

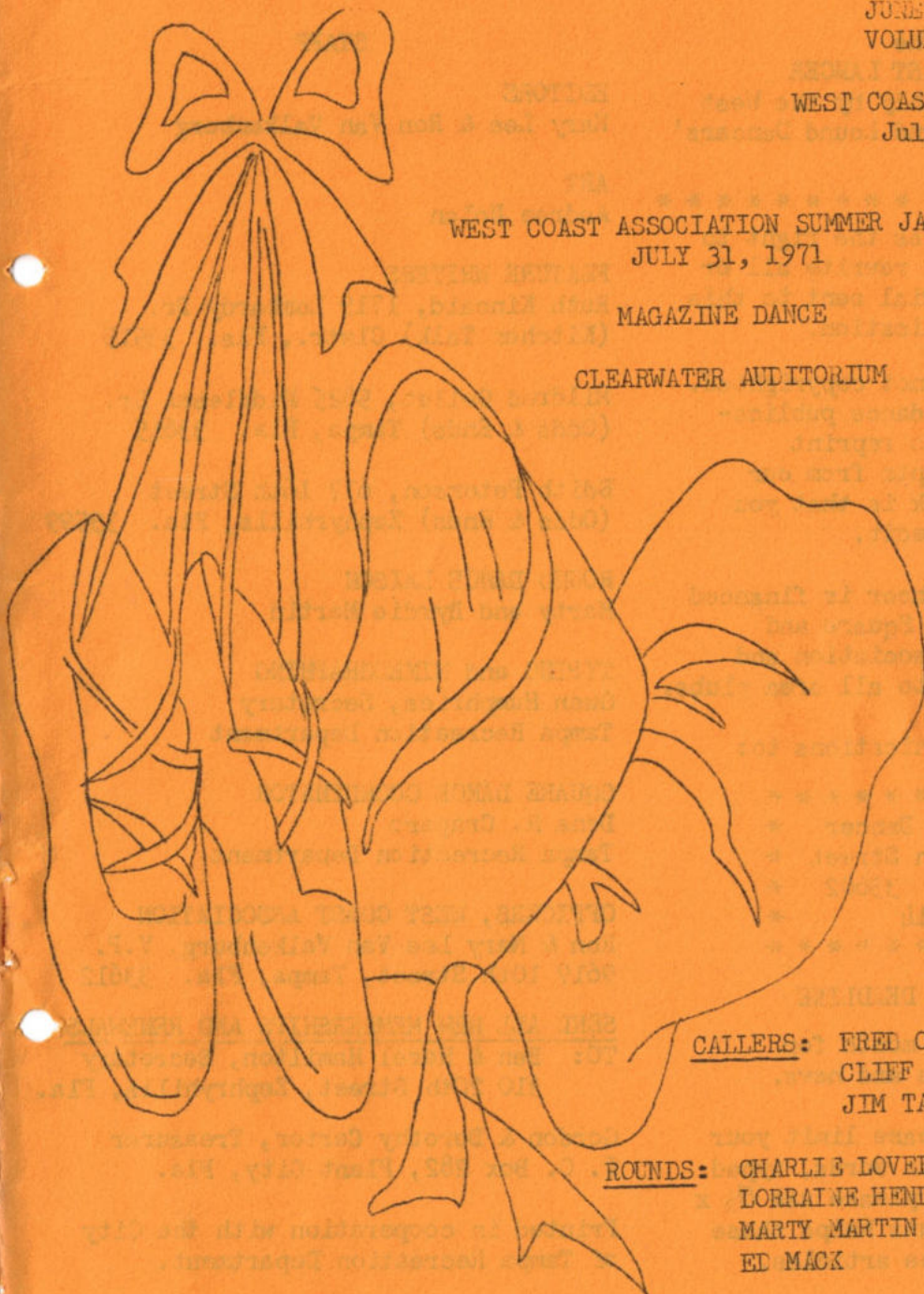

TABLE TALK

RING-of-COCONUT FUDGE CAKE

- 2 C Sugar
- 1 C Cooking Oil
- 2 Eggs
- 3 C All Purpose Flour
- 3/4 C Unsweetened Cocoa
- 2 t Baking Soda
- 2 t Baking Powder
- 1 1/2 t Salt
- 1 C Hot Coffee or Water
- 1 C Buttermilk or Sour
- 1 t Vanilla
- 1/2 C Chopped Nuts

- FILLING:
- 1/4 C Sugar
 - 1 t Vanilla
 - 1 Pkg. (8 oz.) Cream Cheese Softened
 - 1 Egg
 - 1/2 C Flaked Coconut
 - 1 C (6 oz. Pkg.) Semi-sweet or Milk Chocolate Pieces

Generously grease and lightly flour a 10" tube or Bundt pan. PREPARE FILLING. Set aside. It is unnecessary to sift flour, lightly spoon into cup and level off.

In large mixer bowl, combine sugar, oil and eggs. Beat 1 minute at high speed. - Add remaining ingredients except filling; beat 3 minutes at medium speed, scraping bowl occasionally.

By hand, stir in nuts. Pour 1/2 batter into prepared pan. Carefully spoon prepared filling over batter; top with remaining batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 70 to 75 minutes until top springs back when touched lightly in center.

Cool upright in pan for 15 minutes. Remove from pan. Cool completely. Glaze with glaze made by combining 1 cup powdered sugar, 3 tablespoons cocoa, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 teaspoons vanilla and 1 to 3 tablespoons hot water.

FILLING: In small mixer bowl, beat sugar, vanilla, cream cheese and egg until smooth. Stir in coconut and chocolate pieces.

BANNER STEALING RULES

We have been asked to put some banner stealing rules into the West Coast Dancer. There seems to be no set rules for the West Coast Association so we have asked several people to submit samples of which we have taken what seemed to be the best of all the rules which are printed below. We would like to hear from the different clubs on how they feel about these. If there are any changes or what ever, let us know so we may come up with banner stealing rules that can be voted to be used by the clubs in the West Coast Association.

Here are the examples:

1. Banners are not to be reserved for any visiting club.
2. Banners to be taken by the visiting club with first full square attending.
3. Dual memberships are common in the area; therefore, it will be left up to the dancer involved to elect which of the clubs he will represent on any given night or visit. The badge of the club he intends to represent should be worn.
4. In order to steal a banner, one or more squares shall attend the club for the evening.
5. All clubs should have but one banner to be stolen.
6. In cases where there are more than one club competing to steal the banner, the club traveling the most distance should have the banner or the flipping of a coin could determine which one.
7. A club can steal a banner or retrieve a banner on a visit to a club, but not both at the same time, it takes a visit to steal and a visit to retrieve.
8. A period of at least 3 club dances should pass before the same club steals that clubs banner again.
9. If you are going to be a thief, be a good one and abide by the rules (if adopted by the association). What is fair for the one club should be fair for all clubs participating in the art of being a good thief or banner stealer.
