

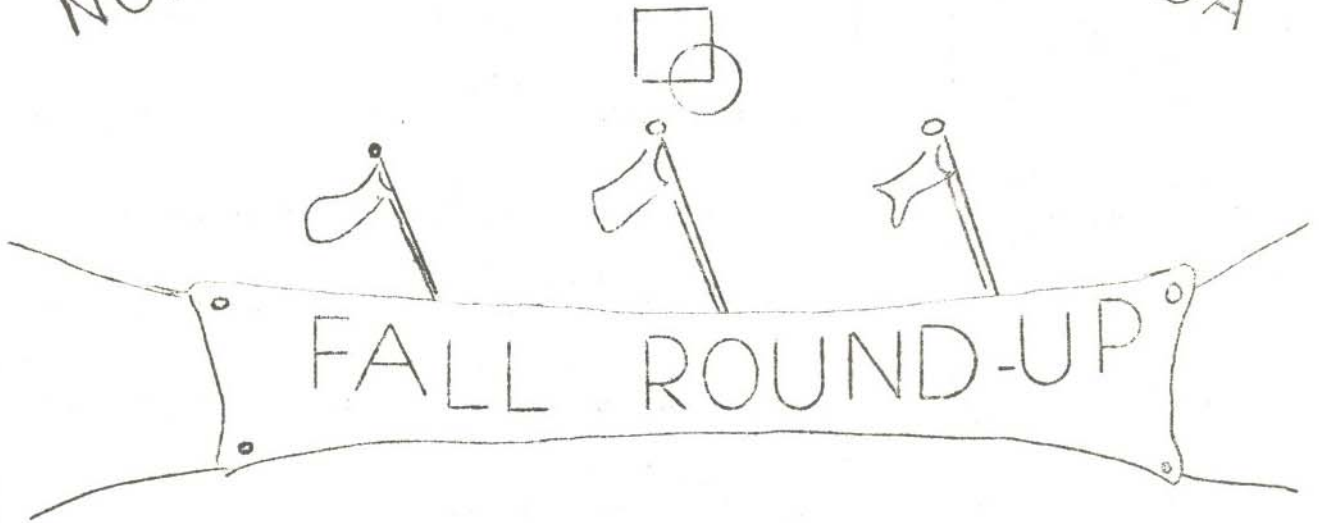

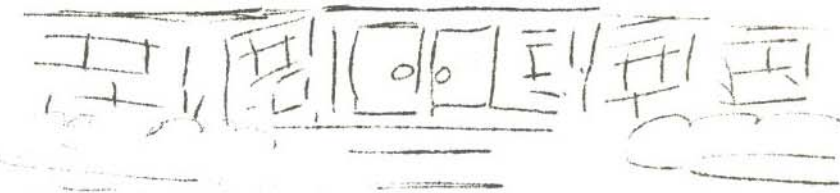

For the most, all will be energetic and after the first 2 or 3 lessons will be hopelessly hooked. For some (and I speak mostly of the men) they will start only because the little lady pushes them. As all of us know, these individuals soon discover, much to their chagrin, that instead of being the pushee they soon become the pusher forsaking golf, fishing and can you believe it "FOOTBALL". In order to maintain this level of enthusiasm we, as club members, must do everything possible to constantly encourage, help and yes, even praise them, as somebody did us long ago. We have a tendency, I think, to leave the students entirely up to the caller.

True, he is the one that calls the shots, but as club members we have an obligation to help the new prospective dancers integrate themselves into this fraternity of square dancers. Let them know that they are wanted, not only by assisting, but also by association.

Are there any Round Dance Clubs in the Northwest Florida Area? Are rounds being danced between tips at square dances?

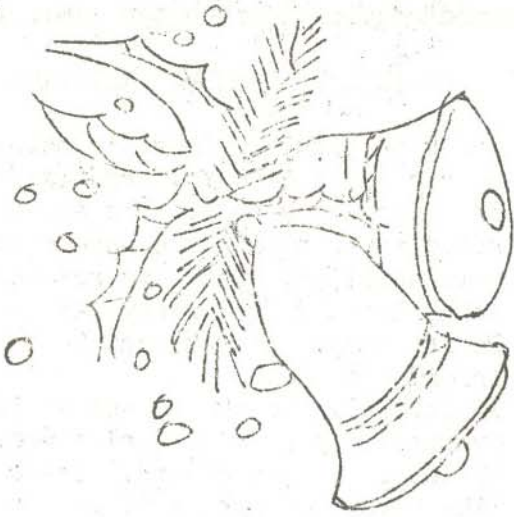

BUILDING CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The perennial question of how to increase club membership does not necessarily mean the same thing to all square dance groups. One club may need more members to pay hall rental while another club may need just another couple in order to dance. Still another club may find there is no spark of enthusiasm and current members do not attend.

This article will not deal with holding regular beginner classes which is the most natural way to add to membership rosters.

LOOK WITHIN -

If you find only a small percentage of members are coming, find out (1) Is it the same members attending each time? or (2) Are all members coming but only spasmodically?

If (1) is the case, it may be that this is a small band of diehards who are determined to keep the club going regardless. If (2) fits your club, it may be that most members would like the club to be successful, but are disappointed when they do come. Unsatisfied members may soon stop coming at all.

It's time to be realistic. Gather up those who support the club and take a practical look at what has happened. Look backwards to find out when members began to be less enthusiastic. See if you can pinpoint a change at that time. Did club policy change? Did cliques form? Did you change callers? If non of these apply, when do you need to change policy? When people are willing to speak freely with no personal animosity, the difficulty usually can be uncovered and a solution found.

If you can restore the interest of all members, their enthusiasm will probably attract their friends to the club.

FIND LOST SHEEP-

It may be that a personal contact with those that used to belong to your club is all that is needed for them to come back to the club. Contact them, you may be surprised at the results.

Depending upon the number involved, it may be wise to plan a brush-up session.

INVITE NEW MEMBERS

When inviting dancers of the area to join your club, there are a few points to consider:

1. Always invite people to join because you want them as people, not just to lengthen your roster or increase your bank account.
2. Let it be known whether your club has "open" membership or "by invitation only" so there will be no misunderstanding.
3. Use tact and consideration when discussing levels, how you dance, etc.
4. Never rob another club of its members. If a couple has the time to join two clubs, fine, but if not, leave them alone except as visitors to your club. Do not entice them from current membership.
5. Always make new members feel welcome and wanted. Bring them into the planning and "inner circle" from the very beginning.

COMBINE CLUBS-

Sometimes no matter how hard a club tries, it just doesn't succeed. Membership continues to decline or be maintained at a minimal level. It may be time to think about combining with another club.

Certainly there's lots which must be resolved: The time and place to dance; the club name; the caller(s); the officers

But this is simply a matter of taking time to work everything out to the best sense of right under the circumstances. All it requires is a little give and take. The result could be a better square dance activity in your area.

CEASE -

Yes, there is a right time for a club to "fold". If this appears to be the case, the group should not consider it a defeat. The original reasons for its formation may no longer exist; it may have passed its usefulness; the struggle to keep going simply may not be worth it.

Make the decision without bitterness. Make intelligent decisions about any club funds. Keep all memories of the club as happy ones. (SQUARE DANCING, Jan. '75)

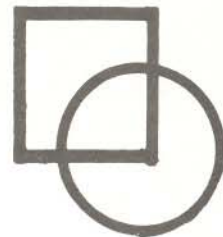
