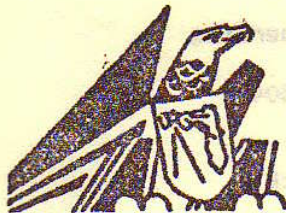

SQUARE DANCE INSURANCE

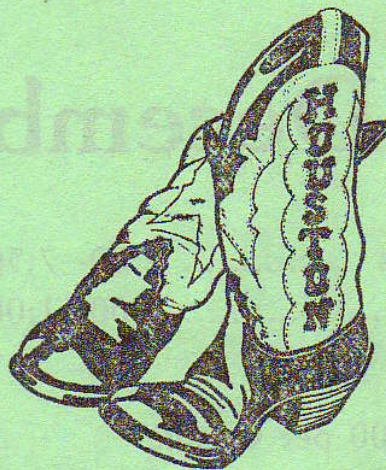
Brochures, forms and other information on the 1987 Square Dancer Insurance program available through the Florida Federation of Square Dancers and the United Square Square Dancers of America should be in the hands of your Association Insurance Chairman by mid - October.

This insurance program was especially designed for square and round dance clubs and Associations. It provides for \$500,000 liability and \$10,000 accident/medical expenses plus many other benefits. Cost for this coverage was only \$1.15 per club member in 1986. (A small increase is expected for 1987). The Policy year will be January 1, 1987 through December 31, 1987 with no proration for partial year coverage.

Is your Association, Club and Officers protected by Insurance for general liability and bodily injury? It is suggested that clubs give insurance serious consideration and sign up as soon as possible to obtain maximum benefit - that is - coverage effective January 1, 1987.

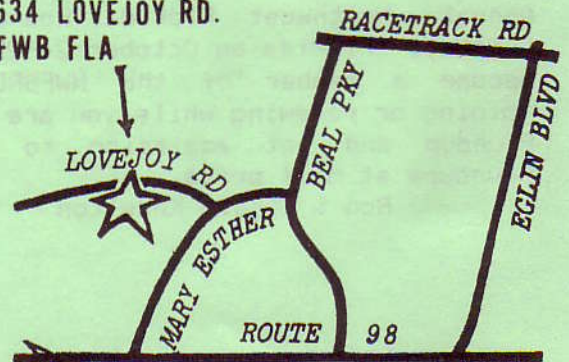

NEWS RELEASE: STATE CONVENTION
DANCERS HEAVEN IN "87"

The 1987 State Square and Round Dance Convention has as its Theme "Dancers Heaven in '87" " This is not only the Theme but it is the basic philosophy of the convention committee, truly a convention designed to give the dancers an exciting and fun structured convention. To accomplish this goal we analysed many of the past conventions. We looked for the good parts as well as those areas that we felt could and must be improved to accomplish our goals.

The first opportunity for improvement was the conditions under which the plus dancer was asked to dance. It was concluded by the committee that to achieve our goals we would have to provide more room and better sound in the plus hall. We therefore decided to open up the conference hall as one large hall for plus dancing. When this is done it will comfortably handle just under two hundred squares. A sound engineer and inventor of the Yak Stak Speakers was asked to work with the Caller Vice Chairman, Earl Steele, for sounding of all halls. In 1987 the plus dancer will have more space and better sound.

The opening of the conference hall created another opportunity when consideration was given to the displaced round dancer as they previously shared 50 % of the conference hall. We first arranged to rent the Lake Mirror facility for exclusive use of the round dancers and provide transportation between the Civic Center and the Lake Mirror Facility. We subsequently determined with the help of the Round Dance Council that the Lake Mirror Center was not large enough and the logistics for the Round Dance Leaders working in both places created a problem. The second and final choice which was adopted is to use all halls at the Civic Center Complex on a continuous basis which means they will open for dancing at 9:00 A.M. and close at 11:30 P.M.. This will provide more flexibility in the use of the halls and gives all levels of dance equal time and presents a good variety of alternatives for the

dancer.

We believe that given the chance to work, this arrangement will accomplish the goals of the 1987 Convention committee of presenting a dance for the DANCER and providing for his total enjoyment.

The 1987 Convention will truly be a "Dancers Heaven in '87'", and we ask your support of this, your State Convention, in 1987.

Daryl Clendenin, Chairman of CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that SCOOT AND RELOCATE is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning October 1, 1986.

SCOOT AND RELOCATE

Starts from 1/4 Tag Position

Center wave dancers step forward and Turn Thru with outside dancers, then return to a wave in the center (Scoot Back). Center wave then does a Fan The Top while the outside dancers individually turn 1/4 right and single file Promenade 1/4 and turn to face in.

Ending Formation: 1/4 Tag position at right angles to the starting 1/4 Tag.

Timing: 10 beats

Current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Scoot Cross and Turn

When we say that we built the building, we mean it! After purchasing the materials for the building and contracting out the concrete slab, the Square Dancers put the building up. Many people put in much time and money to make our project a success. All of the clubs and dancers pulled together and showed that when Square Dancers want something done they can do it.

On the 8th of August we had our building dedication with a dinner and dance. County Commissioner, John Hutt, who was very instrumental in obtaining the land for our building was present. We want to say "Thank you, John, very much for your help". The Association presented John with a plaque which will be on display at GRAND SQUARE HALL. Also, we want to thank County Commissioner, Mrs. Helen Ingram, for the beautiful plant she sent us. Thanks also go to Kieth Latham for getting the dinner and dance lined up. The food was delicious. Many thanks to all who brought and supplied food. The callers for the dance were Darryl McMillan and Jack White, who donated their time and gave us an outstanding dance. Many thanks to Darryl and Jack.

Now about our building. It is constructed of steel with a dance area of approximately 50 ft. by 60 ft. with a 50 x 24 ft. kitchen, storage, and restroom area. In a few years we plan to expand the dance area by another 50 ft. At the present time we have electrical hook ups for R.V.'s and motor homes. Our parking area is not yet paved but this will be our next big project.

A Different After Party: ASTROWORLD

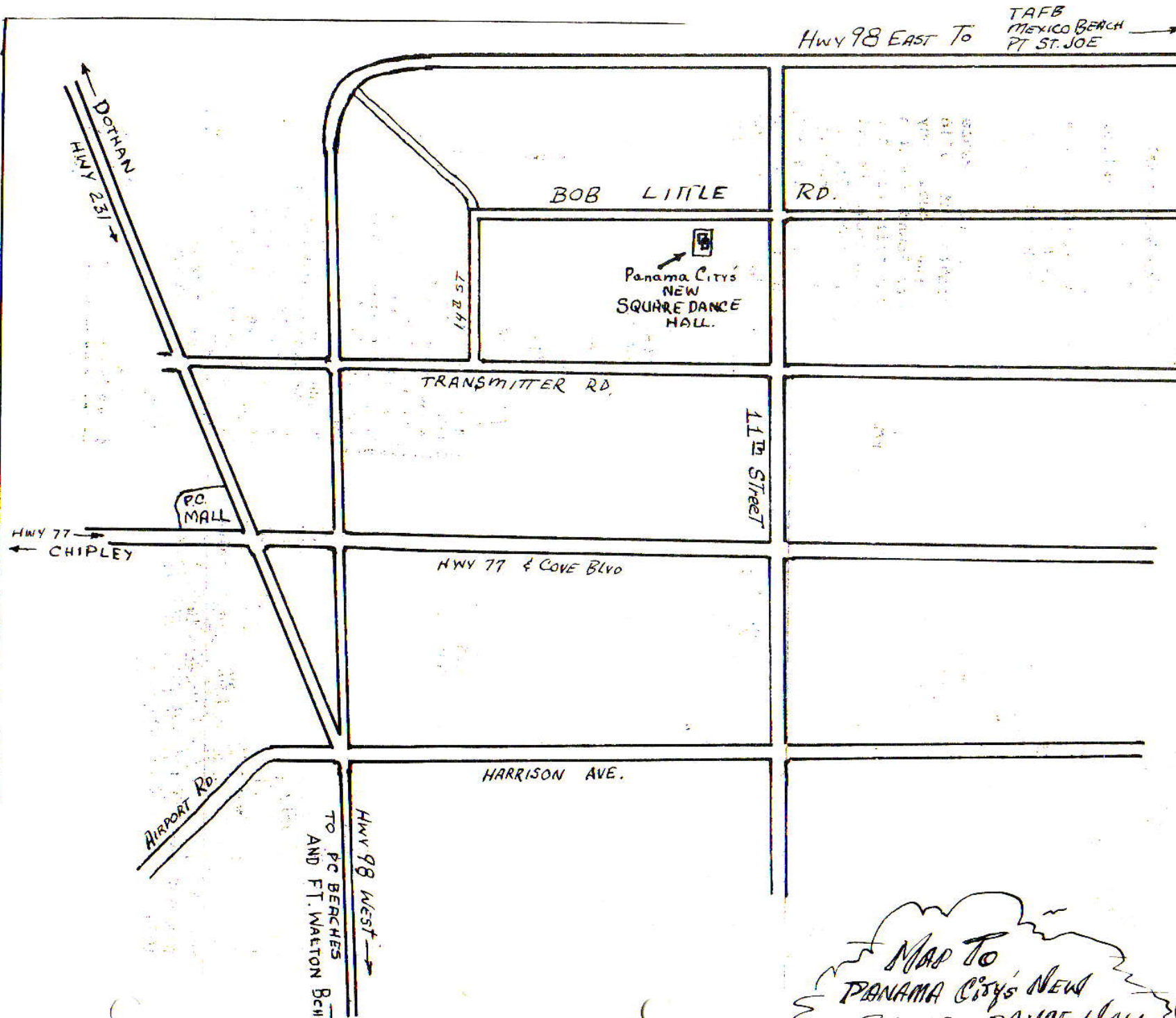

Recognition and Thanks are given to all Presidents and Members of all of the State and Regional Associations for their exceptional interest and support which resulted in such and outstanding victory.

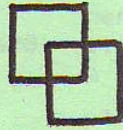

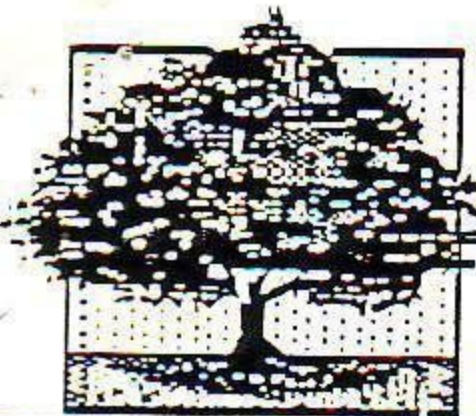

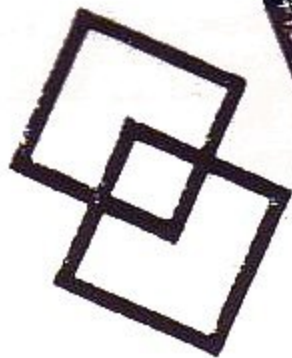
