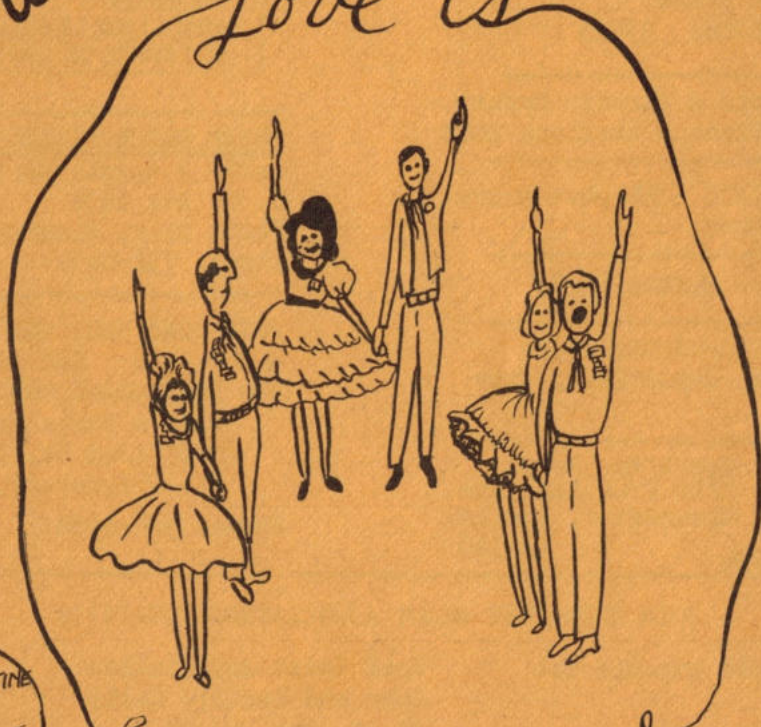
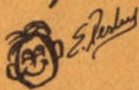

BAVARIAN CREAM

- 3 oz. pkg. red Jello
- ¼ Cup sugar
- 1 Cup boiling water
- 1 Cup cold water
- 1½ Cup Cool Whip



Dissolve jello & sugar in boiling water. Add cold water. Chill until slightly thickened. Blend 1½ cups Cool Whip into gelatin. Chill in 1 qt. or 6 to 8 individual molds until firm. Unmold and garnish. Serves 8. From the kitchen of Jean Fultz of Left Allamanders.

"BE IT RESOLVED that LEGACY go on record as being opposed to contests that pit dancer against dancer or caller against caller. LEGACY endorses the concept that square dancing is a cooperative and not a competitive activity."

Among other noteworthy accomplishments at the recent meeting was a resolution to encourage support of all youth groups who wish to engage in square dance activities. LEGACY went on record as recognizing the good work of Central Registry of World Dancers, (CROWD) and encourages public support of this group by square dancers everywhere.

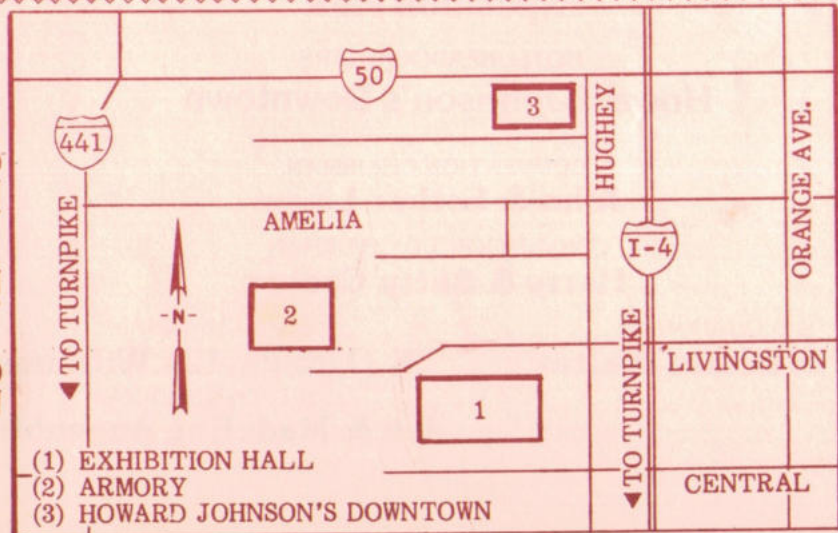

### SEWING HINTS

Making your own dresses for square dancing can be very satisfying and rewarding. Don't be deceived by looks-making a square dance dress is easy and simple if you plan your dress first. Two things to remember in making your skirts (1) no skirt should be less than six yards around the bottom and (2) a tiered skirt should have no less than two yards in the top tier. The over all effect of your outfit is most important. You need only to sit out on the sidelines one tip to discover how important the accessories you wear under your dress is to the whole picture. The best investment a new dancer can make is to purchase good dance shoes, a bouffant petticoat and lacy pettipants. (White is a good basic first choice.) You will probably prefer making your own dresses--have much more for less--and not worry about meeting yourself on the dance floor!

No doubt your first question upon deciding to make your new square dance dress will be, "Where do I find square dance dress patterns?" Any basic dress bodice pattern that fits well can be used. There are three basic patterns that you can use most of the time. They are: Simplicity #8875 and #9064 and McCall's #2786. Use only the bodice pattern. By using neckline variations or different sleeves you can do about anything you like to a basic pattern. To make a sleeveless dress, substitute any armhole facing pattern from another Simplicity pattern you already have as all Simplicity patterns are interchangeable.

It will take about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  yards of material to make a dress with sleeves and a tiered skirt. Less to make a sleeveless, gored skirt dress. A good rule to remember is 1 yard of material for a sleeveless bodice or  $1\frac{1}{2}$  yards for a sleeved bodice then add the yardage needed to the particular skirt you choose. The type of material will determine what style dress you will make. Heavy materials are for circle or gored skirts with no sleeves while the lighter cottons can be used for tiered skirts and with sleeves. The most important thing to remember when buying material is that it be perma-press as ironing a square dance dress is nothing short of torture!!!

Trimming a square dance dress is your chance to be creative--anything goes from the simplest ric-rack to the most elaborate laces. Lay out the trim on the material to achieve the look you want. Some fabrics do not need trim--the material itself is enough. Be your own judge for this is where your dress becomes you! Trims can be the most expensive item of your dress but this need not be so as the smart dancer watches for trim bargains and many times buys trim when she finds it without even having a piece of dress material to put it on. You can send 25¢ to Home-Sew., Inc., Bethlehem, Pa. 18018 for their catalog and sample card. This is a very reasonable outlet that is frequently used by dancers that make their own dresses.

Now to the dress. Make your bodice first, fitting it completely before attaching it to the skirt. Attaching the skirt to the bodice is the most difficult of all the fitting problems. Full skirts are so heavy they tend to pull the bodice down and cause an uneven or too low waistline. First, baste the skirt on the bodice and try on the dress. Pull a string around your natural waist and mark with chalk if the waist line is uneven then rebaste the skirt along this line before the final stitching. Make two rows of final stitching about  $1/8$ " apart to reinforce the waist line. Skirts should be about knee length. Be sure to have your petticoat on when taking the measurement of your hem.

In the March '77 issue of the Dancer we listed the Callerlab Mainstream list of 68 calls, the +1 list of 12 movements and the +2 list, which make up the Mainstream program. At that time we promised to go into the advanced program when it became effective.

At the Kansas City meeting of Callerlab in April of '77 a resolution was passed as follows: Be it resolved that Callerlab recognizes the existence of three levels of dancing above Mainstream Plus Level, and that these levels are named: Advanced Level, Basic Challenge Level and Extended Challenge Level. This represents a further attempt by Callerlab to standardize square dancing into a series of levels which will serve to categorize clubs throughout the country according to dancing proficiency. For now we are interested only in presenting the 56 calls above Mainstream +2 which make up the Advanced Level and are designed to impart a basic knowledge of high frequency material.
