

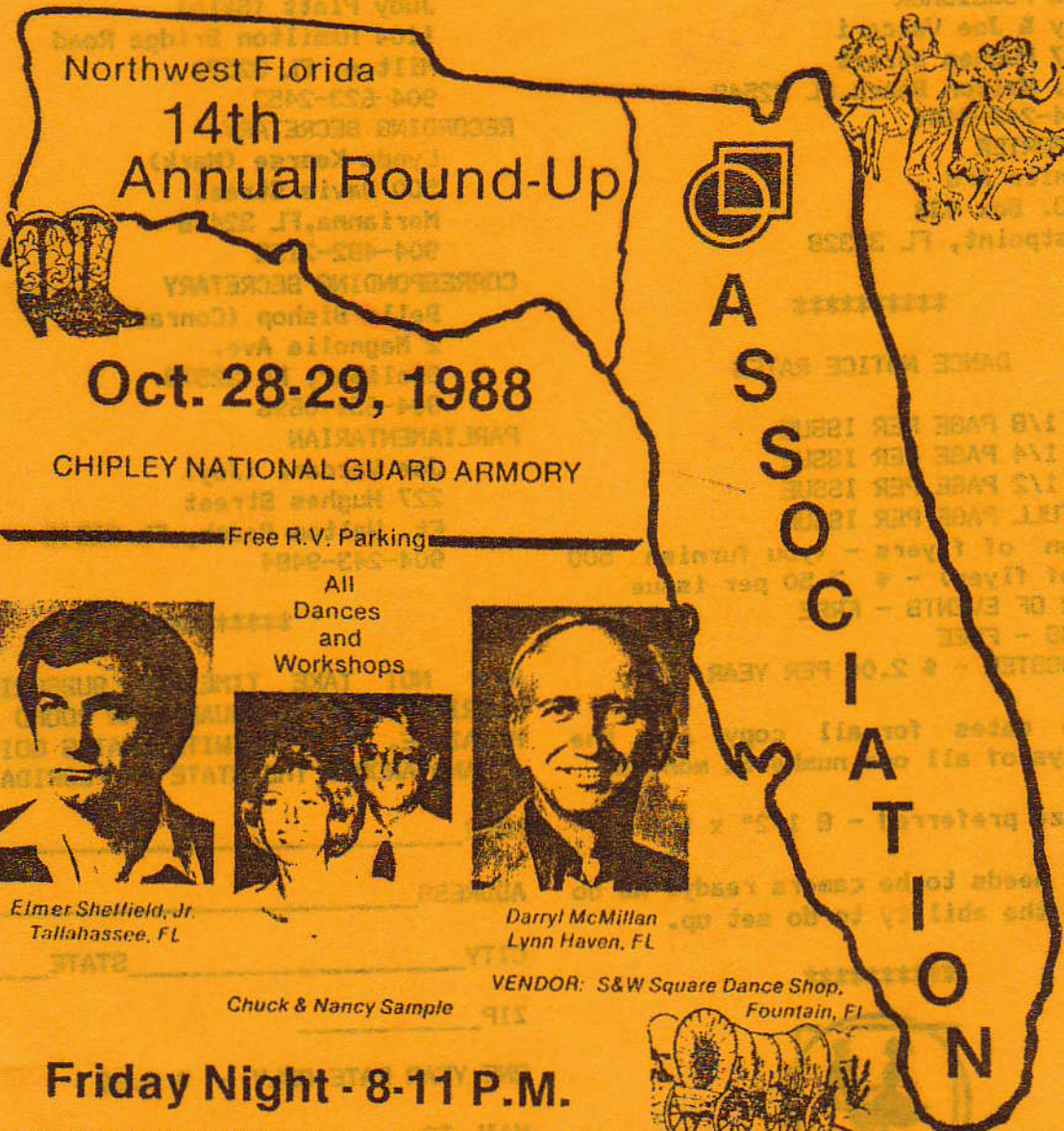

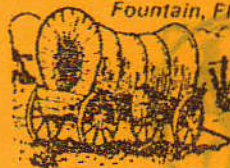

1989 SQUARE DANCE INSURANCE PROGRAM

The 1989 insurance program for Associations, clubs and dancers will be identical to the 1988 program. This program offered to the NWFSRDA provides for one million dollars general liability and up to \$10,000 accident/medical benefits. The program will continue to offer Certificates of Additional Named Insured (to cover the owner of a dance facility) at no additional cost.

It is anticipated that the cost of \$1.85 per person will remain the premium for 1989. All club members must participate. If a dancer belongs to more than one club they pay only one enrollment fee. Class members and new members joining after the club enrolls are covered at no extra cost. The policy year is Jan. 1 through Dec. 31, 1989 with no protection for partial year coverage.

Individual members of the Northwest Association are provided the insurance at no additional cost when they renew or join the Association.

Your Northwest Insurance Chairman will soon be accepting enrollments for 1989. Every Square, Round, and Clogging Club in Northwest Florida should seriously consider enrolling and obtaining the economical Liability and Accident protection provided by the program.

Future Conventions are Oklahoma City in 1989, Memphis in 1990, Salt Lake City in 1991, and Cincinnati in 1992. National Conventions always start on the fourth Thursday of June.

The National Executive Committee will hold its Pre-Convention meeting with all future Chairmen and Assistants in Memphis from March 28 to April 1, 1989.

RUN TO OKLAHOMA

Covered wagons were an integral part of the original Oklahoma Run in 1989, so they will play an important part in Oklahoma City's 38th National Square Dance Convention a century later.

As a promotion for this major event, nine MINIATURE covered wagons have been sent over the nation, to make their trip back to OKC in time for the start of the convention on June 22, 1989.

Constructed of wood, metal and cloth, the wagons will each bear a greeting letter and a sufficient supply of post cards. The cards will be used by recipients "along the trail" to send information back to Oklahoma City, telling of the wagon's location.

The plan is to have square dancers take or send the wagons from one square dance club to the next, along a route that will eventually end up in Oklahoma City.

Each wagon is uniquely numbered and as a wagon reaches a club an Officer of the club will send a post card to Wagonmasters Don & Carolyn Lewis.

The covered wagons will travel thousands of miles and will be "Ambassadors" for the 38th National as they make their trek to OKC.

WHEREAS, folk and square dances are an integral, important, and expressive part of American art and culture; and

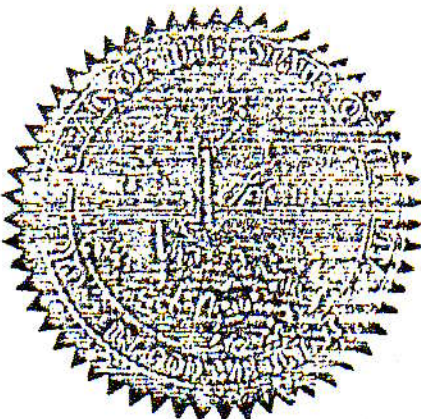
