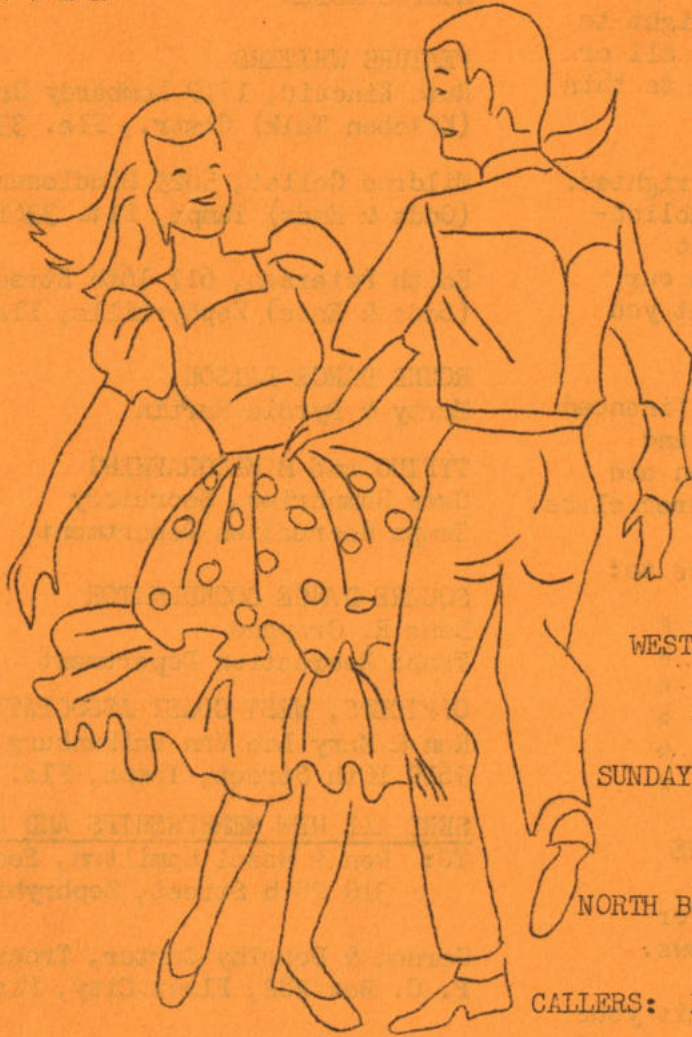

FROM THE EDITORS DESK:

Have you ever spent the night in pain so severe that a pill wouldn't touch it? Many square dancers have--not from dancing, but from thoughtless people who dance in the square. The person with arthritic hands suffers deeply when she (or he) meets a "SNATCH and GRAB-IT" coming around. True, the harsh grip and yank is often the result of excitement, nervousness, or just the uncertainty of being a new dancer. Remember the experienced and good dancer barely touches hands to indicate position, seldom more than a light, soft handclasp.

The 'Snatch and Grab-it' also causes pain in those with bursitis of elbow and shoulder. The "WHIRL-a-WAYS" (those men who WHIP a girl around in a single or double-handed spin) also cause a lot of sleepless nights with bad backs or twisted shoulders. 'Whirl-a-ways' love to spin and spin on a promenade, or WHIP the gals in a right and left grand.

Gentlemen, merely raise your arm if she wants to spin she will and you are ready to steady her. However, if she doesn't want to spin for a variety of reasons, she is able to continue dancing without a twisted wrist, shoulder or back.

POLENTA with CREAMED CHICKEN

3/4 C Yellow Cornmeal	2	C Milk
1 Egg	1/2	C Grated Parmesan Cheese
1 t Salt	1/8	t Pepper
2 T Salad Oil		
* * * * *		
1 T Butter	2	T Green Pepper
1 Can Cream of Celery Soupe	2	C Cubed Cooked Chicken
1/2 C Grated American Cheese	1/4	C Milk
4 T Chopped Pimento		

Combine cornmeal and milk in saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring often, until mixture thickens and comes to a boil. Boil 3 minutes. Remove from heat, beat in egg, stir in cheese, salt, pepper and oil. Spread in a 10 x 6 x 1 1/2" baking dish.

Saute green pepper in butter, add soup and remaining ingredients, heat until cheese melts, stirring frequently. Pour over cornmeal mixture. Bake at 375 degrees for 40 minutes, remove from oven and allow to stand 10 minutes before serving. "Serves 8" "Can be prepared a day ahead"
