## SQUARE DANCE MANNERS

I will introduce myself to at least one new couple at each dance.

I will not "sit out" a dance if one more couple is needed to fill a square.

I will serve on the refreshment committee or otherwise do my share of club duties, whenever asked.

I'll try to look like I'm having a good time while I square dance.

I'll have a pleasant word for the caller, and not ignore him until I have a complaint.

I won't glare at my corner if he makes a mistake--after all, I sometimes miss too.

If I feel like shouting to show my exuberance, I'll do it during a pause in the call, and not when it will drown out the caller.

I'll leave the instruction to the caller, and not try to explain the dance to my own square.

I'll remember that once upon a time I was a beginner, and be willing to dance with those who have had less experience than I have had.

LIMA BEAN & MUSHROOM CASSEROLE

classes will be held a little later will be Rob & Ginny Walker. Their party night will be February 15th at 8 P.M. at the New North American Campgrounds, located on Hwy. 19A. This is a camp for dancers. The best of luck to both of you.

- 1 Onion, coarsely chopped
- 6 T oleo or butter
- 2 (10 oz.) Pkgs., frozen lima beans
- 1 T sugar
- 1/2 t salt
- 1/4 t pepper
- 1 (8 oz.) can sliced mushrooms "drained"
- 1 T water
- 3 T flour
- 3 C light cream or milk
- 1/2 C dry sherry
- 2 Egg yolks slightly beaten
- 1/2 t salt
- 1/2 t pepper
- 1/2 C shredded mild American Cheese

Saute onion in 2 T oleo until limp; add beans cover and cook 5 minutes; add sugar, salt, pepper, mushrooms and water; cover and cook again until beans are tender.

Melt remaining oleo in separate pan; add flour and cook until bubbly; add cream and cook, stirring frequently until sauce begins to thicken. Remove from heat and add sherry, egg yolks, salt, and pepper. Combine with lima beans and mushrooms, pour into 1 1/2 qt. casserole and sprinkle shredded cheese over top. Bake 40 min. at 350 degrees.

Can be frozen: wrap in freezer paper and freeze. To serve bake 1 hour in 350 degree oven.

## NEWS RELEASE FROM NATIONAL SQUARE &amp; ROUND DANCE CONVENTION

Vaughn Parrish, Jerry Helt & Bob Van Antwerp will be conducting a free callers seminar and clinic. These will be all 3 days and at a time that will not interfere with calling duties. Mr. Heaton, who is the Associate Prof. of Rec. at the Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah will give some interesting classes. He has recruited some of his professors to help him. Mr. Heaton will give ideas on how to conduct square dance parties. What to do with extra girls, extra boys, etc. Many ideas on how to control large dance groups of all ages will be shown.

We also received a copy of Campgrounds available in Salt Lake City, including 2 Forest Campgrounds. I will try to have Al carry this in his wallet, so if you are interested in campgrounds, you can look it over, decide which one you would like to write to for reservations. The average cost of the private camps are \$4.00 or \$4.50 with all hook-ups.

The following is an article which is always timely - submitted by Mildred Collet.

Many dancers have requested a look at gimmick calls-why they are used and the problems they cause. Why: Some callers feel the dancers must have something new at every dance to keep up the interest. We find this is not true. Reworking a different position of a basic is often as challenging and much more versatile than a wild combination with a gimmick name that probably will never be called again or anywhere else. The 75 basics we all worked so hard to learn and perfect may be combined and cued by a clever and resourceful caller to make the BEST of dances. A caller can control the floor as well as a concert master controls the Philharmonic with as much satisfaction to himself and the dancers. It is true many basics started as a gimmick, but when called often and long enough became part of every callers repertoire, such as tea-cup chain, grand square and spin-chain thru. These are recognized by all dancers and reaction is automatic, but each can be cued and often are. PROBLEMS: A gimmick name unknown to some will flatten a floor at once. The only defense a dancer has is to LISTEN AND DON'T PANIC when the caller comes up with a new name such as Chinese Knot, which will turn out to be our old friend "all 8 suzy Q" when cued. Most callers know this and will cue a call thru. Another problem is that those who dance only once a week cannot possibly keep up with all the new calls. Thus many dancers are lost because they can't or don't care to dance so frequently. The relationship between caller and dancers is very close.
