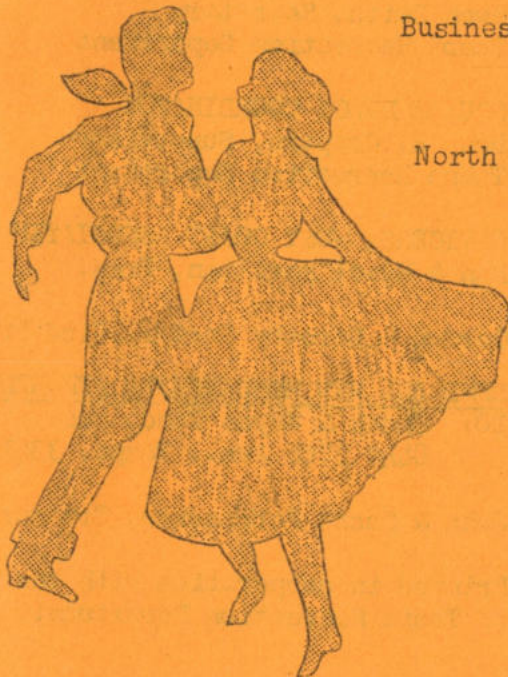

KITCHEN TALK

FROSTY STRAWBERRY SQUARES

- 1/4 C sifted flour
- 3/4 C chopped pecans
- 1/2 C brown sugar
- 3/4 C melted butter

Stir together and spread evenly in 13 x 9 x 2" pan. Bake 20 minutes at 350 degrees until brown, stirring occasionally. Remove from pan, cool and break into small pieces or crumbs.

- 3 egg whites unbeaten
- 2/3 c white sugar
- 1 10 oz. pkg. strawberries partially thawed and (undrained)
- 1 T lemon juice
- 1 qt. cool whip

Combine all ingredients in bowl except cool whip and beat 10 minutes to stiff peaks. Fold in cool whip. Sprinkle 2/3 of crumbs in 13 x 9 x 2" pan and spoon mixture over crumbs. Sprinkle remaining crumbs over top. Freeze several hours. Serves 12.

STRAWBERRY NUT SALAD

- 2 pkgs. strawberry jello
- 1 C boiling water
- 2 10 oz. pkgs. frozen strawberries halves
- 1 C chopped nuts
- 1 1 lb. can pineapple crushed
- 1 pt. sour cream
- 3 medium bananas (mashed)

Dissolve jello in boiling water. Fold in strawberries and a mixture of pineapple, bananas and nuts into jello.

Pour 1/2 of the mixture into 12" x 8" dish and chill until firm. Spread sour cream over firm mixture and pour the other half of the mixture over the sour cream. Chill until firm. Refrigerate until ready to serve.
