OUR BLOOD BANK IS IN JEOPARDY!!!!

House Bill 1066, presently being considered by the Florida Legislature, proposes to abolish Blood Banks as they presently exist in Florida. By eliminating the Non-Replacement Fee all individual and group accounts will cease to exist and the blood supply in our community will be in jeopardy.

Powerful lobbies including the Red Cross and AFL-CIO are supporting this legislation for reasons best known to themselves. As benefactors of an active blood bank account we should do everything we can to defeat this bill.
