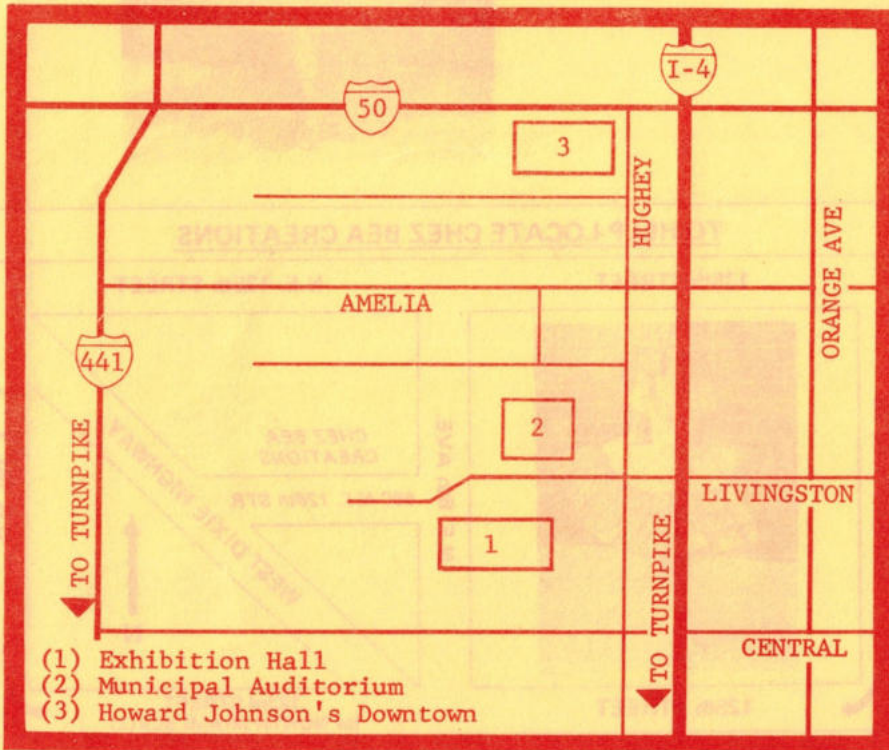

- 1 can water
- 1/3 cup Soy Sauce
- 3/4 cup uncooked rice

Brown beef, mix other ingredients with beef in casserole. Bake covered for 1 hour in 350 degree oven.
