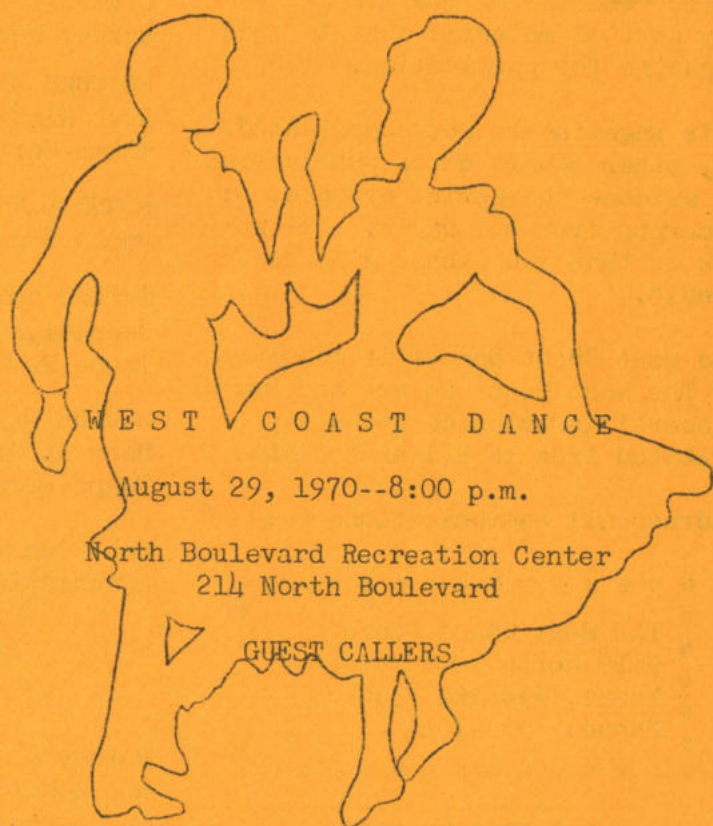

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

Dear Mr. Botts and all other square and round dance people:

There's the work involved in a successful club. It's always just a few that's willing to take on the responsibility of getting the special events and regular club work accomplished. Too many dancers want just the fun of dancing. Surely they realize a good dance doesn't just happen - its been planned, coordinated, etc. by someone, and that

"someone" isn't paid to do a job. The work is done by club members, active club members. Have you lately offered to help? Maybe just by making a few phone calls, on the refreshment committee, or club news. Sometimes it takes one person several phone calls to get a square together to go after a banner, or to set up a special event, or work with beginners, etc. Or, have you offered to go with some others on a visit to another club? This brings visitors to your own club, and visitors sometimes become members, if they enjoy themselves when they come to your club and are made to feel welcome. It should be everyone's private rule to personally welcome every visitor to your home club, and dance with them at least once during the evening. If everyone does this, this visitor just has to have a good time.

Then, there's the gripers. Do you voice your displeasure every time you dance with a poor dancer, or a caller calls a number you don't like? There's bound to be some bad with all the good, and you can set a mood by being pleasant and keeping silent when things don't go your way. Every dancer, and every caller, has bad nights, and sometimes a combination of these things can change the whole atmosphere whereas if you laugh off mistakes, and smile, pretty soon the right combination comes together and you're having such a good time you forget to gripe. Square dancing is such a fun sport - it's a shame we have just a few people that want to be grouchy and perfect. I personally have just as much fun in a square that breaks down once in a while and laughs about it as precision dancing where everyone is afraid to make a mistake.

And how many "teachers" have you run across? It's one thing to help a person out if they ask you, but quite another to tell them they did something wrong and proceed to tell them how to do it. That's not your right or privilege, and you won't make any friends doing so. Finally, do you do everything possible to make people want to dance with you? Are you pleasant and friendly? Do you refrain from talking when the caller is talking to the floor? During intermission, do you start conversations? Do you swing or twirl too hard? Do you flirt? Do you shower before each dance and wear a good deodorant? If your answers are appropriate people will want to dance with you, rather than avoid you. Square dancing is what we make it - if we go to have fun, are fun ourselves, we will have fun.

| 2 Sticks Oleo       | 1 C Water              |
| 4 T Cocoa "heaping" | 2 C Floor "regular"    |
| 2 C Sugar           | 1/2 C Dairy Sour Cream |
| 1 t Baking Soda     | 1 t Vanilla            |
| 2 Eggs              |                        |

In sauce pan put oleo, water and cocoa, heat until it boils, stirring all the time. Remove from stove and cool until lukewarm, then mix into flour, sugar and mix well, add sour cream, soda, eggs and vanilla, mix well. Bake in 13 x 9 1/2 x 2" pan at 375 degrees for 25 minutes or until cake shrinks from pan sides.

Peel egg plants and dice, cook until tender, drain. Add egg, barbecue sauce, garlic and parsley. Salt and pepper to egg plant, mix well. Slice tomatoes very thin. Grease 7 1/2 x 12" casserole with oleo. Place in casserole layers of egg plant mix and tomatoes ending with tomatoes. Blend bread crumbs and butter, sprinkle over top with the cheese. Bake 45 minutes at 325 degrees.
