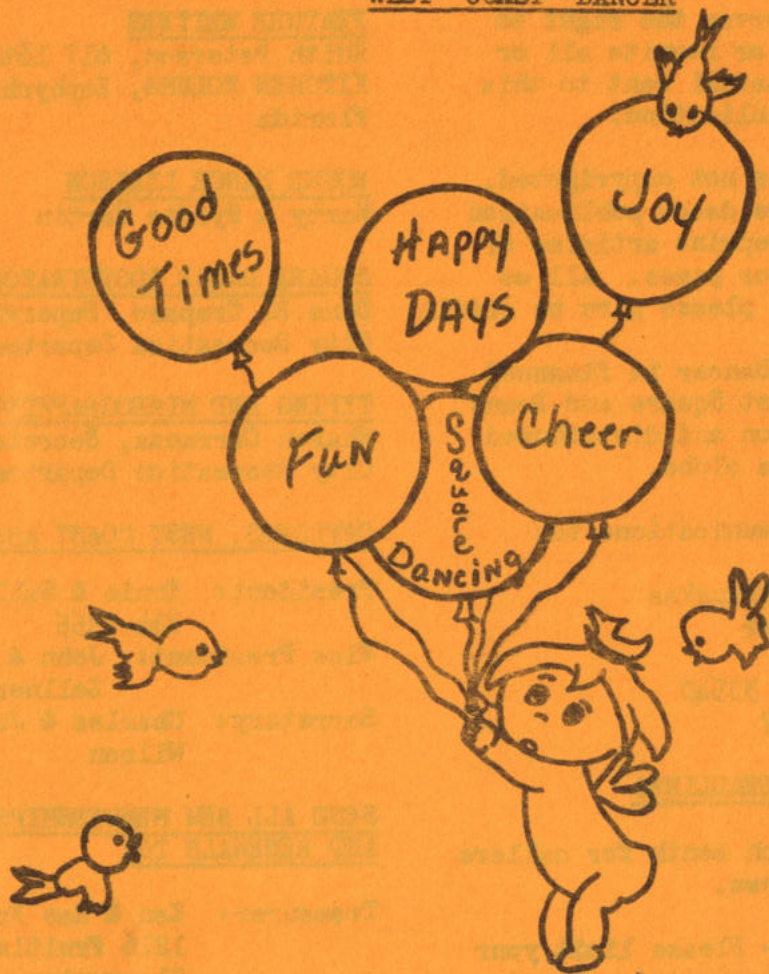

Cleanliness is very important! A good de-oderant, and a good mouth wash are a MUST! Carry a package of breath mints, then you'll be yellow-rocking sweet!

As a square dancer you can travel all over this country and the world in fact, and find a square dance somewhere close by, where you will be mad welcome and find yourself among friends instantly. Whatever your reason for becoming a square dancer--you'll be glad you did! We wish you all many happy, fun filled days in your new hobby.

### LEMON-ORANGE CAKE

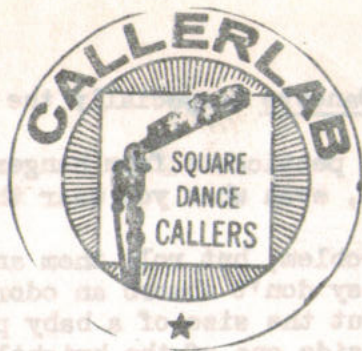
- 1 store bought Orange Chiffon Cake
- 1 pkg. Lemon Pudding
- Grated peel and juice from one lemon
- $\frac{1}{2}$  envelope plain gelatin
- Wipped cream or cool whip

Make lemon pudding according to package directions, add juice and grated lemon peel along with plain gelatin. Make merangue, pour pudding slowly into merangue. Cool slightly. Cut cake cross ways in half or thirds--put filling between and cool for several hours. Frost with cool whip when ready to serve.

### PINEAPPLE PRESERVE COOKIES

- 1 Cup sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$  cup margarine, softened
- 1 egg
- 2  $\frac{1}{4}$  cups all purpose flour
- 1 tsp. soda
- $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup pineapple preserves
- additional preserves

Cream sugar and margarine until light and fluffy. Add egg, beating well. Combine flour, soda and salt--add to creamed mixture, mixing well. Stir in  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup pineapple preserves. Shape dough into walnut size balls and place on greased cookie sheet 2" apart. Make slight indentation in each cookie - spoon small amount of preserves in each. Bake at 375 oven 10 minutes or until done. Yield: about 5 dozen.



**TRANSFER THE COLUMN** by Lee Kopman

The figure starts from two columns set up by doing a curlique from facing lines of four, and ends in two parallel ocean waves. This is an action-filled call with all dancers moving forward.

**Basic Presentation:** Set up lines of four by having heads lead right and circle to a line. Now do a curlique to set up the basic column formation. Have the lead girl in each column be recognized; now have the man behind the lead girl be recognized. These two in single file formation will walk around the adjacent column, and walk toward the foot of that column. At the half-way point they will stop and face in to the center of the set. This leaves the couple on the outside of the set half-sashayed.

The remaining dancers left in the column formation will progress forward single file as if doing a half tag the line. When shoulder to shoulder they will cast or turn right  $\frac{1}{2}$ , and step ahead to extend right hands to the awaiting dancers to end forming an ocean wave. From a normal start as described the ending wave will have two boys with right hands on one end of the wave and a pair of girls on the other end.

**Caution Points:** The couples walking around the outside of the set should not crowd the center action. The center dancers must establish the half tag position and not hurry the  $\frac{1}{2}$  turn.

Heads lead right circle to a line

Curlique, transfer the column

Swing thru, boys run right

Crosstrail, left allemande.....

Heads lead right circle to a line

Curlique, transfer the column

Centers trade, boys run right

Left allemande.....

**HALF TAG TRADE AND ROLL**

This is a smooth combination of three basics which are part of the title. The action is very smooth and easily directed. From any line formation the dancers first do half tag the line, then trade with the adjacent dancer; then each dancer rolls or turns to face the one traded with.

The trade or turn half portion of the figure followed by the roll to end facing is very smooth but exacting. Callers can feel that this movement can be called directionally and actually that is exactly what you are doing. You should feel free to make directional changes in the movement. For example: Half tag, trade and boys run — the boys run is substituted for the roll. This call gives a lot of directional variety and fun dancing.

Heads square thru four

Swing thru, boys run

Half tag, trade and roll

Right and left thru

Left allemande.....

Heads lead right and circle to a line

Slide thru, swing thru

Half tag, trade and roll

Pass thru

Left allemande.....

More Hints For New Dancers (especially the ladies)

Never hang your petticoats from hangers. This makes them droop, and they hang uneven, even when you wear them.

Storage is a problem, but roll them and put them in a little bag, a cloth bag, then they don't absorb an odor. If rolled tightly they will fit inside a bag about the size of a baby pillow. You can put several of these little bags inside one of the brightly colored cardboard boxes used for storage.

The only practical and lasting way to starch a petticoat is to spray it with liquid plastic floor wax. Spread it over an open umbrella to dry.
