TABLE TALK

by RUTH KINCAID

TUNA STUFFED CABBAGE

- 8 large cabbage leaves
- 1/4 C chopped onion
- 1 C cooked rice
- 1 T prepared mustard
- 2 Cans (6 1/2 to 7 oz.) tuna in vegetable oil
- 1 Egg well beaten
- 2 Cans (8-oz. each) tomato sauce
- 1 C sour cream
- 2 T oleo
- 1/2 C chopped celery
- 2 T dried parsley

Cook cabbage leaves in small amount of boiling water "SALTED" about 4 minutes. Drain and dry on paper towel. Heat butter in skillet, add onion and celery. Saute until tender, add tuna, rice, mustard, parsley flakes and egg. Stir well to combine. Divide tuna mixture on 8 cabbage leaves roll up and tuck in ends, fasten with toothpicks.

PINEAPPLE REFRIGERATOR CAKE

- 2 sticks butter
- 4 eggs
- 1 can (small) crushed pineapple
- 1 pkg. vanilla wafers
- 1 box powdered sugar
- 1 t vanilla
- 1 C chopped nuts

Cream butter, add sugar and cream again. Add eggs one at a time, beat well after each addition. Add well drained pineapple and flavoring. Put in dish in alternate layers; vanilla wafers first then mixture and a sprinkle of nuts. Repeat until all ingredients exhausted. Refrigerate 24 hours before serving.
