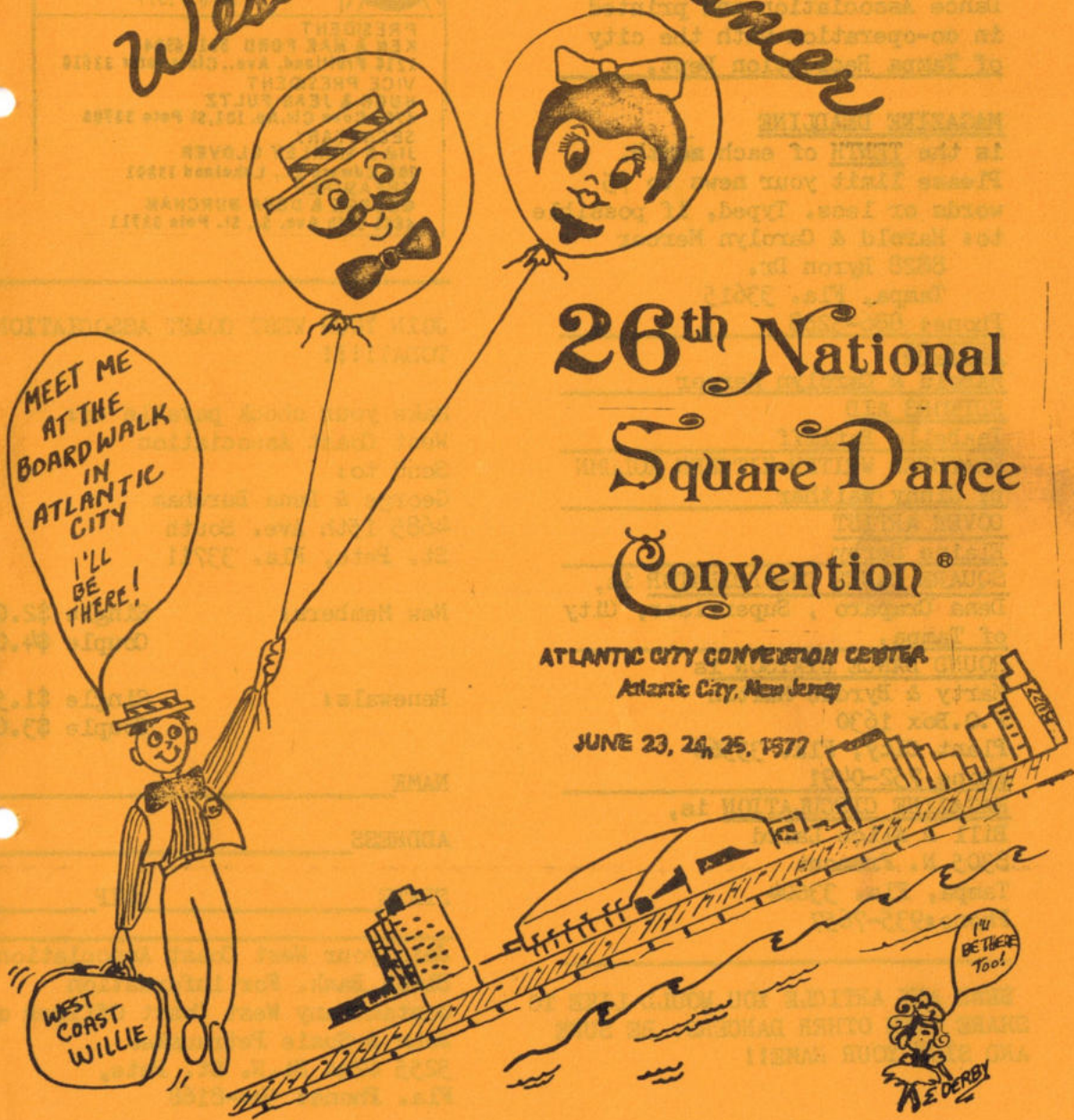

We were honored to have Ron and Mary Lee VanValkenburg, Chairman of the State Federation of Square Dancers, in attendance. The big event in May is the 24th Annual State Convention at Lakeland's new Civic Center, the 27th, 28th and 29th. This is being hosted by the West Coast Association. We had over 2400 people pre-registered and it promises to be a grand affair. Also, since wearing our National Convention ribbons, we have talked to quite a few dancers who are going. We hope the West Coast area is well represented there, along with West Coast Willie--Atlantic City, June 23, 24,25. We hate to keep harping on a subject, but we have had some complaints about our dance calendar not being up-to-date. There were dances listed which had been discontinued. 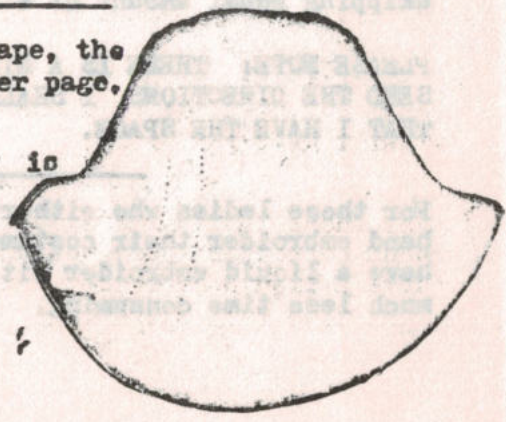
TIPS FOR OUR NEW GRADUATES

There are several good shops in the bay area where you can buy ready-made square dance clothing, including footwear. The Bow & Swing lists them all, including addresses, etc. Generally they are listed by "Western wear Store". And some of the callers' wives, or round dance leaders' wives handle a small line of this apparel. Ask your caller or his wife about this. We do encourage proper square dance attire at ALL square dance functions. By this, I'm sure your caller has explained to you, is meant for the gentlemen to wear long sleeved shirts, a tie of some nature (those bolos are perfect for men who dn't like the tight ties!) and the ladies to wear a full skirt with petti pants (and a crinoline for pretty). Of course, you also know that a dance partner or corner is happier with a clean shaven, freshly bathed (complete with deodorant) partner or corner. Also, there should never be any drinking of alcohol beverages BEFORE or DURING a square dance. what you do or drink AFTER the dance is of course, your business!!!

Please, new dancers, join in on the fun at whatever club you visit. ALL clubs listed in this magazine are supposed to be OPEN dances, which means that you should be welcomed into any square. watch for hands when the squares start forming. Be friendly and tell the other people in the square to be patient with you as you are new. Almost all experienced dancers will remember when they started and they'll be happy to help you. (I don't care how many years a dancer has been at it, they still make mistakes!) Above all, don't be afraid that you aren't "good" enough. Venture forth and SMILE. Remember, the stranger in the next square is only a friend that you have yet to meet!

RIPPLE CAPE CROTCHED DIRECTIONS

(Picture on another page.)

This cape seemd a little snug, so I adjusted it to make 18 (eighteen) points, which gives an ample wrap.

Always work in the back loop of stitches except for the neck band.

Use a size G or H crotchet hook and about 4 skeins of 4 oz., 4 ply worsted or dacron sayelle. The sayelle can be thrown in the washer and dryer, coming out beautiful as long as you don't use hot water. Chain 118, (working from neck), SC in 2nd st from hook, 1 SC in next st, 3 SC in next, 1 SC in each of next 2 st. *skip 2 sts, 1 SC in each of the next 2 sts, 3SC in next st, 1 SC in each of next 2 sts, repeat from * across ch ending to correspond, ch 1, turn.

2nd row: Working in back loop of sts. throughout, dec 1 st (dec by inserting hook in st, pull yarn through, insert hook in next st, pull yarn through, YO and work off all loops at one time). SC in next SC, *3SC in next SC, 1 SC in each of the next 2 SC, skip next 2 SC, 1 SC in each of the next 2 SC, repeat from * across row ending to correspond, dec 1 st at end of row, ch 1, turn. Repeat 2nd row throughout increasing in every 6 rows until there are 8 SC before and after center st of each point. (To increase, work in same manner, but work 2 SC in SC before the center st of point, 3 SC in point and 2 SC in next SC after point.) Work down in patter until cape is length desired.

Neck Band: With right side of 1st row toward you, attach yarn in 1st point, work 2 SC in same space, 2 SC in each remaining point. Ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd and 3rd rows: Working through both loops of sts., work 1 SC in each SC, cut yarn.

Work 5 rows of SC on each edge of front, spacing button holes of right side in the middle row. For button hole, or holes, work in SC up to where you want the button hole, ch 3 or 4 (depending on size of button) skipping equal amount of sts, then resume SC.

PLEASE NOTE: THERE IS A NICE KNITTED CAPE ALSO. IF SOMEONE WILL SEND THE DIRECTIONS, I SHALL BE HAPPY TO PUT THOSE IN THE FIRST TIME THAT I HAVE THE SPACE.

For those ladies who either don't have the time or don't care to hand embroider their costumes (and husbands shirts), all craft shops have a liquid embroider kit which is simple to apply and certainly much less time consuming.

Now what does this mean to us as Callers and Dancers? Here is what I think it means to everyone in the square dance community. We now have 5 Levels of Dancing. They are; 1. Basic Program 2. Extended Program 3. Mainstream Program 4. Plus 1 and 5. Plus 2. All clubs should list their dances according to the Program that they are dancing instead of all dances being listed as Intermediate. We have names, why not use them? Establish dances, at the Basic & Extended Basic Level, if there are none, for the dancers who would like to dance at the levels below Mainstream. Callers calling for these clubs should call only the material that is included in the program listed. Any new or experimental calls should be workshopped before they are called each night. Workshops should be made available for all classifications and be labeled as to the level being taught. Dancers should make sure you have completed a workshop for each classification before going to a dance under that classification. With a concentrated and combined effort by the callers and dancers, we can have the most enjoyable dancing program available.

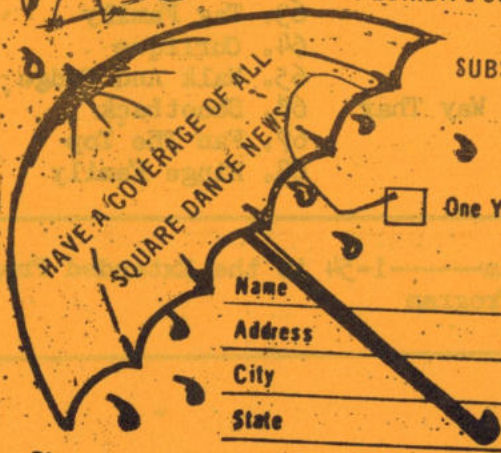
