## TABLE TALK

BLACK CHERRY SALAD

Drain 1 large or 2 small cans of black cherries. Dissolve 1 package of lemon jello and 1 package of cherry jello in  $1\frac{1}{2}$  C boiling water, add  $\frac{3}{4}$  C cherry juice,  $\frac{3}{4}$  C orange juice and 1 C grape juice. Cool: After cherries are well drained place  $\frac{1}{4}$  piece of pecan kernal in each cherry, drop into jello mixture and pour into 13" x 9" pan and refrigerate.

BEACON HILL COOKIES

Melt 1-6 oz. package chocolate bits over hot water. Beat 2-egg whites with a pinch of salt until mix is foamy. Gradually add  $\frac{1}{2}$  C sugar beating until stiff and peaks form. Blend in  $\frac{1}{2}$  t vinegar and  $\frac{1}{2}$  t vanilla and fold in melted chocolate and add  $\frac{3}{4}$  C chopped nuts (walnuts preferred). Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet. Decorate with chopped walnuts. (Decoration is optional) Make in 350 degree oven for 10 minutes. Makes approximately 36 cookies.

SPANISH CREAM DESSERT

1-Pkg. "KNOX" gelatine  
3-Eggs separated  
1-T Vanilla

1-Qt. Milk  
8-T Sugar

Put milk in top of double boiler, heat until luke warm, soak gelatine in milk. Beat egg yolks until creamy, add 4-T sugar to yolks, add yolks to warm milk, beat and stir until milk comes to a boil. Remove from heat and cool. Beat egg whites until stiff add 4-T sugar one at a time continue beating until stiff. Fold in to milk mixture pour in pan and chill.

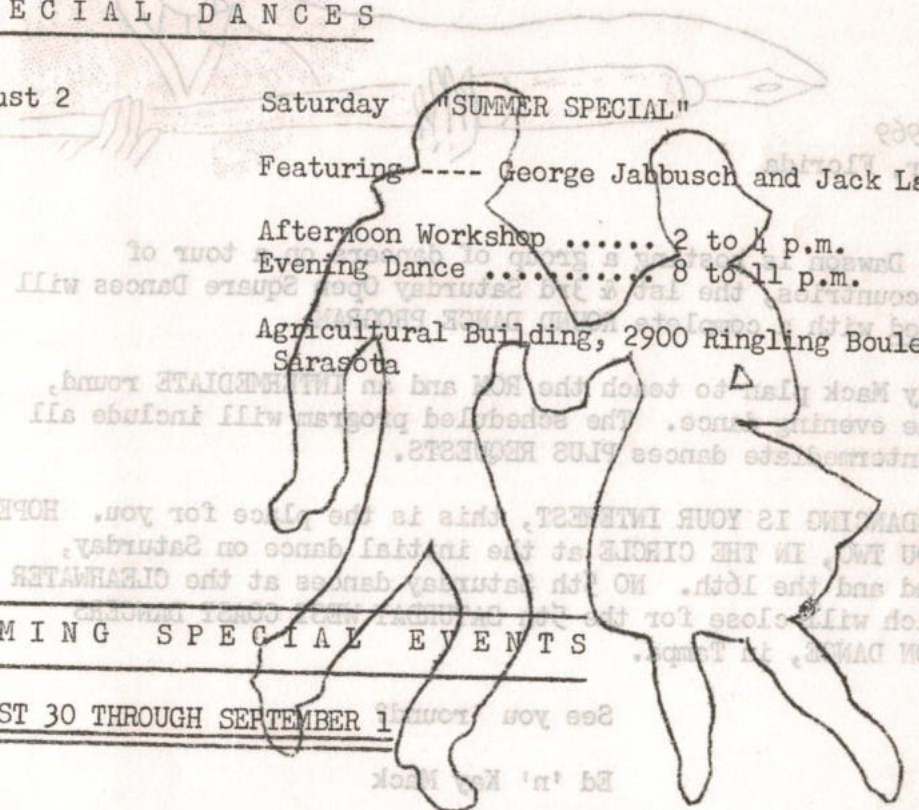
