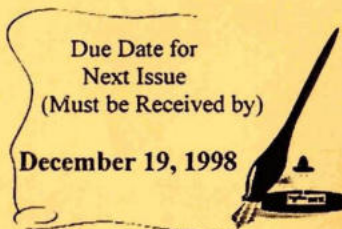



### *PASARDA HALL*

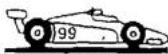

### THE CENTER OF IT ALL

The site of the 48th National Square Dance Convention will be the 1.6 million square foot Indiana Convention Center and RCA Dome which offers 5 exhibit halls, 52 meeting rooms, three ballrooms and a domed stadium all under one roof.

Located in the heart of downtown Indianapolis, the complex now houses more than 300,000 square feet of column-free dancing space and 127,595 square feet of meeting space. The RCA Dome floor alone offers 95,000 square feet of dancing space.

Skywalks connect the second floor of the Indiana Convention Center directly with the Westin Hotel, the Hyatt Regency Hotel and Circle Centre for entertainment and shopping. The Crowne Plaza Union Station is linked to the RCA Dome. Dancers can meander through Circle Centre to the Indianapolis Artsgarden, the Embassy Suites, the Canterbury Hotel and the Omni Severin Hotel for a total of 2,231 hotel rooms attached to the Convention Center. The skywalk system also gives dancers access to over 6,000 parking spaces without stepping outside.

But you'll want some fresh air, especially when the Capitol Commons park and other lush plazas beckon. Plus, you'll be just a few minutes' walk from Union Station, the Eiteljorg Museum of American Indians and Western Art, the State Capitol, Monument Circle, restaurants, theaters and nightclubs.

### CAMPING INFORMATION

Camping for the 48th National Square Dance Convention will be located at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. We will have an unlimited number of sites available, all with electricity and water. There will be 300 sites that will have full hook ups. All sites are gravel and reasonably level, with paved access roads leading to them.

The typical site will accommodate up to a 40-foot camper, and a limited number will be available to accommodate larger units with slide out rooms. Campers with pets will be grouped together as much as possible near a designated pet "walk area."

Showers and flush toilets are located near the camping area, and dump stations are on site for use at any time without an additional fee.

Bussing to the Convention Center is planned to be "Express" rather than stopping at hotels/motels in route. The schedule will be adjusted according to the number of campers, and pick-up and drop-off stops will be designated in each camping area. "Be sure to purchase a bus pass for each person wanting to ride the bus."

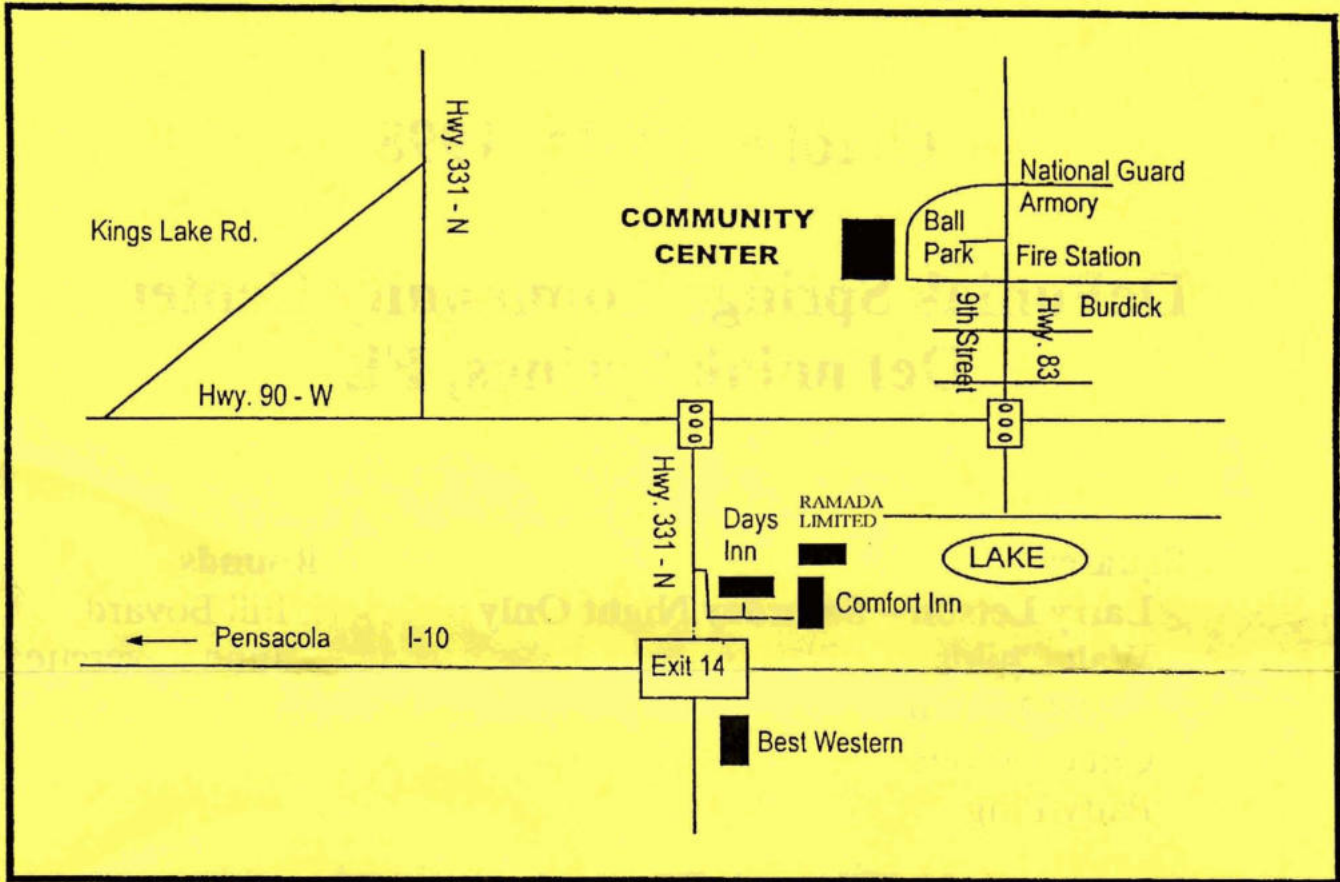

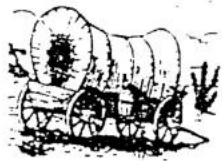
