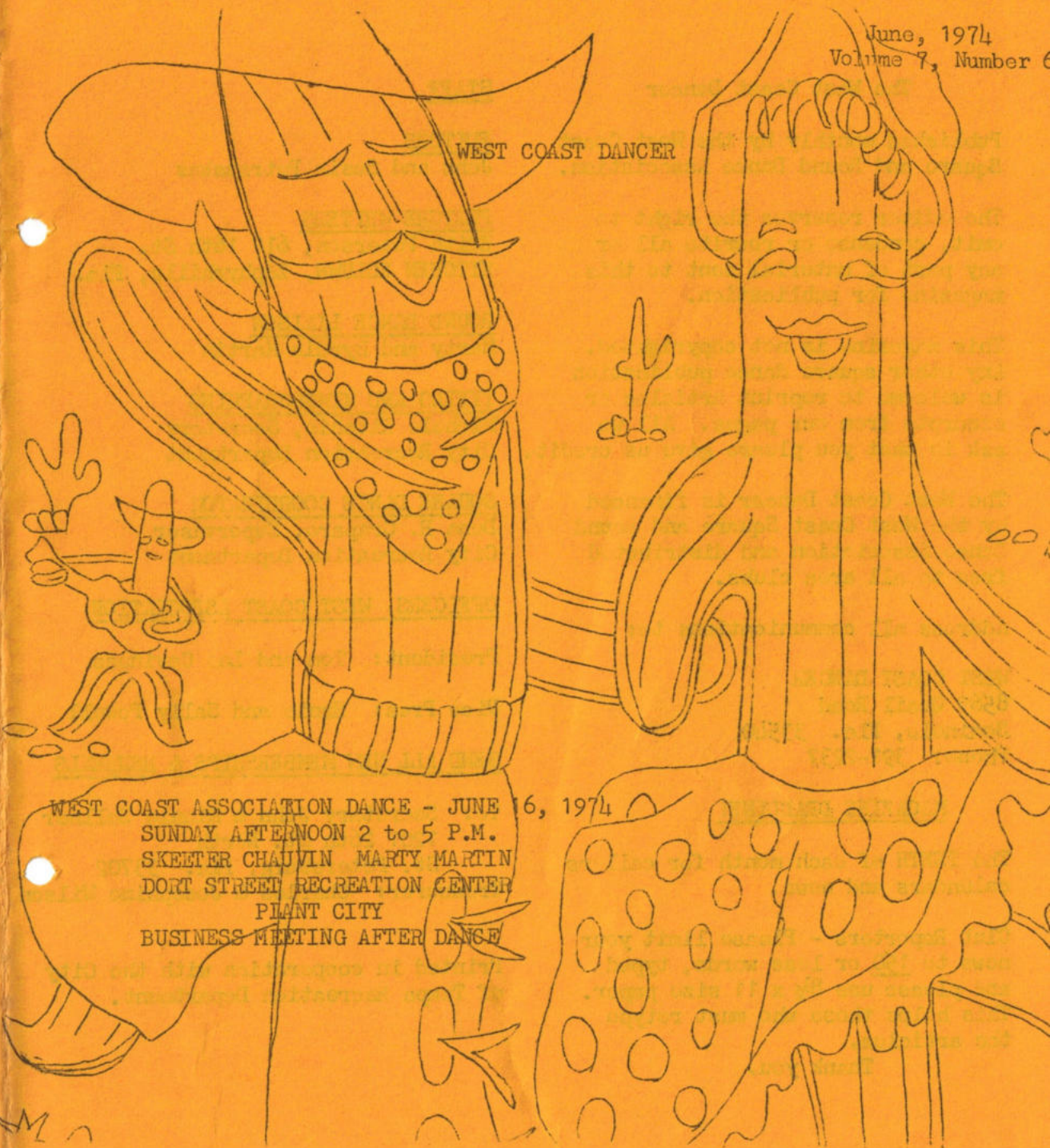

KITCHEN COLUMN

FRUIT SALAD

- 2 pks. Strawberry Jello
- 1 pkg. frozen strawberries
- 2 cups boiling water
- $\frac{1}{2}$  pint sour cream

Dissolve jello in boiling water, add frozen strawberries, pineapple and bananas. Divide mixture, place half in bottom of a square dish. Chill until solid--spread sour cream on top--pour remaining jello mixture over this. Chill well. Cut into squares to serve.

EGG PLANT CASSEROLE

- 1 medium size egg plant-peeled and cut up
- 1 egg--slightly beaten
- 1 can mushroom soup diluted with  $\frac{1}{3}$  cup milk
- 1 small onion--chopped
- 1 cup herb dressing mix
- salt and pepper

Cook egg plant until tender--drain. Add other ingredients and place in buttered casserole. Sprinkle top with  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup dressing crumbs and dot with margarine. Bake for 20 minutes at 350°.
