KITCHEN COLUMN

The following is a favorite recipe around our house if you are looking for a change from cakes and pies for dessert.

English "Triflo"

| | |
|--|-------------------------------|
| Large box of flavored jello | Large jar of fruits for salad |
| Large box of vanilla pudding (not instant) | Whipped cream |
| Package of lady fingers | |

Make the jello according to directions. In the bottom of a large bowl, place the lady fingers, and pour the jello over the top. Refrigerate until hard, drain the fruit, and place on top of jello. Cook pudding according to directions. Place in refrigerator until hard. Serve with whipped cream. This makes a large bowl, so you may want to make less and use the small box of jello. (You pour the pudding on top of the fruit and jello.)

Kiss Torte

4 egg whites beat until real stiff, add 1 cup sugar slowly. Beat hard until it looks satiny. Add a pinch of salt, 1 teaspoon of vanilla, 3/4 teaspoon of vinegar. Line a loose bottom pie tin with heavy wax paper, then butter paper. Heat oven to 300°. Leave at this temp until torte puffs and browns slightly. Then turn to low (200-225), leave one hour. Cool and serve with ice cream and fruit in season such as strawberries, peaches, etc.
