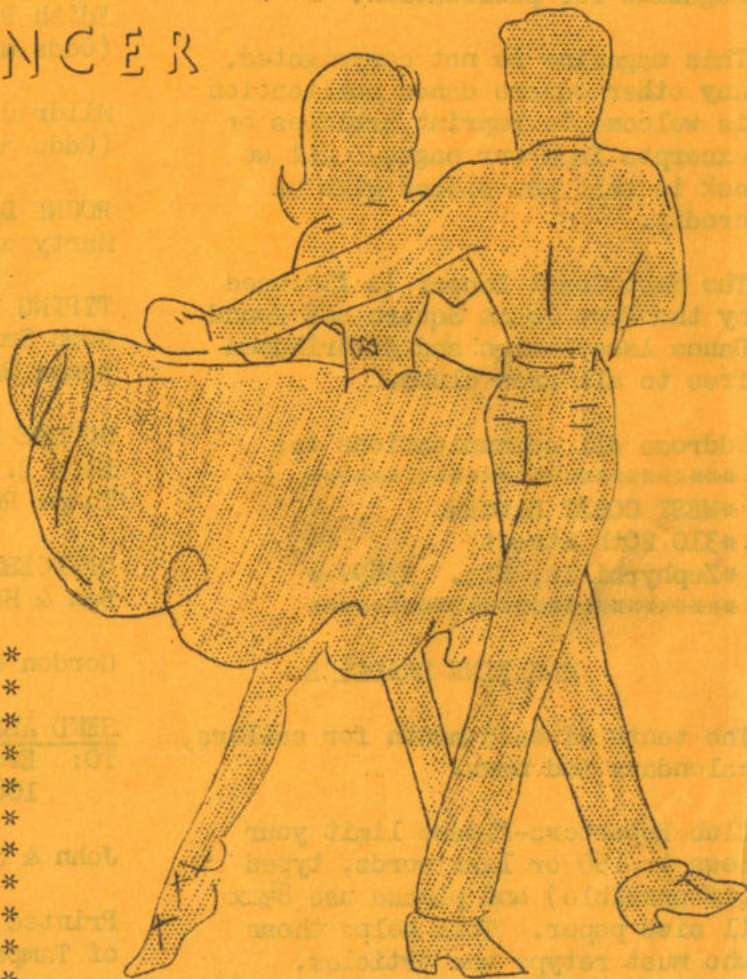

We'd like to share with our readers this communique from Frank P. Fritz of Holiday, Fla. taken from the May, 1971 issue of Sets-in-Order:

"In keeping with your "Free-for-All" theme, and in answer to the question, "What is square dancing?" my Number One Son, a Ph.D candidate at Ball State University at Muncie, In. came up with this explanation---

Square dancing is a modern (?), international, mental and physical outlet, performed by heterosexual groups of eight of any age, from 9 to 90, executing rhythmical, geometrical, choreographical formations in a specified area called a square, to the vocal (though not always melodious) commands of a trained director addressed as the Caller, and timed to "live" or recorded, toe-tapping, exhilarating, hoedown or country music.*

BUT, simply stated, square dancing IS great fun!

ALSO:

IF THE SHOE FITS

Tonight's the night: I can hardly wait!
It's square dance time when the clock strikes eight.
I'll choose my dress, his shirt and pants;
We'll grab our shoes and get ready to dance.
If I'm not careful and watch what I do
I always seem to grab the wrong shoe.
My old clod hoppers are used with a plow,
So I must be careful--not dance like a cow.
So push a plow, but not this girl,
And watch it bussy, give a gentle twirl.
Now track shoes are fine when you're running the mile;
But take shorter steps and I'm sure to smile.
Have you ever heard of an old horse shoe?
They help pull a wagon and it takes more than two.
But we're not horses so watch what you do;
If you give a pull, then I'm all through.
Now no one ever learned to dance by force,
By pulling, shoving and acting like a horse. So smile at me if
I seem new, And PLEASE, JUST WEAR A SQUARE DANCE SHOE!!

WHAT IS A SQUARE DANCER

Between the zeal of a religious fanatic and the relaxed attitude of an outright "kook" we find a delightful creature called a square dancer. Square dancers come in an awesome array of colors, sizes, shapes and forms, but all enjoy the same creed; to enjoy every step of every dance and to protest with wis-tful sighs when the dance is over.

Square dancers are found everywhere -- swinging partners, facing corners, passing thru, do-si-do-ing, turning back and boxing fleas. Callers love them, stuffed shirts hate them, neighbors tolerate them but NOBODY can ignore them. A sq-uare dancer is Fun with sweat on its face; Pride with a blister on its toe; Joy with rythm in its step and Beauty with ric rac on its skirt. * * *

When he is dancing, a square dancer can be a perplexi-ng, paradoxical problem child. When you want him to make a good impression he turns into a stumbling, left-footed oaf who can;t do an allemande left and seems bent on setting square dancing back a hundred years.

A square dancer is a composite with the stamina of a bull, the grace of a gazelle, the balance of a tightrope walker, the appetite of a razor-back, the lungs of a mule skinner, the temper of a tiger, the energy of a ten year old, and reacts to square dance music like a teenager reacts to the Beatles. He likes western clothes, comfortable shoes, country music, good accoustics, other square dancers, air conditioning, patter calls, good callers and allemande left. He dislikes stuffy people, sticky dance floors, corns, busted squares, mumbling callers, sore feet and the end of a good dance.

Nobody is so quick to get up on a dance floor; so reluctant to leave. Nobody else gets so much fun out of wearing himself out and coming right back for more. Age can dim his vision but not his enthusiasm for square dancing. Don't try to change him; he may be a bank president but on the dance floor he is just another guy named Joe. And almost everyone of his weighty everyday problems is shoved in the background as he responds to the cry of the caller - "One more couple over there."

"A stitch in time saves nine. . . When somehow, from a burn or tear, you end up with a hole in your square dance dress, try sewing an applique over the hole to cover it up. You can purchase these appliques in all designs and sizes in almost every department store. You could sew more than one on to make a pattern and match up the hole."

To eliminate frayed trouser cuffs at the back where the pants rub against the shoe, you can do this" Put a matching color iron-on tape on the inside of the trouser leg. Your shoe will rub against this instead of the pants.

Ruffle Pettipants

Use McCalls Pajama Pattern #8844 one size larger than normal (or any pajama pattern that does not have a side seam.

1 1/2 yds. of soft washable material; 15-20 yds. lace-1" to 1 1/2" wide or wider; narrow elastic for waist; elastic thread.

1. Cut out pattern, make necessary alterations, from crotch to waist, length of legs, etc.
2. Hem bottom of legs with narrow hem.
3. With ruler measure up and mark with pencil a line every 1" or more, depending on width of lace, to approximately 4" above crotch.
4. Sew lace on these lines starting on the narrow hem. The bottom of each row of lace should just overlap the top or stitching of the row below.
5. With elastic thread on bobbin and using longest stitch, sew 2 rows of stitching close together just above or evenly spaced between lace.
6. Sew backs together, then fronts, then crotch.
7. Turn over top, make casing, run rubber through.

This pattern is also very nice without the lace, just add a row or two of self ruffling and proceed with elastic thread. Can be made to any length and very comfortable.

**** KITCHEN TALK ****

OATMEAL CAKE

Pour 1 1/2 cups boiling water over 1 cup quick oats. Let stand 20 minutes, add 3/4 cup raisins (optional)

Cream 1/2 cup oleo (1 stick)

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup granulated sugar

Add 2 eggs, oatmeal and raisins

Sift in: 1 1/3 cups flour

1 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 tsp. soda

1/2 tsp. nutmeg

1/2 tsp. salt

Mix well, bake in long pan at 350° 30 - 35 minutes.

Topping:

Make while cake bakes.

Combine in sauce pan and bring to boil:

1/2 stick oleo

1/4 cup evaporated milk
