# KITCHEN TALK

by RUTH KINCAID

## REUBEN LOAF

- 2 beaten eggs
- 2 T snipped parsley
- 1 clove garlic (small) minced
- 1 8 oz. can sauerkraut (drained and snipped)
- 1 cup (4 oz.) shredded process swiss cheese
- 2 C soft bread crumbs (2½ slices bread)
- 2 12 oz. cans corned beef finely chopped
- ½ t caraway seed
- 3 slices (3 oz.) process swiss cheese, halved diagonally

Combine egg, bread crumbs, parsley and garlic. Stir in corned beef; mix well. On foil or waxed paper, pat meat mixture to a 10 x 10 inch square. Combine sauerkraut, caraway and shredded Swiss Cheese; mound in center of corned beef mixture. Wrap meat around sauerkraut mixture forming a loaf. Seal seam and ends. Place in greased 13 x 9 x 2 inch baking pan. Bake in 350 degree oven for 45 minutes. Top with cheese triangles; bake 5 minutes more or till cheese is melted. **MAKES 8 SERVINGS.**

## CR. BETTER HOMES & GARDEN

### APPLE CAKE

- 2 eggs
- 2 C sugar
- 2 t baking soda
- Pinch of salt
- ½ C oil
- 1 C broken nut meats
- 1 t vanilla
- 2 C flour
- 4 C apples (fine diced)
- 2 t cinnamon

Cream sugar, eggs, oil and vanilla, add the remaining ingredients. Pour into greased 9 x 13 x 2 inch greased pan, or two smaller pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

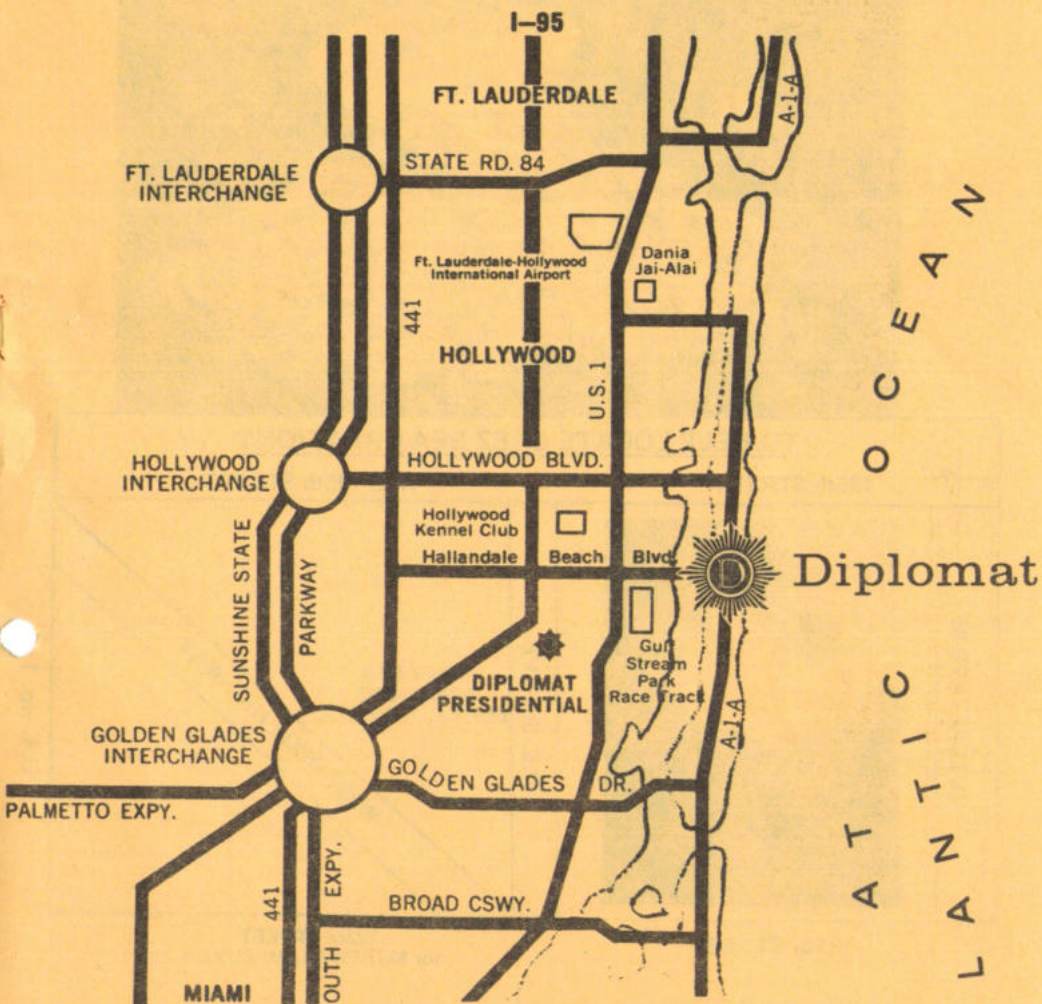

HOW TO TREAT A CALLER'S WIFE--Taken from the Fun & Friendship - Denver

Try going to a dance and look pleasant, interested and charming all night while doing nothing. You may take up knitting.

She would like to feel welcome when she comes to your club, but may not go to some dances, because her double role as a parent doesn't allow it.

Though her husband is usually an outgoing person (and a little bit of a ham) this doesn't necessarily mean she is, and she may have trouble meeting people on her own. Many clubs have been concerned with what to do with her, but this is basically her problem and her own adjustment to her husband's occupation. All she wants from you as a dancer is naturalness and common courtesy, and the right to be herself.
