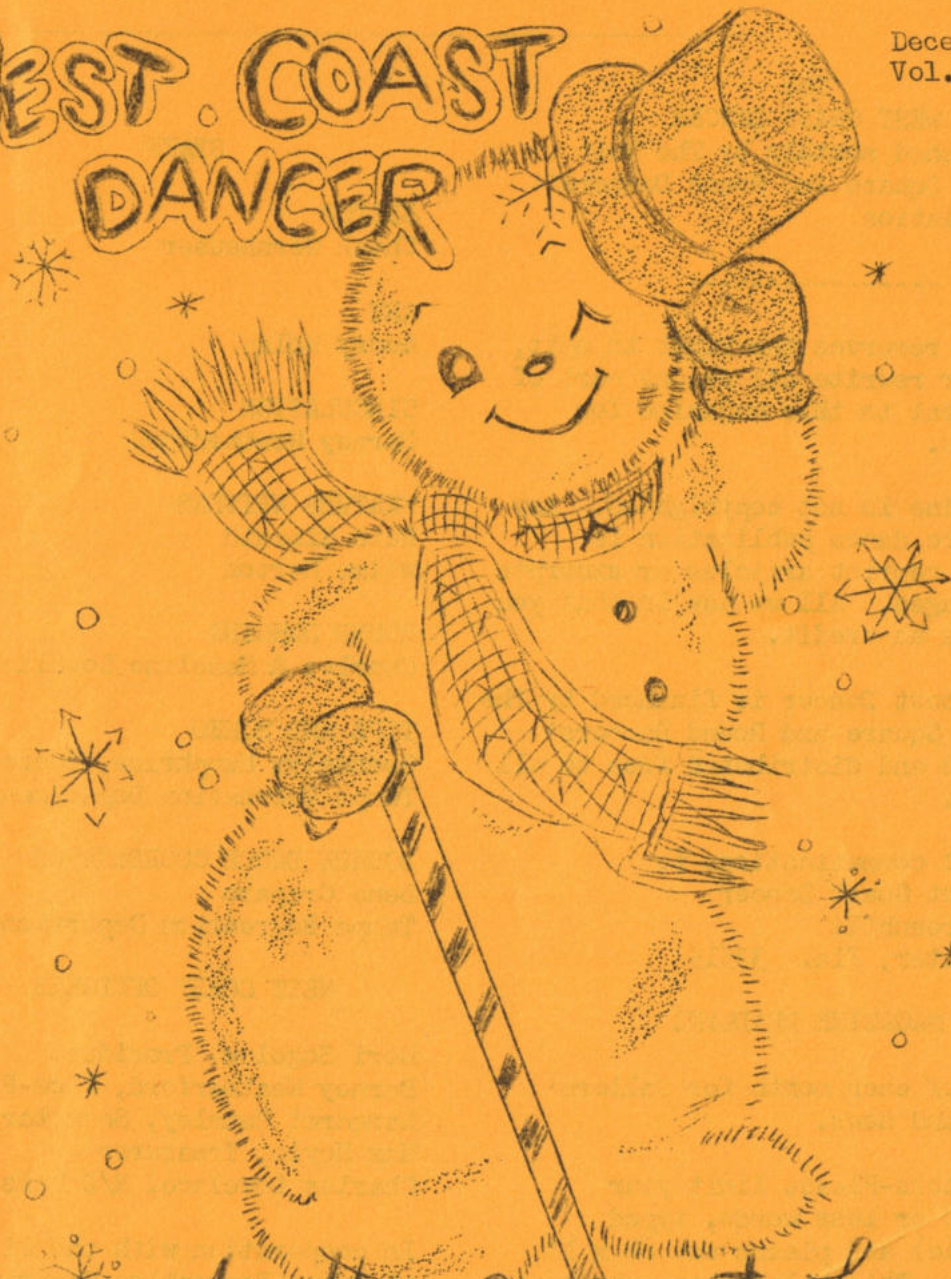

FROM THE EDITOR'S¹ DESK

In this issue, the second one to be published, you will, I hope, find some improvements which I have suggested.

First we will take off all Round Dance Clubs and Beginner classes and list them separately under appropriate headings. Bill and his wife Catherine are well known dancers in this area and I am sure that Bill will make a wonderful Editor. I have promised Bill that I will cooperate with him if he should ever need any assistance with the mechanical or printing problems.

I want to thank all of you who have cooperated in helping me to start this magazine and also the many who have wished me well and expressed their appreciation for the magazine.

TABLE TALK

Something "tasty" in a cake and a salad for the

HOLIDAY SEASON

HAWAIIAN PINEAPPLE CRUMBLE CAKE

½ C Crisco	1 C White Sugar
2 Egg yolks beaten	1 C Sweet Milk
2 t Baking Powder	1 t Vanilla
2 Egg whites beaten	1 C Walnuts chopped
2 C Graham Cracker crumbs	

Cream the crisco and sugar, add beaten egg yolks and blend, add milk, cracker crumbs, baking powder, walnuts and vanilla. Mix all together. Fold in beaten egg whites last. Pour into greased 9" x 12" x 2" pan and bake 35 minutes in 350 degree oven. Ten minutes before cake is done, cook 1 C white sugar and small can (6½ oz.) crushed pineapple on low heat for full ten minutes stirring constantly. Pour this mixture over cake when it comes from oven. Serve warm, also cold with cherry and whipped cream.

1 pkg. Lime Jello	1 pkg. Lemon Jello
2 C hot water	1 Qt. Vanilla Ice Cream
1 Can (15 oz.) crushed pineapple drained	
1 Can (16 oz.) Fruit Cocktail drained	
1 Jar (small) Red Cherries drained and chopped	
1 Jar (small) Green Cherries drained and chopped	

Dissolve jello in the hot water, add the ice cream and stir well, "will get thick" add the pineapple, fruit cocktail and the red and green cherries and mix and refrigerate. "DO NOT FREEZE"

Position: Intro: Open-facing. Dance: Butterfly.

Footwork: Opp. directors for Man

INTRODUCTION

Meas

- 1-4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, POINT, -; TOG (BFLY), TCH, -;
- 1-2 Wait 2 meas in Open facing M Diag facing wall;
3. Step apart L, point R twd ptr, hold;
4. Step tog R to Bfly, tch L, hold;

DANCE

- 1-4 CHG SIDES, 2,3; WALTZ FWD; CHG SIDES, 2,3; WALTZ FWD (W BJO);
1. From Bfly drop trailing hands M cross twd wall moving diag LOD behind W L,R,L (W crosses to inside moving fwd under raised lead hands diag LOD R,L,R) end in L OP facing LOD M on outside;
 2. Waltz fwd LOD;
 3. Chg hands to M's R & W's L M cross back twd COH moving diag LOD behind W L,R,L (W crosses twd wall moving diag in front of M R,L,R) end in OP facing LOD M on inside;
 4. M waltz fwd LOD as W turns $\frac{1}{2}$ LF to face RLOD to Bjo M facing LOD;
- 5-8 WALTZ FWD; TURN SCAR, 2,3; WALTZ FWD; WALTZ BWD (TO CP);
5. In Bjo waltz L, R,L in LOD (W bwd);
 6. M step fwd LOD R turning RF, step L, R almost in place continue turn to face RLOD (W steps bwd L turning RF, steps R, L almost in place) end in SCar;
 7. In SCar M waltz bwd LOD L,R,L (W fwd);
 8. Continue bwd waltz LOD blending to CP M facing RLOD;
- 9-12 (R) WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN (SCP);
- 9-12 Do 4 RF turning waltzes in Viennese style end in SCP facing LOD;

ROUND OF THE MONTH (Continued)

- 13-16 STEP, LIFT, -; TWKLE THRU; TWKLE THRU; TWKLE THRU (FACE);
 - 13. SCP facing LOD M step fwd L, lift R fwd tow slightly off floor, -;
 - 14. Step R thru & fwd LOD (W thru L), step L close beside R facing ptr, step R beside L a fast twinkle;
 - 15. Repeat twinkle step L thru RLOD (W thru R);
 - 16. Repeat twinkle step R thru LOD end facing ptr CP M facing wall;
- 17-20 WALTZ BAL (L); WALTZ BAL (R); VINE, 2, 3; THRU, SIDE, CLOSE;
 - 17. Waltz bal step swd L LOD, R behind L, L in place;
 - 18. Repeat waltz bal RLOD starting M's R;
 - 19. Vine step side LOD L, R XIB, side L (W XIB also);
 - 20. Step thru LOD R, side L, close R beside L to CP M face wall;
- 21-24 DIP BK, -,-; REC, -,-; DIP FWD, -,-; REC, -,-;
 - 21. M dip bk L COH (W fwd R) with slight dip, hold 2 cts;
 - 22. Recover fwd twd wall R, hold 2 cts;
 - 23. Dip fwd L twd wall (W bwd R), hold 2 cts;
 - 24. Recover bk R, hold 2 cts;
- 25-28 WALTZ BAL (L); WALTZ BAL (R); VINE, 2, 3; THRU, SIDE, CLOSE;
 - 25-28 REPEAT action of Meas 17-20;
- 29-32 DIP BK, -,-; REC, -,-; DIP FWD, -,-; REC, -,-;
 - 29-32 REPEAT action of Meas 21-24;

ENDING: Third time thru end meas 32 as follows: REC SWD, FWD, POINT, -;
 Recover on R stepping twd RLOD & turn to SCP face LOD, point L fwd, -.
