A good number of the ladies attending the very popular Wednesday night Seminole dance asked Carlie Taber for the recipe for her Oatmeal Cookies-- so here it is for all who wish to try.

## OATMEAL COOKIES

- |                                       |   |
|---------------------------------------|---|
| 1 pkg. yellow cake mix (about 18 oz.) | $\frac{1}{4}$ C orange juice (or water) |
| 2 C "quick or regular" oats uncooked  | 2 eggs                                  |
| 1 t nutmeg                            | 2 T salad oil                           |
| 1 t cinnamon                          | 1 C raisins                             |
| 1 t ginger                            | 1 C chopped nuts                        |
| $\frac{1}{2}$ C unsulphered molasses  |   |

In a large bowl mix yellow cake mix, oats and spices. Add molasses, orange juice, eggs and salad oil; mix well. Stir in raisins and nuts. Drop by heaping teaspoons unto greased baking sheet. Bake in 370 degree oven for 12 to 15 minutes. Makes about 4 dozen.

This is a molasses mixture; so watch that cookies do not burn before they are completely cooked.

| $\frac{1}{2}$ large pkgs. cream cheese    | 1 onion (small chopped fine)     |
| $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. bleu cheese             | $\frac{1}{2}$ T worchestershire  |
| $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Kraft old english grate | $\frac{1}{4}$ C nuts fine ground |

Mix all together until smooth--use hands. Shape into balls, chill overnight. Roll balls into remaining nuts.
