I remember when we first started taking square dance lessons, the first lesson usually learning to listen to the teacher. We listened, also to the Angels (Bless 'em all) as they mentioned during the breaks about Festivals, State Conventions and National Conventions and some of the exotic places they had danced, in Texas, the Carolinas, Missouri, Colorado and when they mentioned Florida the name Ox-Bow was spoken with almost reverence and was revered as almost likened to a visit to Mecca. Who had dance with whom, the names that were written on those hallowed walls, it was just the In Place to visit when in Florida. We did experience one unhappy time when the couple who had taken lessons with us made a trip to Florida and announced that they had danced at the Ox-Bow. Finally we did have to opportunity to visit this hallowed place. Hate to admit it but we were a little dissappointed, was not as large as we imagined and the parking not as spacious as we were led to believe. A mutual friend took us and introduced us around, we enjoyed the event and felt that we had indeed arrived.
