We all know the West Coast is the best place or why do we live, work and play here?

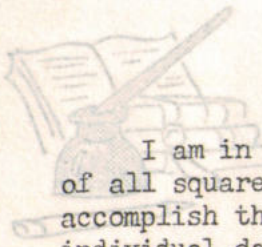
A big thanks to the Southeast Association leaders who gave us a boost and something to measure up to.

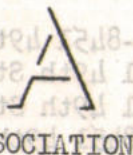
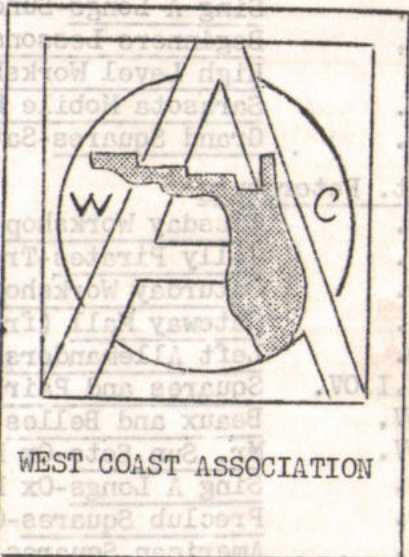
