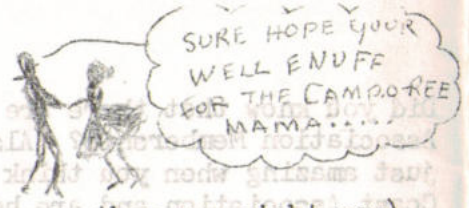

TABLE TALK

QUICK DATE PECAN SURPRISE COOKIES

- 1 box (regular) spice cake mix
- 3 eggs slightly beaten
- sticks oleo or butter (melted)
- 1/2 C L. brown sugar
- 1/4 C milk
- 1/4 t mace
- 1/2 t baking powder

Combine cake mix and eggs in bowl, add melted oleo, add sugar, mace, baking powder and milk. Beat with electric mixer medium speed for 3 minutes. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Drop 1-large t batter on ungreased cookie sheet. Put 1/2 pitted date and 1/2 pecan on top and press into batter cover with 1/2 t batter. Continue this process until all batter is used. Bake about fifteen minutes or until brown. Makes approximately 4 dozen cookies.

ORANGE SLICE CAKE

- 1 C oleo
- 2 C sugar

Cream together. Add 4-eggs one at a time beating well after each addition. Mix 1-t soda with 1/2-C buttermilk, add to above mixture alternately with 3-C flour. 1-pound orange candy slices cut fine with scissors. 1-small box dates cut fine. Coat with 1/2-C flour, add 2-C chopped pecans, one can coconut flakes, orange slices and dates to above mixture. Bake in tube pan for 2 1/2 hours at 250 degrees.

TOPPING: 1-C fresh orange juice 2-C confectioners sugar

Blend and pour over cake while still hot. Leave in pan over night.
