### NEWS BULLETIN FROM THE NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

St. Louis, MO, in 1993 was announced as a future National Convention site as 20,572 including dancers from all 50 States and many foreign countries attended the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City. Thirty-five states had 50 or more dancers in Oklahoma City and thirty-one had 100 or more - making it a truly National Convention.

Future Convention dates are: Memphis, June 28-30 in 1990; Salt Lake City, June 27-29 in 1991; Cincinnati, June 25-27 in 1992; and St. Louis, June 24-26 in 1993. Conventions always

start on the fourth Thursday in June.

The 1994 Convention will be awarded at Memphis during the 1990 Convention at a bid session at 9 AM, Friday, June 29th, in the Memphis Convention Center.

### CALLERLAB ACCREDITATION DEMONSTRATED COMPETENCE

Accredit - to give credit or authority; to bring into credit or favor; to authorize; give credentials to.

Members of many professional organizations seek accreditation so those who desire their services will have an indication of their competence. The CALLERLAB caller accreditation program provides this same measure of assurance to the square dance clubs and organizations that use our services. Accreditation by CALLERLAB recognizes the attainment of professional responsibility and competence in the calling and teaching of square dancing.

Any square dance caller may seek CALLERLAB accreditation. Membership in CALLERLAB is not a requirement. CALLERLAB members and subscribers, however, must become accredited within two (2) years of their joining CALLERLAB. Re-accreditation must be obtained every six years.

Qualified callers are encouraged to seek CALLERLAB accreditation.

As you recall, our theme was "Who Are We ?" We felt that we could learn a lot about ourselves, our backgrounds, and our families. We need this kind of information to size up the market for square dancing and to direct our promotional efforts in the right directions.

We square dancers are not shy about ourselves. The wealth of information we generated from the replies has overwhelmed us -- each form provided forty-five pieces of data. Much of the information deserves to be examined in detail; much of it warrants our full and undivided attention. We plan on a series of reports, each highlighting a meaningful aspect of the survey.

The series will include reports on age trends, demographic profiles, family status, singles, dancing trends, club trends, and the heartfelt comments which many of included in your survey forms.

Most of what I really need to know about how to live, and what to do, and how to be, I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate mountain, but there in the sandbox at the nursery school.

These are the things I learned: Share everything. Play fair. Don't hit people. Put things back where you found them. Clean up your own mess. Don't take things that aren't yours. Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody. Wash your hands before you eat. Flush. Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you. Live a balanced life. Learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and work some every day.

Take a nap every afternoon. When you go out into the world, watch for traffic, hold hands and stick together. Be aware of wonder. Remember the little seed in the cup. The roots go down and the plant goes up and nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.

Goldfish and hamsters and white mice and even the little seed in the plastic cup ..... they all die. So do we.

And then remember the book about Dick and Jane and first word you learned, the biggest word of all: LOOK. Everything you need to know is in there somewhere. The Golden Rule and Love and basic sanitation. Ecology, politics and sane living.

Think of what a better world it would be if we all ... the whole world ... had cookies and milk about 3 o'clock every afternoon and then lay down with our blankets for a nap. Or if we had a basic policy in our nation and other nations to always put things back where we found them and cleaned up our own messes. And it is still true, no matter how old you are, when you go out into the world, it is best to stick together.

## ANNUAL MEETING OF THE UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

The annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA (USDA) was held on June 23, 1989 in conjunction with the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. USDA membership continues to grow. Louisiana Square Dance Association, Heart of America Federation of Kansas and Maricopa County Square Dance Association of Arizona officially became USDA 1989 Affiliates, joining 26 other dance organizations and pushing the individual dancer membership above 250,000.

Representatives of LEGACY, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity, and, CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, attended the meeting and expressed appreciation for the cooperation, communication and coordination of the activities of the various national and international square dance organizations.

The Four USDA Regional Vice Presidents reported of their contacts with various state/dancer organizations soliciting their support of the combined LEGACY/USDA campaign to have the "Square Dance" designated as their State Folk Dance. Ten (10) states now have this honor! Many more are currently working with their governing officials in pursuit of this honor.

The Board of Directors voted to conduct future USDA Annual Meetings prior to the National Square Dance Convention so as not to conflict with any of the activities of the "World's Greatest Square Dance Event", the National Square Dance Convention.

USDA has now embarked on the implementation of plans to publish a quarterly USDA publication. Watch for the first USDA newsletter this fall.

The Handicapable Committee has been flooded with requests from throughout the USA seeking data concerning the formation of handicapable clubs, club operations and points of contact of existing handicapable clubs.

The Insurance Committee and Credit Card Committee reported great success in their services provided for the dancers. Every dollar received from these committees are put back into the square dance activity for the dancers. Evidence of this is seen by reams of USDA educational and training materials provided for the dancers and leaders at the Show Case of Ideas at the last National Convention. There are no paid employees in the USDA organization, not one, just volunteer dancers promoting and perpetuating the world's greatest hobby, through the operation of the world's largest square dance organization - the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA.

### Ladies Dress

Authentic Pattern #280  
65% Polyester/35% Cotton  
Charcoal Gray #9370/Soft Pink #1834  
(Palencia Fabric)

Bodice and skirt are *charcoal gray* with the *soft pink* ruffle around the bottom coming up to the waistline in front and a pink bow. (It is suggested that an eight (8) gore skirt pattern be used in place of the bias cut to prevent sagging after washings. Several ladies have pointed out that the bias cut can be a problem. If using the eight (8) gore pattern, use the bias pattern for placement of the ruffle.) There are three necklines to choose from. The choice of sleeve is optional - should you like a longer sleeve or a puff sleeve. This pattern has a cap sleeve of *soft pink* peek-a-boooing from under the *charcoal gray* cap sleeve.

Estimated yardage for an average size 12, depending on length, is as follows:

*Charcoal Gray* . . . 3 - 3 1/2 yards  
*Soft Pink* . . . . 2 1/2 - 2 3/4 yards

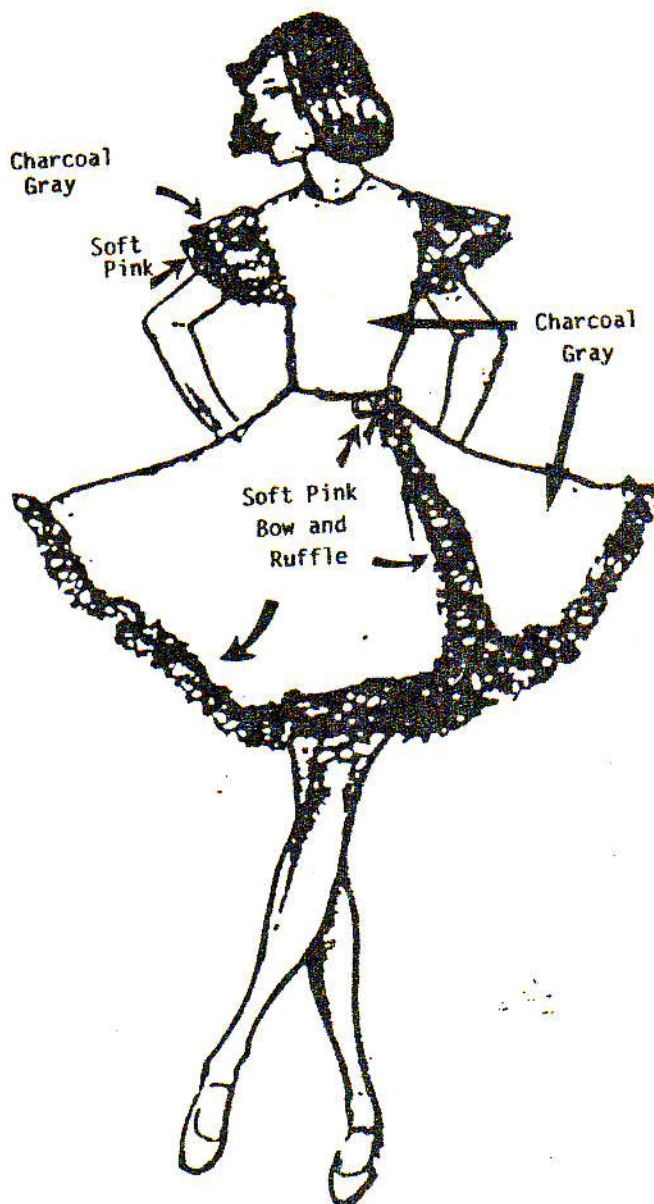
### Men's Outfit
