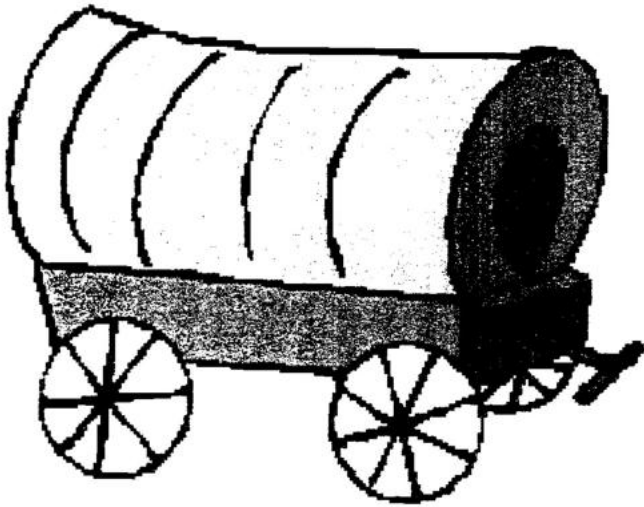

## DUES RENEWAL TIME

As Roundup time approaches, I want to remind you that it is time to renew your association membership. At the Roundup, I will be passing on the duties of Treasurer to someone else. I have a couple of hints that will make the transition to the new treasurer, your membership renewal, and your entry into the dance easier for everyone.

In order to avoid the long lines that sometimes form at the door, I recommend that you get your Roundup dangle in advance. Jerry Williamson, June Leverette and Fred Cornett have dangles available for purchase. By getting your dangle in advance, you will have an opportunity to attach it to your name badge before you get to the dance.

The dangle costs only \$6 per NWF member and entitles you to two nights of dancing (Friday and Saturday nights) plus all the activities during the day on Saturday. There will be something for everyone: Rounds at all levels; Square Dance workshops, and Mainstream, Plus and Advanced Halls are all on the schedule. Our featured caller on Saturday night is Tom Miller all the way from Chest Springs, PA. Bob Poyner, Patty Ping and Willis Simmons (from Eufaula, AL) will keep us dancing on Friday night, at the workshops on Saturday and in the Mainstream Hall on Saturday night. Bill Bovard from Panama City will cue for our Round dancing pleasure. And don't forget the pizza on Friday night and the great After Party on Saturday night. **All this for only six bucks!**

Here is another way to avoid the long lines at the door. Have your membership renewal check made out in advance so that all you have to do is hand it to me as you walk by. ***Please write in the memo space that it is for NWF membership.*** Remember, if there has been no change in your address, your phone number or name since last year, there is no need to fill out the membership form. For those who have experienced changes since last year—such as marriage (**congratulations**)—or a new address or phone number, I need that information on the renewal form. Note: If you have E-Mail, please include your E-Mail address on the membership form for us so that we can update the NWF Master Roster. The Membership form is included in this copy of the *Panhandle Press*. Renewals are \$6 per member. Even better, if you **mail your renewal** to me, and **buy your dangle in advance** the only reason you'll have for stopping at the door is for a yellow rock...and those are free.

The fee for new members is \$9 per person, or \$18 per couple. This includes the cost of a NWF Association badge. Of course, the yellow rocks are free!

**FIRST COUPLE OUT TO THE RIGHT OF THE RING**

**\*\*ROUND THAT COUPLE AND TAKE A LITTLE PEEK**

or (Out to the Kitchen and take a little peek)

Couple 1 separates, lady peeks right, gent peeks left around couple 2.

**BACK TO THE CENTER AND SWING YOUR SWEET**

Couple 1 swings in center

**AROUND THAT COUPLE AND PEEK ONCE MORE**

**BACK TO THE CENTER AND CIRCLE FOUR**

Couples 1 and 2 circle once around

**LEAD TO THE NEXT**

\*REPEAT FROM \*

After lead couple has danced with 2,3, and 4, lead home and all swing.

End with allemande left grand right and left after each couple leads.

**REPEAT FIGURE FOR COUPLES 2,3, AND 4 in turn.**

**BROKEN SIXPENCE**

MUSIC: Shaw #157; Shaw #209-45 (with calls)

FORMATION: 1, 3, 5, and every other couple active and crossed over

Measures

- Introduction - . . . . , actives do-si-do the one below,
- 1-4 - . . . . , now just the men do-si-do.
- 5-8 - . . . . , and then the girls do-si-do.
- 9-12 - . . . . , actives swing in the center of the set.
- 13-16 - . . . . , down the center go four-in-line,
- 1-4 - . . . . , turn alone, come back to place,
- 5-8 - . . . . , ends turn in and circle left.
- 9-12 - . . . . , left hand star, come back to place,
- 13-16 - . . . . , actives do-si-do with the one below.

## **CAMPING AT THE 52ND**



Camping for the 52nd National Square Dance Convention will be at the Oklahoma State Fair Park. The Fair Park is located in Oklahoma City, just northwest of the intersection of I-40 and I-44, only 4.1 miles west of our great convention facilities, with three easy-access in-bound traffic routes — I-40, Reno Ave, or NW 10th street.

There are 330 permanent camp-sites, (no 'pull-throughs') with water and 20 amp electrical service; and two dump stations. The campsites are on level grassy land with paved roads around the western half of the park and gravel roads in the eastern half. Restrooms and shower facilities are located at the campground. The campsites will be assigned not by early arrival, but by early registration. If needed, additional temporary campsites will be added.

Within just three to four miles of the campground are numerous sources of RV supplies and stores, such as Sam's Club, a WalMart Superstore which includes a food supermarket, etc.



## LEGACY to cease operations

LEGACY, The International Assembly of Trustees of the Square Dance Activity, was founded in 1973 as a non-profit international service leadership organization. Its main mission was to develop better communication among the many facets within the Square Dance Activity. At that time there was a National SD Convention Committee, various state, caller & cuer organizations, 3 major square dance publications....but there was very little communication between the various groups or facets.

During the past 30 years.....

Legacy created the environment from which Callerlab grew.

The National Association of Square & Round Dance Suppliers was formed at Legacy in '75.

ROUNDALAB, the International Ass'n of RD Teachers, was conceived at Legacy in '77.

Mini-legacy, or leadership programs, many using the Legacy Leadership Manual, have helped teach leadership in the US & Canada.

Members worked with National Folk Dance Committee when Square Dance was declared the US National Folk Dance in 1982-3. A committee has worked diligently ever since to have Square Dance declared the National Square Dance in perpetuity. This committee also spearheaded the successful campaign to get 32 US states to declare Square Dance their official state folk dance.

Members conducted daily Leadership and Public Relations seminars at 19 National Square Dance Conventions.

9 biennial surveys were conducted in the US and Canada on attitudes, desires, dress, club membership, demographic analysis of dancers, census and longevity of dancers, drops outs, etc. Results and comments were carefully noted and this information carefully shared worldwide.

Legacy sponsored and promoted September as Square Dance Month for many years.

A Square Dance hot line was maintained for handling trouble spots within the activity.

An annual Promo Pac for recruiting was created with many helpful hints and always included a new poster and possible theme.

In 1998 a campaign to stress "Dancing for the Health of It" was begun. Soon the theme was expanded to include "Dancing for Fun & Fitness".

Beginning in 1986, annual SUMMIT Meetings were held at the NSDC for representatives from all facets of the Square Dance Activity to have an opportunity to interface with each other.

Looking over the ensuing 30 years the trustees have come to see Legacy's mandate as being realized - assisting the organizations covering the many facets within the SD community to get established and striving to work together on some projects. The Legacy trustees now feel it is time to cease operations.

Since many Square Dance organizations are now well established world wide, the next growth phase is for all to work together for the betterment of the Activity. The ARTS program of the Callerlab Foundation offers this opportunity as its membership is expected to be made up from the many facets. We encourage all to support this enterprise as they so faithfully have supported Legacy throughout the years.
