of Milton, and Co-Caller for the Belles and Beaux Square Dance Club of Ft. Walton Beach and Square Eights of Panama City, Florida

Bob started his square dance caller career in 1963 while a member of the Air Force stationed at Eglin Air Force Base, Fort Walton Beach, Florida. His initial effort was forming and teaching a class of teens and pre-teens with a few parents at Choctaw Twirlers club with the graduates of his teens class. During the next three years at Niceville, Florida, Bob was instrumental in expanding square dance activities through conducting classes each year and being the caller for two teen clubs and one adult club. Bob returned to his pre-Air Force job at Caterpillar Tractor in Aurora, Illinois in 1966. For the next 26 years while working full-time at Caterpillar, Bob called and taught lessons on an average of 4 - 6 nights a week. He called throughout the area, mainly in Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, Iowa, and Ohio. He was a member and held many office positions in the Chicago Callers Association and the Illinois State Callers Association from 1966 through 1990. Bob was an early member of the CallerLab and has recorded on several square dance labels and is currently on the staff of Chicago County Records. In addition, Bob has continuously supported and participated in the Illinois State and the National Square Dance Conventions. Bob retired from Caterpillar after 31 years and returned to the Northwest Florida DeFuniak Springs Area in 1992. He is presently the Caller for 4 clubs in the Northwest Florida area as previously mentioned.

Bob met his wife Ann at the first square dance he attended as a visitor before he began lessons. They were married in 1965 and have two children: a daughter who has been square dancing since she was 7 years old and a son who has been square dancing since age 8 and calling since age 13. Both are married and still live in Illinois. Ann has been an ardent supporter for Bob as a caller, square dancing in general as a fun activity and promotes square dancing as a family activity.

Bob was active expanding square dancing throughout Northwest Florida in his early years of calling by donating his time and talents in numerous special, charity, and teen functions. He eagerly volunteers to call for square dance exhibitions for recruiting new dancers. Bob has always been a club activator for participating in special activities, visiting other clubs for banner stealing or just dancing and initiating and participating in many of the fun activities of the clubs which he is the caller. When Bob returned to Northwest Florida in 1992, he immediately took actions on his own to get the

DANCER PROFILE

MARVIN and OLENA TAYLOR

Marvin and Olena Taylor have contributed tremendously to the furtherance of the square dance activity in Florida, in particularly, the Northwest Florida Panhandle area. They have been involved in all aspects of the activity from providing leadership, promoting and conducting classes, initiating the formation of new clubs, supporting the Pensacola Square Dance Council, getting Northwest Florida Square and Round Dance Association (NWFSRDA) started and recognized as a member of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers (FFSD) and leading NWFSRDA to participation as a host of the Florida State Convention. The following selective highlights of their dedicated involvement in the Square Dance Movement in Florida for the last 24 years will illustrate that they are deserving of the title of true "Pioneers" in establishing square dancing as a fun activity in Northwest Florida. All of us resident Rednecks owe them a big thank you in recognition of their dedicated efforts!

Marvin and Olena started square dancing in 1972 with the Swingsters Square Dance Club in Pensacola, Florida. They have also been members of Ragon Hall Clubs and the Rambling Rose Club in Pensacola. The Taylors held the office of President for the Pensacola Square and Round Dance Council for two years illustrating their involvement at that level.

In October 1974, the Taylors attended a Northwest Florida Square Dance meeting to determine the feasibility of forming the NWFSRDA. After agreement to form the NWFSRDA, the Taylors were selected to serve on the committee to draft the NWFSRDA constitution and by-laws. The Taylors were elected as the first 2nd Vice President of NWFSRDA. In May 1974, they were selected as a NWFSRDA Delegate to the FFSD when NWFSRDA officially became the fifth Florida Area Association of the Federation. They have served almost continuously as a NWFSRDA delegate to FFSD for the past 22 years. They were selected by the Swingsters Club of Pensacola to be their NWFSRDA delegate in 1976. The Taylors were elected as the NWFSRDA President in October 1976 and served for two consecutive terms. They were President when NWFSRDA hosted its first Florida Federation meeting in Tallahassee in January 1977. The Taylors were the Chairman of the 3rd NWFSRDA Roundup Dance held in the Bayfront Auditorium, Pensacola and have been Co-Chairman for two other Annual Roundup dances. Marvin and Olena have voluntarily handled the refreshments for nearly all the NWFSRDA Roundups. They were elected Recording Secretary for NWFSRDA in 1980, 2nd Vice President for 1983 and 1984 and served as Insurance Chairman in 1984. They are presently serving as NWFSRDA Vice President during 1995-96.
