KITCHEN TALK

NOTE: We are sorry to report that Ruth Kincaid is in the hospital again. Mildred Collet thoughtfully called in this recipe.

LOW CALORIE DIP

- 1 Cup Cottage Cheese (creamed)
- 1/4 Cup Buttermilk
- 1 teaspoon Italian Lo-cal Dressing Mix

Whip on highest speed until creamy, or use blender to cream.
 244 calories per cup or 15 calories per tablespoon.
 Skim milk may be used in place of buttermilk. Instead of spreading on crackers, use raw cucumber chips, crooked neck squash, celery or carrot sticks (or carrot curls).

CONFETTI SALAD BOWL

- 1 16 oz. can golden wax beans, drained
- 1 16 oz. can green beans, drained
- 1 2 1/2 oz. jar sliced mushrooms, drained
- 2/3 Cup chopped celery
- 1 17 oz. can sweet peas, drained
- 1 12 oz. can whole kernel corn with sweet peppers, drained
- 1/4 Cup sliced olives
- 2 Tablespoons chopped red onions
- Red onion rings - lettuce (hold these until last)

DRESSING:

- 2 teaspoons salt 2/3 Cup wine vinegar
- 1/4 Cup sugar 2/3 Cup salad oil

Combine all vegetables in large bowl (except lettuce and onion rings). Toss. Pour salad dressing evenly. Cover. Chill several hours or overnight, stirring occasionally. Serve in lettuce bed, garnish with red onion rings. Compliments of Isabell Ratliff.

A SQUARE DANCER LOOKS AT ROUND DANCING...Mildred Collet

Round dancing should, for most people, be relaxing and a pleasure. There are those who enjoy the more challenging rounds and it is interesting to watch them. At a square dance, everyone has a choice when there are 2 rounds between each square--dance one or both, or rest--the choice is yours. Florida round dance leaders are to be commended on their attitude toward the dancers. They want to bring us the most interesting and challenging material, yet they want to have as many couples on the floor as possible. This means much work on their part, selecting and learning the dances in order to teach and cue them. We are so lucky in the south-eastern area of the U.S. that our leaders cue almost all dances all the way through. In this way hundreds more participate in round dancing than if we had to memorize each and every round and dance without cues. In many parts of the U.S. dances are cued ONLY at the time they are taught. We found so called 'leaders' of the opinion.. "If the dancers are too lazy to memorize the dances, let them sit down." This is a direct quote to us at a square dance in the Los Angeles area. We pointed out that he had only 4 or 5 couples on the floor (out of 12 squares) when he didn't cue, yet there were 12 couples when he cued a round. In our opinion he was not a leader, merely a disk jockey who dropped the needle on the record. What a pleasure it is to everyone concerned - dancers and round dance leaders - that in Fla. especially, 12 squares will frequently bring 30 to 40 couples on the floor for most rounds and classics. RULES FOR BANNER STEALING

1. One square or more of club members wearing club badges must attend club's regular dance.
2. First club that has a full square by dance time shall be given the banner, the second shall be given an I.O.U.
3. There shall be only one banner available from each club for stealing.
4. Clubs who wish to participate in banner stealing shall announce so.
5. A club that steals a banner may hold it for 6 months and then must return it to the owner club.
6. A caller and tew attending as a dancer may participate in banner stealing as part of the eligible square.
7. A couple may not be counted as a guest if they are regular paid up members of the host club.
8. No club shall be entitled to another club's banner when said club regularly dances on the same night.
9. Club banner shall not travel outside of the West Coast Association area.
10. When your banner has been returned from the 1st club, you then take it to the next club that holds one of your I.O.U.'s: you may take it and then retrieve it the same night.
11. You can not secure your own banner and take theirs at the same time, no matter how many squares you bring.
12. Banners shall be handled with care and returned in the same condition. This will be the responsibility of the "Stealer." Under no circumstances shall any banner be defaced in any way. The stealer club is morally and financially responsible for the condition of said banner.

REMEMBER THAT SQUARE DANCING IS FOR FUN AND BANNER STEALING IS ONLY A MEANS BY WHICH WE MEET WITH NEW FRIENDS.
