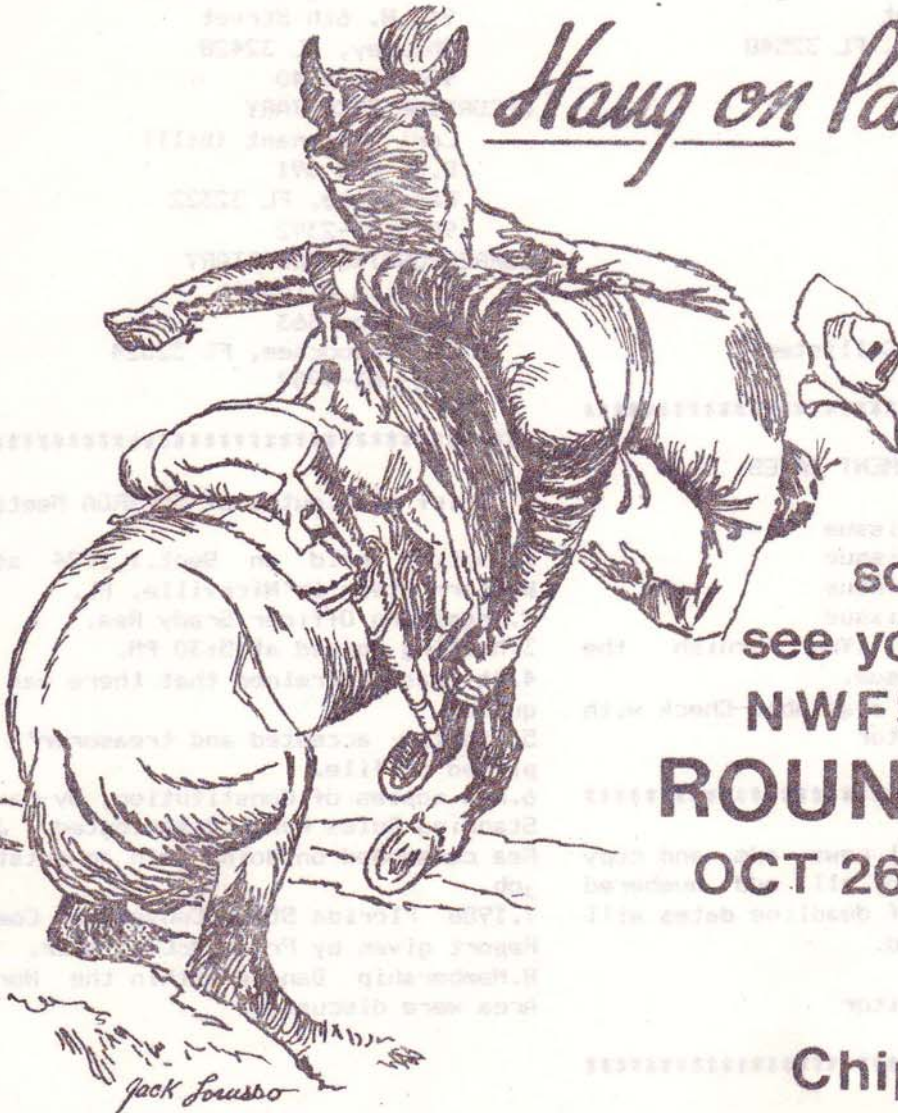

HANDICAPABLE DANCERS COMMITTEE

Recognizing the fact that there is place within the Square Dance Movement for the handicapped and disabled, the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC. has created a Committee for the Handicapable Dancer. Co-chairing the Committee will be Mac and Chieko MacKenzie and Frank and Nancy Cherry.

This Committee will work to insure that handicapped dancers have the opportunity to enjoy square dancing. Establishment of square dance classes for the handicapped will be encouraged, and the Committee will develop guidelines for implementation and promotion of the classes.

The Committee for Handicapable Dancers will coordinate the dissemination of information concerning other groups which serve the disabled. This Committee will also serve as a forum for the identification of existing clubs and leaders, encouraging an exchange of ideas beneficial to the promotion, preservation and growth of these special interest groups. As a result of these activities other square dance organizations can be made aware of the importance of including the handicapable within their programs.

Through the creation of the special Committee, the USDA has taken the initial step in recognizing that a place exists within the square dance movement for the disabled and handicapped. Hopefully others will join the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC, in extending this overdue recognition and acceptance of a vital segment of the activity. Re-elected to a second term as President were Joe and Joy Vaccari. Also re-elected were Howard and Loraine Backus who will be serving their second term as Plains Region Vice Presidents. Continuing for a second term as Secretary are Bob and Betty Coates who are well qualified to handle the responsibilities of this critical position.

George and Judy Garland who have been serving as Chairman of the USDA's long range project to develop a Square Dancers Museum and Hall of Fame, have taken on the additional duties of Central Region Vice President.

Dancers can then choose to dance the evening and in the locale that is convenient for them. Clubs also do not find it necessary to lower their level to accommodate the new dancer. They are better prepared to absorb new members with a minimum of conflict or difficulty.

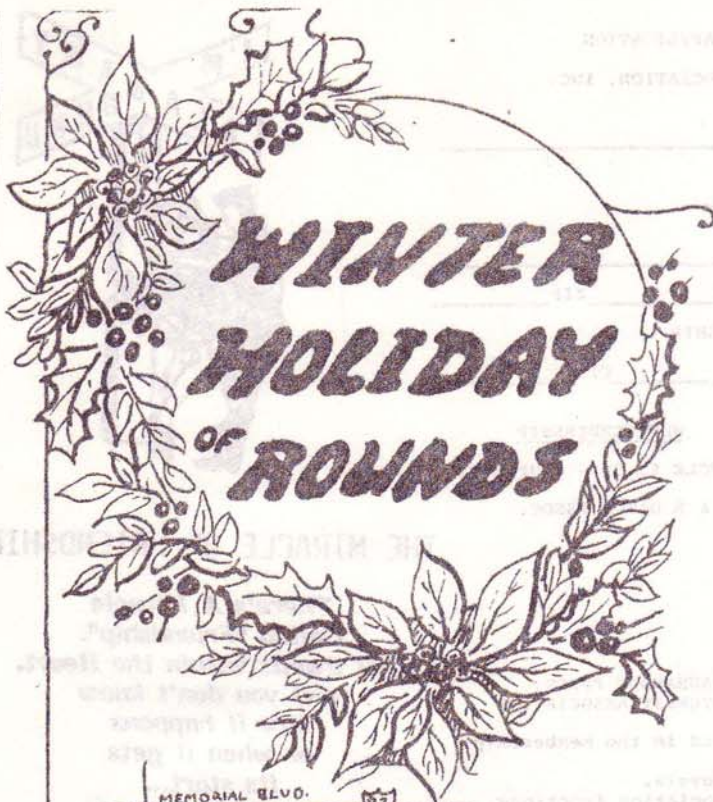

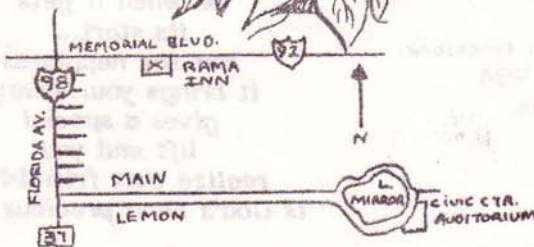

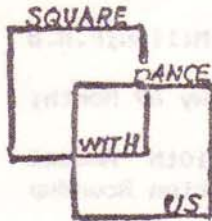
