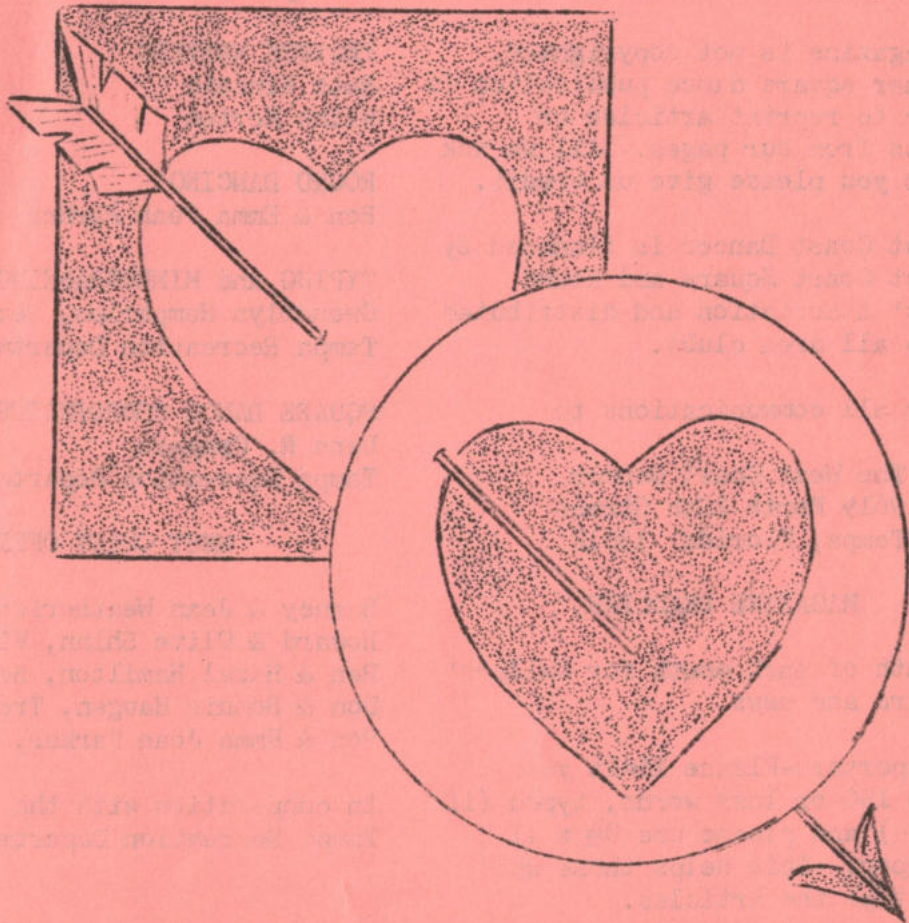

KITCHEN TALK

FROSTED CRANBERRY SQUARES

- 1 Can (13 1/2 oz.) or 1 2/3 C-Crushed Pineapple
- 1 Lemon Jello (6 oz.)
- 1 Ginger Ale (approx. 1-C.)
- 1 Can (2-C.) Jellied Cranberry Sauce
- 1 Pkg. (2 oz.) Dessert Topping Mix
- 1 Pkg. (8 oz.) Cream Cheese, "softened"
- 1/2 C Pecans Chopped

Drain pineapple, reserving syrup. Add water to syrup to make 1-C; heat till mixture is boiling. Dissolve gelatin in hot liquid; cool. Gently stir in ginger ale; chill till partially set. Meanwhile, blend drained pineapple and cranberry sauce; fold into gelatin mixture. Turn into 9 x 9 x 2 inch dish; chill till firm. Prepare dessert topping according to package directions. Fold in cream cheese; spread over gelatin. Toast pecans in 1-T. butter or margarine in moderate oven (350') about 10 minutes; sprinkle over top of salad. Chill. Makes 9 servings.

CARROT CAKE

- 2 C Flour
- 1 t Salt
- 1 1/2 C (Crisco Oil)
- 4 Eggs
- 1 (Flat Can) Crushed Pineapple
- 1/2 C Chopped Nuts
- 1 1/2 t Baking Soda
- 2 t Cinnamon
- 2 C Sugar
- 2 C Carrots (grated)

Sift flour and soda. Beat together salt, cinnamon, crisco oil, sugar and eggs, add sifted flour and soda to this mixture, add carrots, pineapple and nuts. Beat ingredients together, pour into flat pan 13 x 9 x 2 inch and bake at (350') for 35 to 40 minutes.
