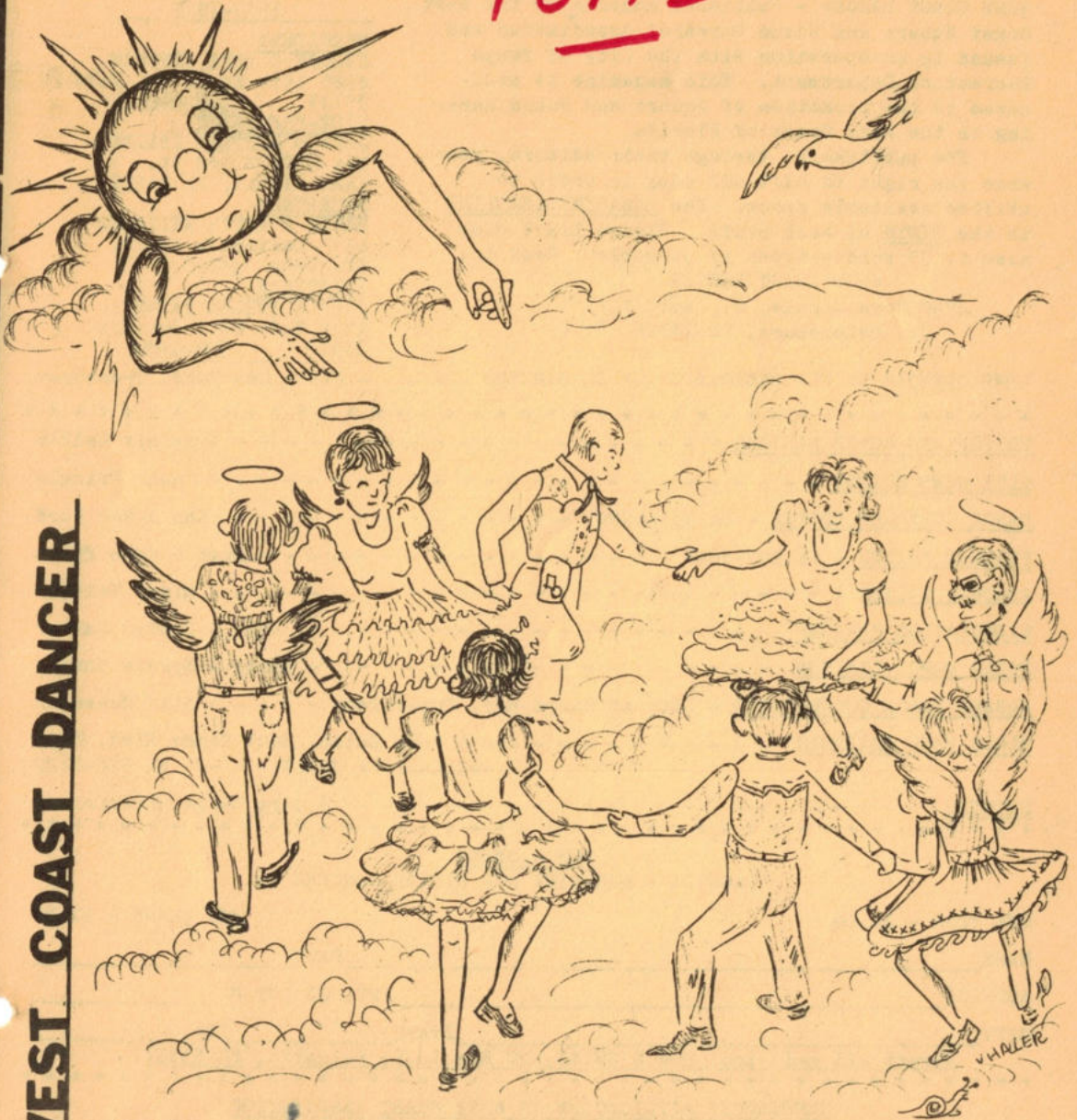

-2- A BEAUTIFUL TRIBUTE TO A BEAUTIFUL COUPLE

On Sunday, April 1, 80 people honored Warren and Peg Thompson at a testimonial dinner in recognition of their 25 years as ANGELS. The following "Reflections and Reminiscences from the Little Old Lady in Sneakers" comes from the pen of Peg. This is only one of several she wrote.

"I held the caller in great awe. In my book he ranked somewhere between President Eisenhower and the school superintendent plus the whole school committee! Honestly, the only reason I dragged my concrete hips up to the church each week was because I know the colonel was really enjoying the dancing. He of course wasn't the white haired, bearded colonel then. His hair was wavy and brown and I thought he was almost as handsome as the much revered caller. It wasn't until a long time after that he confessed that he felt dumb and hated it as much as I but thought I enjoyed it. Just think, if we'd been completely honest with one another our square dancing days would have ended right then and there! (horrible thought).

Well, after eight weeks, (during which time we continued to bumble, stumble and goof) we were graduated. No caps and gowns in those days and no diplomas--, just a smile and a handshake from the eminent caller, and an invitation to attend Mid-Town Twirlers! WOW! How honored, but how horribly scared we felt, as we crept into the Holy Ghost Hall in Fairhaven where the Twirlers were dancing that night! Our first real dance!

When the voice of the handsome caller said, "Four more here and four more there," with shaking arms and legs and parched throats, we gracelessly stumbled into a set with three couples unknown to us. After much pushing, shoving, pulling and yanking, the tip finally ended. The couples saddled with us were surprisingly nice, poor hapless souls! Next tip, and through the evening, we tried not to get into the same group of people more than once. We just spread ourselves throughout the hall among all the dancers much as the rats spread the bubonic plague among the peoples of Europe and no doubt were as welcome among the hot shot dancers those days as were those bearers of the bubonic plague, or black death, to the citizens of the city of London in the Middle Ages.

Well, that first ordeal for us, and even more so to those unlucky enough to have us in their sets finally came to an end. I still remember with great affection the many wonderful couples who were understanding and patient with us during that first dance and for many dances thereafter. However, any couple who were snippy or glared at us during our first year of "trial and error learning" we avoided whenever possible long after we could finally more or less hold our own reasonably well with others in the crowd."

4 SQUARE DANCING ANGELS -- CATHEDRAL CHIMES Christchurch New Zealand

In the past we have discussed this subject of helpers in a learners class, and we will continue to bring up the subject each year; because the part you play is most important. Your presence can make the difference in some learners staying or leaving without giving it a fair chance. Your reason for attending should be to show new dancers what a wonderful activity Square Dancing can be. It means a lot of smiles and good conversation between tips - a genuine expression of friendship. A dancer who can be in the right place at the right time with the hand extended to assist is indeed a good helper.

This places a big responsibility on you as a dancer. How you act, dance and dress will be a deciding factor in a beginner joining a class and staying. We should wear the simplest square dance attire. The new dancer will look and notice what you wear. Let your outfit look easy to make and inexpensive to buy. Let it be colorful, clean and becoming. It makes no difference if you wear the same outfit each time you attend, especially in those first few weeks. In fact it is easier for a new dancer to recognize you.

New dancers rightfully expect the "angels" to have a good understanding of the dance figures being taught. Nothing is more distressing to beginners than to find the person who is in their square, supposedly to help them, having trouble simply because they thought they knew what the caller was going to teach. They didn't really need to listen to find he had called it another way.

We all have styling habits or special frills which we add to our dancing from time to time and some of these become almost automatic. At first the caller is going to instruct the dancers in the standard patterns and positions. The new dancers do not want to become confused or upset. The new dancer will be looking to you for guidance. If you, as experienced dancers, are styling your way or adding extra frills then the newcomer is going to become confused and discouraged. O.K. angels to be, take a good look at yourselves. Do only what your caller is teaching. It really comes down to one thing. If we will always remember when we were learners and do the things which would have helped us the most then we are on the way to being the club's "most helpful angels."

We hope all members will seriously consider this message. Our new dancers will always be the life blood of the activity and our "angels" set the stage for them, show them how it is done, giving them something to aim for, not only in dancing but in a healthy and attractive appearance.

One most important thing to remember: Don't try and impress your learner friends how good a dancer you are and how well YOU have learned. That isn't your task if you are there to help. You are a HELPER just as others helped you when you were in the same situation. There is one person who is teaching and has a microphone in his hand. Let HIM do the explaining.

NATIONAL FOLK DANCE

On January 15th 1979 H.J. Resolution 09 was introduced in the House of Representatives of the U.S. Congress designating the "square dance" as the national folk dance of the United States of America.

In order to achieve favorable action on this resolution, 218 co-sponsors are required. This can only happen if square dancers everywhere write their representatives urging their support as a co-sponsor.
