ROUND DANCING
by Earl and Marge Bagwell

Round Dance can be described as consisting of many things. We think first of fun, friendship, and fellowship among people who have a common interest in the love of music and dancing.

In the late 1930s, the dance leaders in this country foresaw the need for a modern square and round dance program. A dance program was conceived at that time and from that theory emerged the modern western square dance and American round dance. The heritage of the dance basics and dance routines, many from the great halls of Europe, were incorporated in the new basics and dance routines written to more modern music. Since that time modifications have been made to develop the great and wonderful dance program that we know today.

Across this country and, indeed throughout the world, the Western Square Dance and American Round Dance has had phenomenal popularity and growth until today the total dance program is highly organized and somewhat sophisticated. The development of Square and Round Dance Associations throughout all states provide at local club levels the professional leadership provided at national level. In some parts of the country you find square dance clubs that do not round dance. In other parts of the country you find dance clubs that do not square dance. This is due in part to the lack of leadership in specific areas. The most successful club programs are those that offer both square and round dancing for the enjoyment of all dancers.

The round dance part of the total dance program can be described as follows:

1. A round dance is a couple dance in which all dancers are doing the same steps at the same time in a circle around the floor. A set pattern of figures, taken from folk and ballroom basics, is matched to each phrase of the musical melody.
2. Each round dance has a specific sequence, which is cued and danced exactly the same wherever it is danced.
3. The movements of the basics agree with the number of beats of music in the measure of music, whether it is a two-step, waltz, etc.
4. A series of basics are put together to form a pattern and is called a sequence. The sequence agrees with the phrasing of the music. Consequently, the round dance is perfectly timed to the music throughout the dance.

MOST OF ALL, AS ALL DANCERS KNOW, THE MOST IMPORTANT INGREDIENT IS FRIENDSHIP AND FELLOWSHIP THE DANCE PROGRAM PROMOTES. Dancing is healthy, a great physical fitness program, stimulating both physically and mentally.

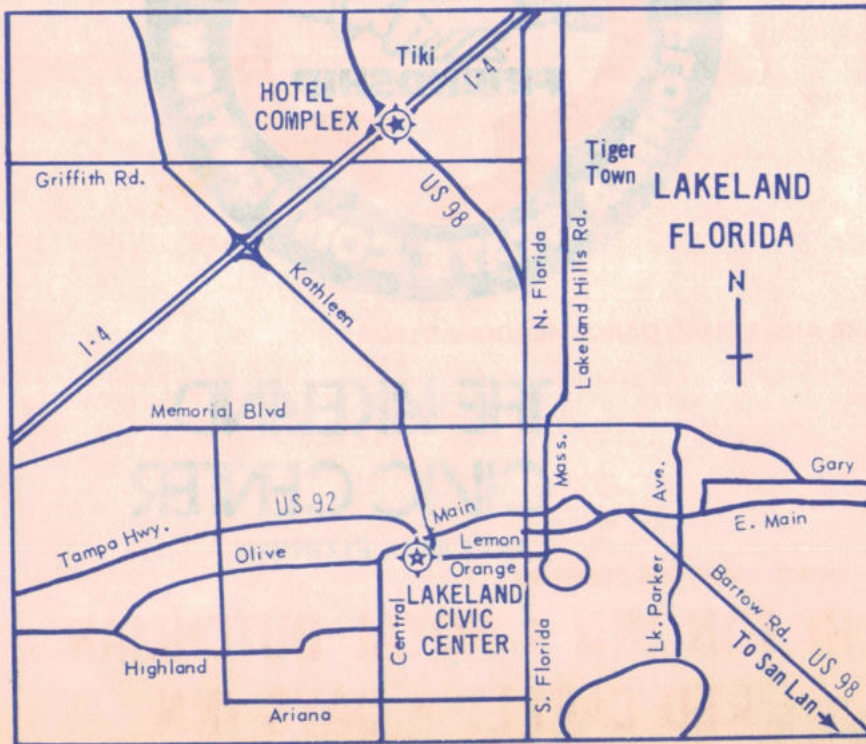

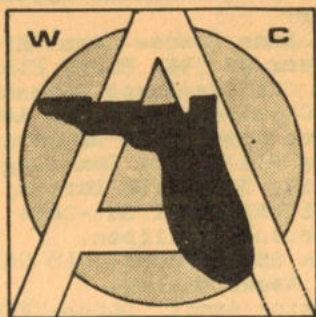
