CHEESY TUNA CASSEROLE

- 1 10 oz. can condensed cheddar cheese soup
- 1 13 oz. can tuna (drained)
- 1 10 oz. pkg. frozen vegetables or 1 can mixed vegetables (drained)
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 8 oz. pkg. refrigerator biscuits
- 1/2 tsp. salt

Preheat oven to 400. In a 2 quart saucepan over medium heat cook  
undiluted cheese soup and all ingredients except biscuits, until heated  
through, stirring. Spoon hot mixture into 8" x 8" baking pan. Place  
biscuits on top. (Roll out a little, if you care to.) Bake 25 to 30  
minutes until biscuits are browned. Serves 4.

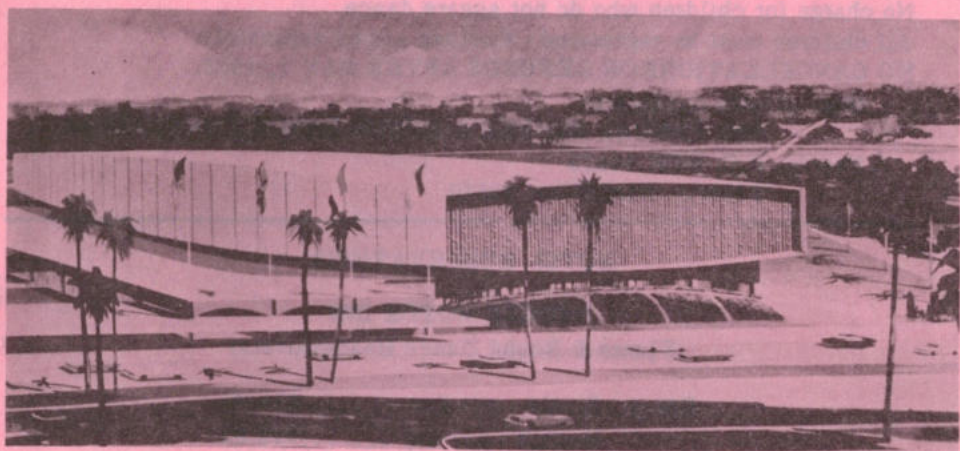

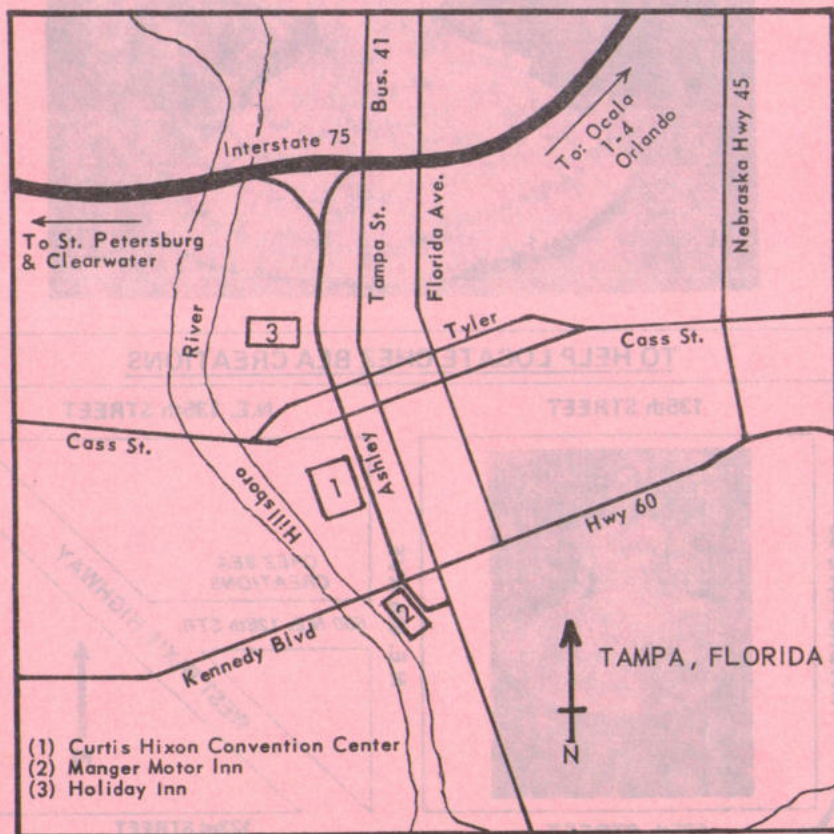

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

In answer to the PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE, Ben & Hazel Hamilton, but really to the many people who wrote our president about the making up of sets in advance.

DANCERS go to a square dance to have fun basically. Also to dance with their special friends and visitors to their club. Is this forming squares? The club level is determined by the majority of dancers and in some cases forming squares is done to maintain the level of the dance. Each individual dancer should be able to dance this level easily, if they cannot they should try to improve themselves, or try other clubs. Many callers drop the level of their dance to keep the slower dancers moving. This is one reason why many dancers form squares, trying to keep a good level of dancing.

If dancers find themselves standing more than dancing it is time to look for the reason, it may be you. Everyone makes mistakes or misinterprets calls or does not hear a call, but this does not happen every tip all evening through.

SOME REASONS WHY SOME PEOPLE ARE AVOIDED: Rough, been drinking liquor, do not know their basics properly, do not leave the teaching to the caller. The Mavericks Creed is very fine if it is sincere and honest, but if it is used as a put down and a cause for criticism, or as an excuse, it defeats the purpose of the Creed.

A NOTE FOR BEGINNERS: If you are a serious and enthusiastic dancer, and your caller or teacher is not doing you justice, complain loud and clear. He is supposed to prepare you for intermediate level dancing.
