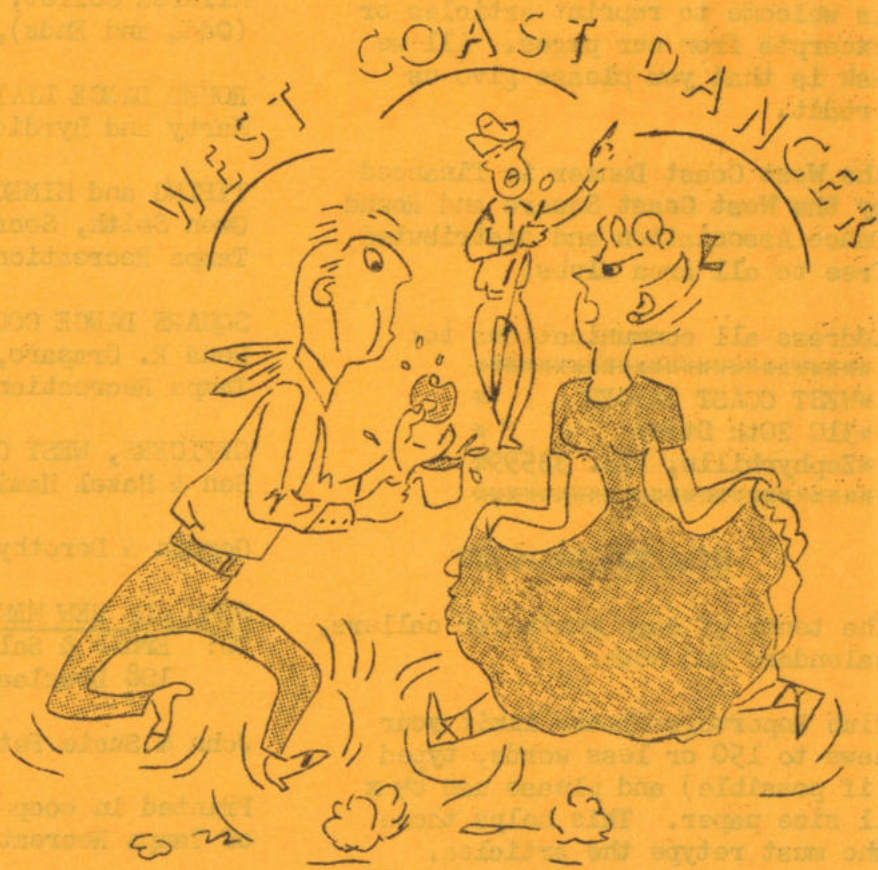

COMFORTABLE DANCING SQUARE DANCE TIPS TO NEW DANCERS
From CASIDA NEWS

- DO Remember to treat all the ladies as you would want other men to treat your wife.
- DO Wear a name badge at all times. It might surprise some of the oldsters to learn that they are not so well known or as important as they think they are!
- DO Be aware at all times that square dancing is a "courtesy" recreation rather than one of competition.
- DO recognize your corner, not only what she is wearing but who she is. Next to your partner, she is the most important person in your square.
- DO accept or admit that you "goofed" this time. Next time it could be someone else so don't feel bad. And when you do goof, goof gracefully, and try to recover the best you can in order to save the set from breaking down.

DON'T spin or twirl the ladies unless you know that they like it. Let them decide if they want that extra twirl. No one ever got a sore arm by not twirling!

DON'T be a knowitall! Let the caller be the instructor unless you are asked personally after the tip.

DON'T be a competitive dancer, i.e. selfish rather than co-operative. It takes eight people to make a good set.

DON'T set up squares of four couples prearranged to go out on the floor. You insult the ability of the other dancers around you and defeat the democratic quality of square dancing itself. If you are sincere about dancing with friends in the same set, stand across from one another and allow two other couples to join you that happen to come along.

SQUARE DANCE TIPS TO NEW DANCERS
From CASDA NEWS

Square dancing is the friendliest form of American couple recreation. Over the years various ground rules have been developed - based on consideration and courtesy and not intended to restrict. Your editor is on several exchange mailing lists with other S/D publications and at one time or another each have had articles on these ground rules. I wish to give them all recognition of this fact, though the following (condensed some) has been taken from a small folder printed by Editor Ken Rollins of Square Tips, Shelby, N.C.

SHOW THY LOYALTY. The S/D Club whose members have nursed you through weeks of classes is interested in having you join the membership upon completion of the series of classes. This is how clubs get members -- by making dancers out of non-dancers. Show your appreciation for their interest in you by joining the host club, wear the club's badge proudly wherever and whenever you go, and then it's your turn to spread good will and fellowship, to pitch in and help with the operation of the club.

BEWARE OF CLIQUES. The "killer" in so many different types of activities is also a menace in square dancing. Webster says: "A Clique is an exclusive or clannish set." So if it is exclusive it must exclude somebody or a lot of somebodies. The value of square dancing is rated by its INclusiveness, not its exclusiveness. You go to a square dance knowing no one and come away with dozens of new friends. But this is not possible if you choose to dance all evening with a square containing the same four couples.

Pre-arranged or 'pat' squares are not condoned in square dancing, nor are they forbidden. An occasional pre-arranged square during the evening is no real threat, and is sometimes necessary for dancers wishing to get into a 'good' square. After all, not many enjoy spending an entire evening in a square with beginners (except in classes) and an occasional goof is quickly forgiven, "remembering that thou were once a beginner". The real true spirit of square dancing is best exemplified in constant mixing within the group. The most successful S/D clubs are those where the members voluntarily mix among themselves. They have discovered the real value of knowing, enjoying, and dancing with as many of their fellow members as they possibly can during the course of an evening.

UNPARDONABLE SIN. In square dancing there are a few specials to look out for. Beware of the unpardonable sin in square dancing. NEVER, NEVER, NEVER LEAVE A SQUARE ONCE YOU HAVE JOINED IT. WAIT UNTIL THE TIP IS OVER!

SQUARE DANCING TIPS (continued)---

Even if the members of your square don't dance very well, even if some of them can't do a good allemande left, stick with it till the tip is over. If you ever walk out of a square you'll never be forgotten by the other members of that square, and will always be unwelcomed in a square containing any of those members. Be a courteous dancer. In cases of emergency, if you must leave, quickly fill your spot with an available substitute.

LOOK OUT FOR THIS SPECIAL. It's considered bad manners to pass a square needing dancers - to go to another square.

SQUARE UP QUICKLY. When you hear "Let's square 'em up" join the square nearest you that needs a couple. If you're looking for a square raise your hand as you move across the floor. The caller will see you. If your square needs a couple, raise a hand with one finger extended, two fingers for two couples, etc.

BE COURTEOUS. Say "Thank You" to all those in the square. It's a natural reaction.

SURE, IT'S FUN, BUT..... It's quite possible for an enthusiastic square dancer to "burn himself out" early in the game by trying to dance too much. Over a period of time it has been discovered that the most enduring square dancers are those who dance only moderately and continuing their non-dancing activities as well.

BE ON TIME. One late couple may mean that three other couples must sit out. The planning of the caller depends heavily upon the first and last tips. If you arrive late or leave early you are not taking full advantage of the evening the caller has prepared.

BE A GOOD LISTENER. Listen intently to the caller. What you did during the day, the problems you face in the coming week, problems with the household, all disappear as you concentrate on the calls and as you enjoy your friends in the square. You can't be talking or thinking of something else. Remember seven other people depend on your split second timing reaction to the call of the moment. Talking makes it difficult for others to hear the instructions and the music. Remember, too, that there is room for only one teacher at a time. You can help others best by being in the right place at the right time.

SQUARE DANCING TIPS (continued)---

LONG SLEEVE SHIRTS. The gentleman dancer is urged to always wear a shirt with long sleeves. This is a courtesy to the ladies as well as to the other dancers. It is much nicer for a lady to reach for a sleeved arm for left allamande than for her to grasp a hairy arm dripping with perspiration.

SMOOTHING OUT. In the beginning, your instructor said: "Take a hand, pull by, take the next, pull by", and so on. As you progress week after week, you find it no longer necessary to pull by. That person whose hand you take doesn't need pulling by. That person whose hand you take will "glide by" without being pulled, dragged or jerked. Give them a chance. See how easy you can be.

TAKE IT EASY. Don't over do it. Square dancing can be strenuous exercise, particularly when you are getting started and are not accustomed to it. Don't try to dance every tip until you've built up to it. If you get tired, sit out the next tip. Don't let anyone talk you into dancing when you feel the need to rest and breathe a bit. If necessary, leave the room until the tip gets underway.

BE THOUGHTFUL - CONSIDERATE. Personal cleanliness is important in this activity where folks exercise vigorously in close contact with each other. A good deodorant and an effective mouthwash are among square dancers best friends. Gum and mints are helpful.

BE A FRIENDLY DANCER. Friendship is square dancing's greatest reward. At your club dance YOU are the host. Take the opportunity to get acquainted with others in the square, and make it a point to dance with as many different dancers as possible during the evening. It has been said that "Square dancing is Friendship set to Music".

IT TAKES TIME! It takes time to become a high level dancer. First you are a beginner, then you gradually move from low level to intermediate level, to advance level and on to high level. It takes time to be exposed to all the calls. You are always learning. Don't get discouraged by unfamiliar calls. Learn them.

(Editor: Hopefully the above article has been read by those of us who have been dancing for awhile. These ground rules do need to be reviewed every once in awhile.)
