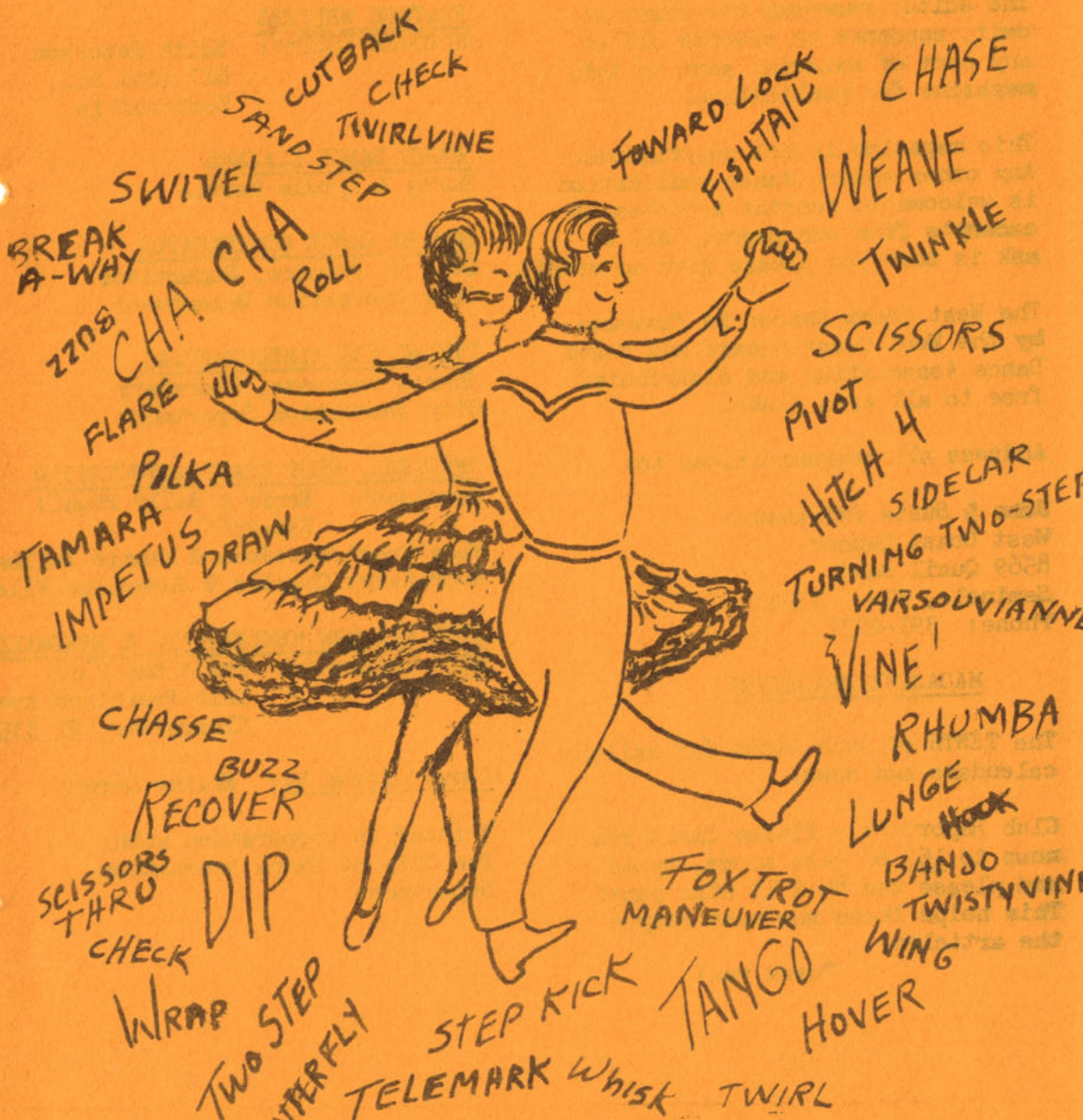

KITCHEN COLUMN

SURPRISE APPLE SLICESFilling

6 cups water  
 3 cups sugar  
 6 tsp. Cream of Tartar  
 2 tsp. lemon juice  
 72 whole Ritz Crackers  
 ½ cup raisins  
 Cinnamon  
 Butter or margarine

the Recipe

1½ cup water  
 ¾ cup sugar  
 1½ tsp. Cream of Tartar  
 ½ tsp. lemon juice  
 18 whole Ritz Crackers  
 1/8 cup raisins  
 Cinnamon  
 Butter or margarine

Crust

1½ cups sifted flour  
 1 tsp. baking powder  
 1½ tsp. salt  
 1½ cup shortening  
 2 eggs  
 ½ cup milk

Crust

1 1/8 cup sifted flour  
 ¼ tsp. baking powder  
 3/8 tsp salt  
 3/8 cup shortening  
 1 egg  
 1/8 cup milk

Filling:

Boil the water sugar and Cream of Tartar for two (2) minutes.  
 Add lemon juice and the Ritz crackers. Boil two (2) minutes longer.  
**DO NOT STIR, AS CRACKERS SHOULD STAY WHOLE**  
 Cool before putting into crust.

Crust:

Sift dry ingredients and cut in the shortening. Mix eggs and milk and mix into first ingredients. Take a little more than half the dough and roll to fit a 11 x 16" pan. Sprinkle ¼ cup of the raisins on bottom crust, put in the filling and sprinkle the balance of the raisins on top of filling. Dot with margarine and cinnamon. Roll out top crust, place on top and seal edges. Bake in a 400° oven for forty (40) minutes. While still warm ice with powdered sugar and milk mixture. Cool and cut into squares.
