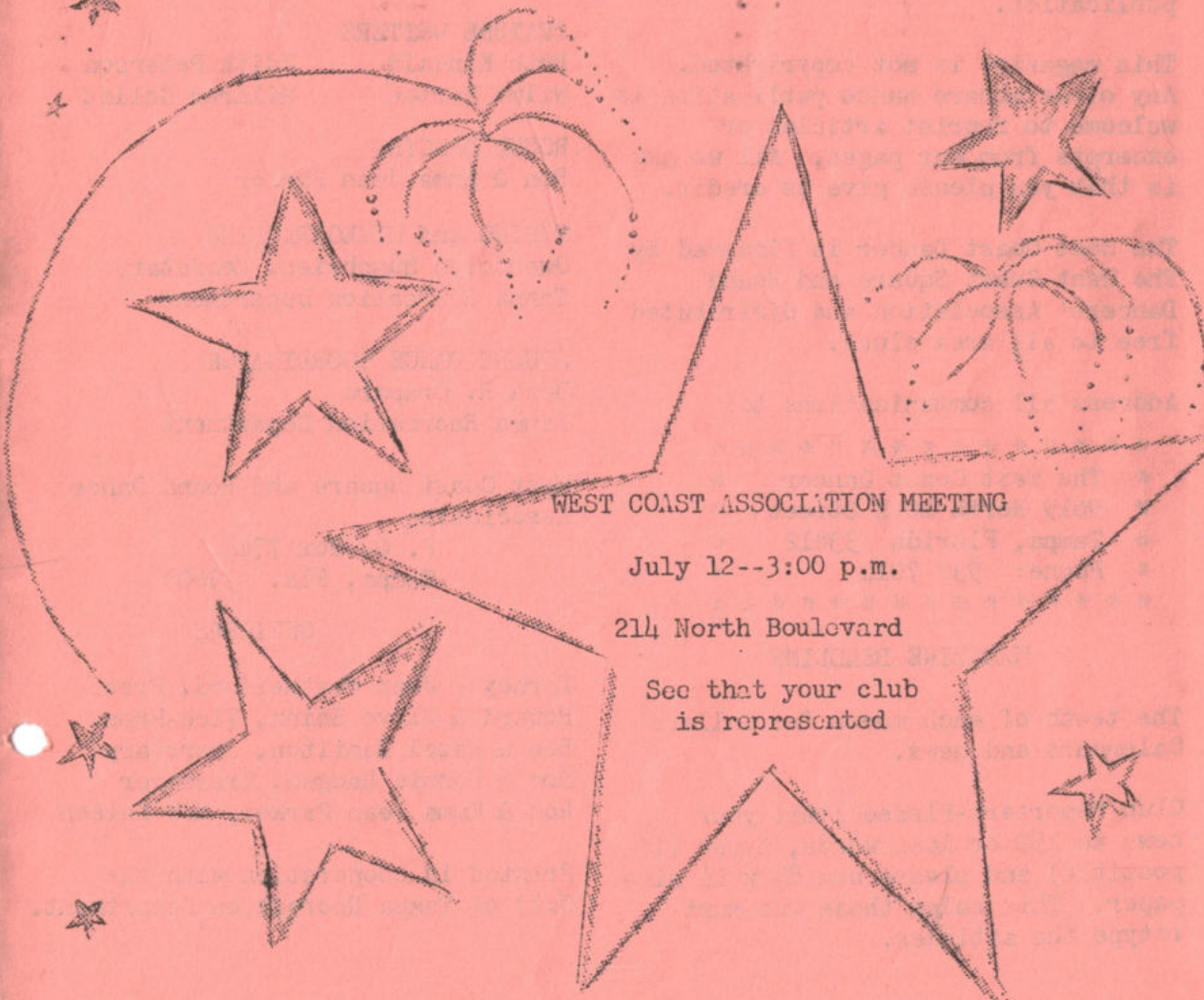

# KITCHEN TALK

## APOLOGIES

I "GOOFED" in the June issue "CHERRY SALAD SUPREME." Blend the salad dressing and the cream cheese and add to the lemon jello. So "SORRY."

### ICE CREAM SANDWICH

- 3 C Rice Krispies (Cocoa Krispies if you like)
- 1/2 C Brown Sugar (1/3-C if Cocoa Krispies used)
- 1/2 C Butter (melted)
- 1 C Angle Flake Coconut
- 1 C Nuts (If desired)
- 1/2 Gal. Ice Cream not too soft firm enough to slice.

Mix above five ingredients, spread half of mixture in 9 x 2 x 13" pan lined with wax paper with the paper extending sufficiently over the ends to be used to remove mixture from pan, place in refrigerator for about five minutes to harden. Slice ice cream in to even slices and place atop of mix in pan. Cover with remaining mix and freeze for about three hours. When ready to serve remove from refrigerator and lift from pan and place on cutting board for cutting for serving. Makes 12 large servings.

Starting Positions: Open-Facing for Intro, Semi-Closed facing LOD for Dance

INTRO

- (1) WAIT; (2) WAIT; (3) APART,-, POINT,-; (4) TOGETHER (to SCP),-, TOUCH,-;
- 1-2 In Open-Facing pos M's R hand & W's L joined (M facing wall) wait 2 meas;
- 3 Step away from partner on L, hold 1 ct, Point R twd partner, hold 1 ct;
- 4 Step together on R blending to Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct, touch L to R, hold 1 ct;

DANCE

- (1) (SCP) F W D TWO-STEP; (2) F W D TWO-STEP; (3) (CP) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, CLOSE; (4) (SCP) WALK,-,2,-;
- 1-2 In Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;
- 3 Face partner in loose Closed pos and step swd LOD on L, quickly close R to L, swd again on L, again quickly close R and start blend to SCP;
- 4 In Semi-Closed pos walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L,-,R,-(blend to CP);
- (5) SIDE,-,BEHIND,-; (6) SIDE,CLOSE,SIDE,-; (7) (R LOD) SIDE,-,BEHIND,-;
- (8) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE,-;
- 5 In loose Closed pos step swd LOD on L,-, cross R in back of L (both XIB),-;
- 6 Swd LOD on L, quickly close R to L, swd L, hold 1 ct;
- 7 Swd RLOD on R,-, cross L behind R (both XIB),-;
- 8 Swd RLOD on R, quickly close L to R, swd R, hold 1 ct;
- (9) (SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; (10) FWD TWO-STEP; (11) (CP) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, CLOSE; (12) (SCP) WALK,-,2,-;
- 9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;
